SANTA MARIA ELKS GOLF CLUB

The Elks Golf Club traveled to beautiful Solvang on August 15th to play the River Course at The Alisal. They were treated to a beautiful golf course and some of the scores reflected the immaculate conditions. Marc Sanchez shot low gross with a 78 and took home low gross honors and \$30. Todd Yoder and Fernie Tarango both shot 79 with Todd shooting a 35 on the back nine while Fernie had a 36, thus Todd won 2nd low gross and pocketed \$25. In the competition Bob Taylor had a net 68 worth \$30 while Fernie Tarango in a card off had a net 69 and claiming \$25 for 2nd low net. The team competition was closely contested with the team of Randy Spears, Billy Brooks, Greg Plahn, and Herman Sanchez shooting a 201 and claiming 1st and winning \$200. The second place team of Mike Jefferis, Randy Gil, Glen Rodriguez, and Gary Concellos had a good score of 204 and winning \$180. 

Much closer to us is the San Luis Obispo Lodge. If you have young kids or grandchildren or are just a kid at heart, then the SLO Elks is the place for you. They have two outdoor pools, one regular and one kiddie pool, and a large hot tub that are all available to use for a small fee. In addition, they have a pass-thru bar where you can order drinks and food while standing in your bathing suit. In addition to their pools, they have RV spots and a lot of activities to enjoy, plus a restaurant that serves lunch throughout the week. Stay here and Uber into SLO for a mini vacation.

Another local favorite of mine is the Oceano Lodge due to its proximity to the beach and its fun vibe. This lodge also has RV camping for way cheaper than the Pismo Beach area RV sites. ELKS BBQ (A CONTINUING SERIES):

Santa Maria Elks Salsa Recipe

This will make approximately one gallon of salsa. One-gallon feeds about fifty people unless you are using it as a dip and then it feeds fewer people. Santa Maria Elks salsa is a chunky style so do not put it in a blender.

1. One #10 can diced tomatoes. Also use the juice. A #10 can is 102 ounces so if the store does not have #10 cans buy enough smaller cans to get close.

2. About twenty-five ounces of diced green chilies.

3. ½ pounds of white onions chopped fine. Yellow or Spanish onions will make the salsa bitter.

- 4. 1 ½ to 2 tablespoons of crushed garlic.
- ½ cup vegetable oil.
- 6. Salt and pepper to taste.

Santa Maria Elks Seasonings

To make seasoning for home use, follow these guidelines. This is a good starting

- Point, you can adjust it for your taste:
- -Use regular table salt.

-The pepper should be the fine ground style. If you use a shaker the course grind will not come out. If you use a shaker with large enough holes for the course pepper, too much salt and garlic will come out.

-Use granulated garlic. Do not use garlic powder. It clumps from the moisture from the meat. Do not use garlic salt either. You are just adding more salt and truly little garlic. For 2 cups of mix use the following and mix well.

1 cup salt

³⁄₄ cups granulated garlic

1/4 cup fine ground pepper

Founded in 2016, thanks to the support and partnership of the Santa Maria Elks Rodeo, the Golden Circle of Champions was conceived to raise awareness and contribute funds to help local children battling pediatric cancer. Each year, 25 children and their families are honored during the opening night of the Elks Rodeo. The children attend a dinner at

the rodeo, meet many of the cowboys and cowgirls, and then get to watch the rodeo from a special reserved section located in the grandstands. Through donations and fundraising efforts, support is presented directly to the families to fulfill their most urgent needs: paying bills, buying medicine, and caring for their family.

The children selected each year have ranged in age from 3 months to 17 years and have been diagnosed with a life-threatening cancer or associated illness. The Cowboy Up Carnival and Auction is the chief fundraising event of the year. Additional events include raffles, Stuff the Stocking during Christmas in the Country and, during the Elks Rodeo, they host an annual passing of the boot during each performance as well as along the Rodeo Parade route. Recently a Rummage Sale and a Craft Fair were hosted at Santa Maria Elks Lodge #1538 with the proceeds benefitting the Golden Circle of Champions.

"Our goal is to bring the much-needed education and awareness, locally and nationally, to pediatric cancer and offer a ray of hope to the families that are navigating through this journey. They desperately need our help as a community, and we want to let them know we are here for them," said Founder, Tina Tonascia. "It is our job to tell their story about pediatric cancer, in the hopes that one day we will be able to make a difference."

Golden Circle of Champions is now fortunate enough to expand this vital mission on a national scale of providing support to these children and their families. Each December the Golden Circle of Champions, in conjunction with Las Vegas Events, the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association, Elks Rodeo, Red Bluff Round-Up, and Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation, honor 20 children and their families from across the country, all who are fighting lifethreatening cancers or illnesses, during the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas. The Champions are partnered with an NFR contestant who will teach them Rodeo skills. Each Rodeo contestant is given a gold Wild Rag to wear during their competition for their Champion. The Champions are outfitted with Wrangler jeans & shirt, Justin boots, a Resistol hat signed by all the contestants, a Montana Silversmith buckle, a Boot Barn belt, and many other goodies to ensure they feel like Champions! The Champions are also given signs to cheer on their NFR contestant, so the NFR contestant knows exactly where their Champion is sitting. The NFR contestants waving to their Champions is a very special moment.

The GCOC, through your financial support, looks forward to continuing its growth and support of these children and their families.

The National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979 by 39th President Jimmy Carter to remember the grief and hardships of families awaiting news of the over 1,700 Vietnam War service members still missing in action. "Their Sacrifice, Our Pledge" was this year's theme which honored those brave men and women who were held captive and returned, as well as those who remain missing. Each year, a national ceremony is held on the third Friday every September.

September also pays Tribute to Gold Star Mother's and Families. In 1936, Congress set aside the last Sunday in the month to honor Gold Star Mothers, and it has been observed annually since. This year, it was commemorated on September 25. The American Gold Star Mothers Inc. first got its start in 1917, when Grace Siebold's son was killed during World War I. Wanting to create a support system for grieving mothers in similar circumstances, Grace gathered what would become the American Gold Star Mothers to grieve together and tend to veterans in local hospitals. In 2011, President Obama amended the declaration declaring the day to include families as well as mothers.
