
- 1. The **Golden Gate Ferry** departs out of the Ferry Building to Sausalito. Please note there is a separate Ferry (Blue and Gold) out of Pier 39 don't go there! The ferry departs at 10:15 arriving in Sausalito 10:45. Be sure to allow adequate time to arrive. The Ferry Building has a number of shops to visit.
- 2. Getting to the Ferry Building
 - a. Walking .9 mile flat walk along Market Street
 - b. Muni see image below. In addition to the **14 Ferry Plaza** bus on Mission and 3rd there are multiple alternate options on 3rd and Market (bus 6/9/9R, streetcar F, underground JKLMN). Fare is \$3 or use the Muni Mobile app. Please note that shockingly the buses at times run late so be sure to make allowances.
 - c. Ride service: Taxi, Waymo, Uber



The Ferry will arrive in Sausalito at 10:45am. It will be roughly a 3 minute walk to Spinnaker Restaurant (100 Spinnaker Drive) and 5 minutes to Scoma Restaurant (588 Bridgeway). Please arrive at your designated restaurant by 11:30. Lunch will be served promptly at 11:30 in order to have the option of returning on the 1:35 return ferry. The later ferry departs two hours later.

Sausalito

A ferry trip to Sausalito offers a fantastic blend of scenic views, charming shops, art galleries, and waterfront dining. Here are some great ways to spend a few hours in Sausalito:

- 6. **Lunch with a View** Sausalito has plenty of waterfront dining options. **Scoma's Sausalito** and the **Spinnaker** offers fresh seafood with incredible views, while **Bar Bocce** has a more casual, outdoor vibe with wood-fired pizzas right on the bay.
- 7. **Hiking or Biking** If you're feeling active, consider renting a bike to explore the scenic Marin Headlands, or go for a short hike at **Fort Baker** for views of the **Golden Gate Bridge**. Many bike rental shops offer one-way rentals if you want to cycle back to San Francisco.
- 8. **Shopping for Unique Finds** Sausalito's boutiques are a great place to shop for unique jewelry, home decor, and gifts. Look for local favorites like **Driver's Market** for gourmet finds or **Heath Ceramics** for beautiful handmade pottery.
- 9. **Kayaking on Richardson Bay** If you're interested in some water activities, kayaking in Richardson Bay offers a chance to see Sausalito and the surrounding nature from a different perspective. Kayak rentals and guided tours are available if you want to paddle around the houseboats and marina.
- 10. **People-Watch and Relax** For a more relaxed visit, grab a coffee or gelato at **Lappert's Ice Cream** or a drink at **Barrel House Tavern** and enjoy some people-watching on the waterfront.
