**Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
 Isaiah 45:1, 4-6; 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b; Matthew  
 22:15-21



As we continue to follow and witness Jesus' activities as events in Jerusalem march closer to that fateful end, we have today not a parable (we had three in a row in as many weeks). Instead, we hear about a verbal sparring match between Jesus and the Herodians and Pharisees, adversaries themselves. But a common threat (Jesus) has united these two competitors. The Herodians and the Pharisees (or at least their disciples) scheme together to ensnare (which is another meaning of the Greek term translated as "entrap") Jesus with a clever riddle.

The puzzle posed is sublime. When asked whether to pay the tax, Jesus might say to pay it, in which case he can be said to endorse the political system. Or Jesus might say not to pay the tax, in which case he can be said to endorse the overthrow of the political system. Either answer seemingly dooms him. But their insincerity and their plotting are plain to see. Instead of falling into the "either/or" trap, Jesus does something more cunning. After addressing them directly as "hypocrites," he asks for a coin, something which he does not have. They produce the coin, thereby demonstrating that they essentially endorse the system. He asks them whose image and whose inscription is on this coin they bear. With their reply, their fate is sealed. "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Jesus is not issuing a dissertation on the intersection of politics, religion, and the economy. He is not endorsing or condemning an economic system. But by his reply he has indicted the Pharisees and the Herodians for their inordinate concern about money versus what ought to be a concern for the things of God.

His indictment should strike us too. Where are our concerns? Are we focused on money or God? Are we sincere of heart, or are we scheming? It's likely too flippant to our part to say with a sincere heart that we are focused only on God. Jesus' words to his verbal opponents are addressed to us too: "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

## From our Pastor's Pen...



On October 10, 2020, a Beatification took place in Assisi, Italy for Carlo Acutis, who died from leukemia at the age of 15. Here is an article to help you get to know this young person who loved God while still being an ordinary teen:

### 16 Things Every Catholic Should Know About Carlo Acutis

*"I am happy to die because I have lived my life without wasting a minute on those things that do not please God."*

—Carlo Acutis.

Here are some interesting facts and details to know about this young soon-to-be-saint. An inspiration to so many, including young children and teens, Carlo died a young boy at the age of 15 after a brief battle with leukemia. May we all strive for sainthood and learn from Carlo's example!

1. In the short 15 years of his life, Carlo Acutis touched thousands of people with his testimony of faith and deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist.
2. Born in London but raised in Milan, Carlo was confirmed at age 7. He never missed daily Mass as his mother, Antonia Acutis recalls: "As a little boy, especially after his First Communion, he never missed his daily appointment with the Holy Mass and the Rosary, followed by a moment of Eucharistic adoration," recalls his mother, Antonia Acutis.
3. Carlo had a great devotion and love for the Blessed Mother. He once said: "The Virgin Mary is the only woman in my life."
4. An avid enthusiast of technology, Carlo was a gamer and also a computer programmer.
5. Carlo had a great concern for his friends often inviting those being treated poorly or going through difficult situations to his home for support. Some were dealing with divorce at home or being bullied due to disabilities.
6. With his love for the Eucharist, Carlo had asked his parents to take him on pilgrimages to the sites of all the known Eucharistic miracles in the world but his illness prevented this from happening.
7. Carlo contracted leukemia as a teenager. He offered his pain for Pope Benedict XVI and the Catholic Church, saying: "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church."



8. Carlo used his tech-savvy skillset to build an entire website catalogue of Eucharistic miracles around the world. He started the years-long project when he was 11 years old.
9. Carlo wanted to utilize technology and his website to evangelize. He was inspired by Blessed Giacomo Alberione's initiatives to use the media to proclaim the Gospel.
10. During his battle with leukemia, his doctor asked him if he was suffering much pain and he responded that "there are people who suffer much more than me."
11. After Carlo's death, a traveling exhibition of the teen's Eucharistic miracles began, a brainchild of Acutis. Msgr. Raffaello Martinelli and Cardinal Angelo Comastri, who at the time was head of the Catechetical Office of the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith, helped organize the photo exhibition in his honor. It has now traveled to dozens of countries across five continents.
12. Francesca Consolini, a postulator in the Archdiocese of Milan, thought there was reason to open Carlo's cause of beatification when the required wait of five years after his death has been met. Speaking of the young teen, Consolini said: "His faith, which was unique in such a young person, was pure and certain. It made him always be sincere with himself and with others. He showed extraordinary care for others; he was sensitive to the problems and situations of his friends and those who lived close to him and were with him day to day."
13. Carlo's cause for canonization began in 2013 and he was designated 'Venerable' in 2018. He will be called 'Blessed' after Oct. 10. 14.

14. The beatification rite of Carlo Acutis took place on Saturday, Oct. 10, 2020, at 4:00 p.m. in the Upper Basilica of San Francesco in Assisi. The chosen date will be close to an important anniversary in Carlo's life; his birth to Heaven on Oct. 12, 2006.
15. A book was created containing the Eucharistic miracles he had fleshed out on his website, containing nearly 100 accounts of miracles from 17 different countries, all verified and approved by the Church.
16. Millions around the world have been following his path to sainthood. Just by typing his name into a search engine, more than 2,500 websites and blogs emerge detailing his life and story.

As we witness his beatification this weekend and see a young boy wearing jeans, a sweatshirt and sneakers, may we all remember we are called to be saints and strive to live like Carlo with whatever time we are given. As a young Acutis once said: "The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of Heaven."

