

Zinc by Sue Klauber – author events

It's World War 2. Brothers George and John and their sister Eva are each fighting in their own way. Secret agent George is parachuted into Slovakia in an operation codenamed *Zinc*, while John breaks codes at Bletchley Park and Eva is stranded in enemy-occupied Hungary. Based on the extraordinary real-life stories of Sue Klauber's father, uncle and aunt, Sue wrote *Zinc* for her son to celebrate the heroic engagement of their North London Jewish family in the fight against tyranny.

Sue Klauber is an experienced fundraiser and former media educator. She has produced films made by refugee children from Columbia, Kurdistan, Kosovo, Afghanistan, Eritrea, Iran, Armenia and Romania, has worked as a fundraiser in arts and social care charities, and is now the Trusts and Foundations Lead for a



charity where she monitors grants across areas of residential care, community centres, physical disability and Holocaust survivors' services. **Zinc** is her first children's book.

Sue is available for author events in a variety of contexts, such as schools, libraries and community groups. She will give a visual presentation and talk (approx. 1 hour) including:

- Stunning photos of Sue's family
- Explanation of the work of code-breakers at Bletchley Park and of agents with the Special Operations Executive
- Dramatic WW2 posters promoting secrecy
- A reading and book signing.
