Although we did not advance to the finals, we took third place in our division. We did very well, and you should all be very proud of us.



WOOD CREW

If you have enjoyed a nice juicy steak or chicken at our Lodge, besides our volunteer BBQ team, you have our group of volunteers on the Wood Crew to thank. Most Santa Marians know that the flavor of our BBQ comes from our native red oak. Every Wednesday, rain or shine, the wood crew goes out to gather 2.5 to 3 cords of red oak wood for our Lodge.

The crew was originally formed at our 2nd home on Vine Street and today they are led by Past Exalted Rulers Norm McDonald and Don Moshier. I am not calling them old, however they have over 100 years of Elks experience between the two of them. They have many stories to share: one that stood out was back in the 1970's when a group of 50 people from the Lodge went out to Glines Ranch for the weekend and cut up over 30 cords of wood. Before we had the wood room, they would go to the ranch and bring it back to use for BBQs as needed.

Currently our wood crew has about a dozen volunteers that help out on a regular basis. They meet up at the Lodge at 6:30 am and start loading our 3 trucks used for the Wood Crew with the wood splitter, chain saws, safety equipment, gas, coffee and donuts. Our crew is fortunate to get our wood from local ranches where they only trim off branches, or cut up trees that have fallen due to weather, and only take out trees when requested by the property owner. After the wood is cut and split, it is brought back to the Lodge and stacked in the wood room (which is right behind the BBQ room) where we have room to store about 88 cords of wood. The stacked wood usually will be dried and cured for at least 6 to 7 months. We use an estimated 50-60 cords of wood for our many catering events: Law Enforcement and Firefighters dinner, charity events and of course for our weekly Cook Your Own on Friday nights. With the current cost of red oak, (\$350 per cord) the wood crew saves our Members an estimated \$17,000 to \$21,000 per year.

I have helped out myself about a half a dozen times now and I have to say, these men put in some hard work. When you enjoy your next BBQ at the Lodge remember to thank all the volunteers that put in time to prepare your meal. The Wood crew is one of many ways you can volunteer. If you want to volunteer at our Lodge, please contact the office and we will find a place for you.
