

Introductory Rites

A hymn may be sung. Then, making the Sign of the Cross, the family begins:

Gospel

MT 16:13-20

Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven.
