It has been an honor to be the Exalted Ruler of Santa Maria Elks Lodge #1538, the best Lodge in Elksdom. When you become

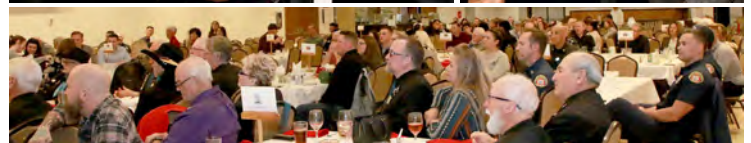

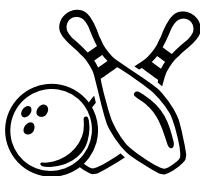

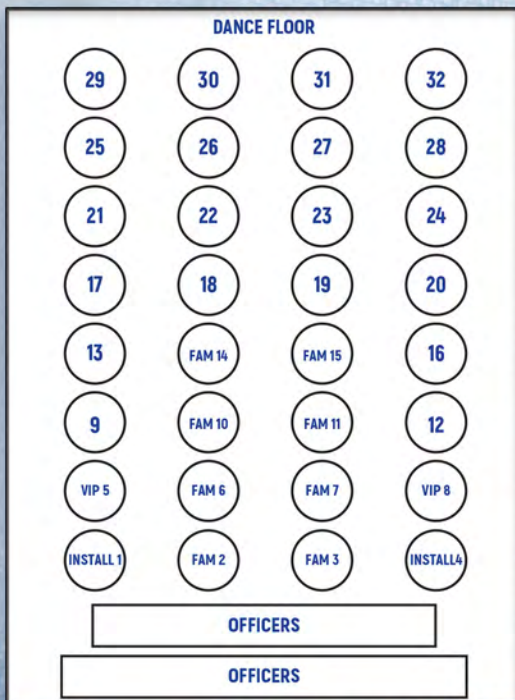