Monday, October 19, 2020

### Memorial of Saint John de Brébeuf & Isaac Jogues, Priests & Companions, Martyrs

Jean de Brébeuf was a French Jesuit missionary who worked with the Huron in what is today Canada and was mar-

tyred in an Iroquois raid. Brébeuf was a skilled linguist and not only learned the Huron language but also the spiritual beliefs already held by the Huron. His fellow Jesuits wrote about how easily Brébeuf adapted himself to the Huron way of life. While he was not always respectful of Huron culture, we can emulate his effort to create bridges of mutual understanding, as our own country is today torn by differences.

Tuesday, October 20, 2020

### Memorial of Saint Paul of the Cross, Priest

Paul of the Cross, Italian mystic and founder of the Passionist religious order in 1725, was taught by his mother to look to the crucified Jesus as a way to make sense out of suffering. Most of his siblings died; his father's business barely scraped by. But no matter what hardships the family endured, his mother said, they were nothing compared to God's deep love. What a seed she planted in her son! "The holy sufferings of Jesus is a sea of sorrows, but it is also a sea of love," wrote Paul. "Ask the Lord to teach you to fish in this sea."

*Ephesians 3:2-12; Luke 12:39-48*

"Be Prepared" is a motto for the Boy and Girl Scouts that is explained in this way: "You are always in a state of readiness in mind and body to do your duty." That motto could very well be a motto for Christian life. Jesus expects his followers to be alert to the assistance of the Spirit and to act in ways that bear witness to Christian duty. It is a Christian's duty to use the gifts of time and talent to build up Jesus' kingdom of love. When you review the past week, can you find evidence that you are doing your Christian duty by responding to Jesus' call to love unconditionally?

### Thursday, October 22, 2020 Memorial of Saint John Paul II, Pope

Saint John Paul II's quarter-century as pope greatly influenced both church and state. Many times his personal witness is what moved people's hearts. acts of love, forgiveness, and reverence. What gesture of yours today can bear witness to God?

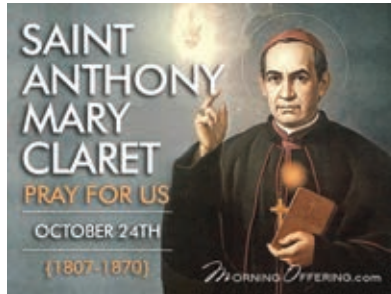


**Friday, October 23, 2020**

The cliff swallows of San Juan Capistrano, California depart the mission town on or around this date, the Memorial of

Saint John, the town's namesake. They return every spring after their 6,000-mile winter migration to Argentina. Pray that, like the swallows of Capistrano, everyone will be able to safely come back to the place they call home, after war, famine, natural disaster, or separation due to pandemic.

**Memorial of Saint Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop**  
*Ephesians 4:7-16; Luke 13:1-9*



As a young man, Anthony Claret was torn between his talent in the textile business and the emerging call he felt to religious life. Seeing his talent, his father offered to share leadership of the family business with him. Anthony was famously short of stature, and he pointed out that workers likely would resist taking orders from him. His father suggested they could hide Anthony behind a desk to come up with ideas and put a larger man in charge of the workers. That sealed the deal for Anthony—he wasn't interested in hiding. Thereafter he was a tireless and talented preacher, confessor, author, and publisher in the service of God. Don't hide your own gifts—they are God-given and the world needs them!

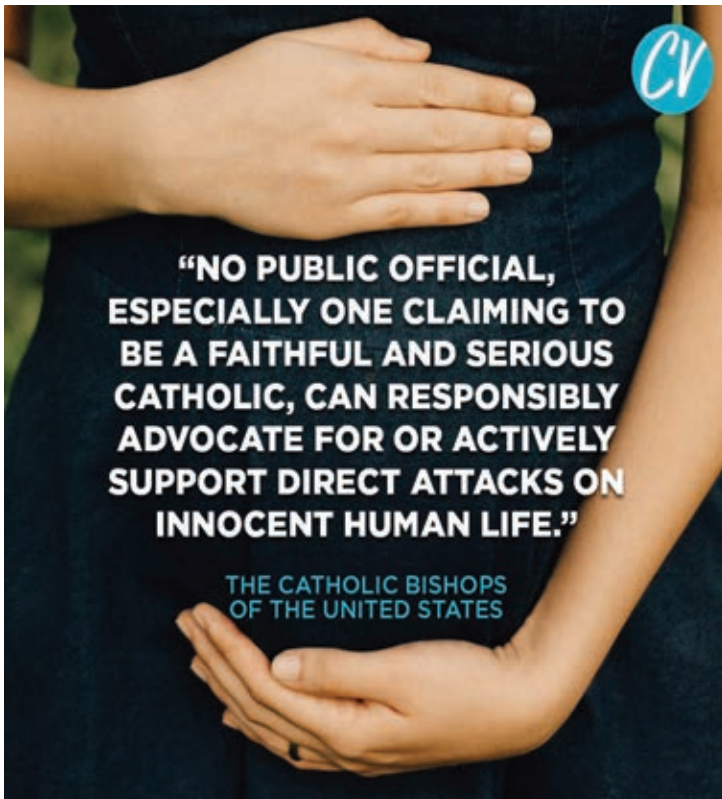
