According to the MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education:

Schools must provide special education services remotely to students with disabilities.

How will services be offered?

Remote instruction

- -Work collaboratively with families
- -Instruction online, WGBH, sending materials home
- -Regular calls to check in

IEP Services

- -Special ed services offered remotely
- -Not all services can be offered remotely immediately
- -Teachers and therapists can help parents

Team meetings

• IEP meetings can happen now (by video or phone)

 Schools should collaborate with parents to schedule team meetings

Compensatory Services

• Will be evaluated case by case

Best to get as many services as possible now.

What you can do now

Contact your school district

- Ask how they will start to give your child necessary services while schools are closed.
