NOTICE OF LODGE MEMBER BALLOT ACTION

*Flooring Replacement Project:
Dining Room and Members Bar*

Lodge Meeting JANUARY 4, 2024:

The flooring in the Dining Room and Members bar is almost 30 years old, if not older, and needs to be replaced. We have obtained a bid from Flooring 101 to remove both the old flooring in both areas and replace with new material. The current vinyl tiled areas will be replaced with new, Raw Sienna color, wood-look vinyl plank, with a 20 mil wear layer. The carpet area of the Members bar will be replaced with 2-foot square carpet tiles.

Our account reserves will pay for the project so the Lodge will not incur any debt. The project estimate bid is \$61,986.23. The stated Motion asks our Members to approve a total of 10% more in order to cover any unforeseen costs and to purchase additional planks and carpet for future replacement should there be a problem, for a total of \$68,184.85. Work is to be completed in late January 2024.

The motion to be voted on will be as follows:

"A motion to contract Flooring 101 to remove and install new flooring and carpet in the Dining Room and Member's bar not to exceed \$68,184.85. The project will be paid for out of current Lodge Maintenance funds and the Lodge will not be incumbered at all."

The above motion will need to be passed by a 2/3rds majority of the Members present at this meeting. Once passed the project will require Grand Lodge Approval from the Grand Trustees.

DRESS CODE IN EFFECT FOR ALL ELKS FUNCTIONS

Elks Lodge 1538 is a flagship among Elk Lodges and not just another "Bar or Club." As such we have a Dress Code. Most times it is casual and allows more casual wear: Long shorts, like Bermuda and cargo style shorts are acceptable after 6:00 pm except Thursday Lodge Night.

- Please no mid-thigh, cutoffs, short-shorts, or torn/frayed wear.
