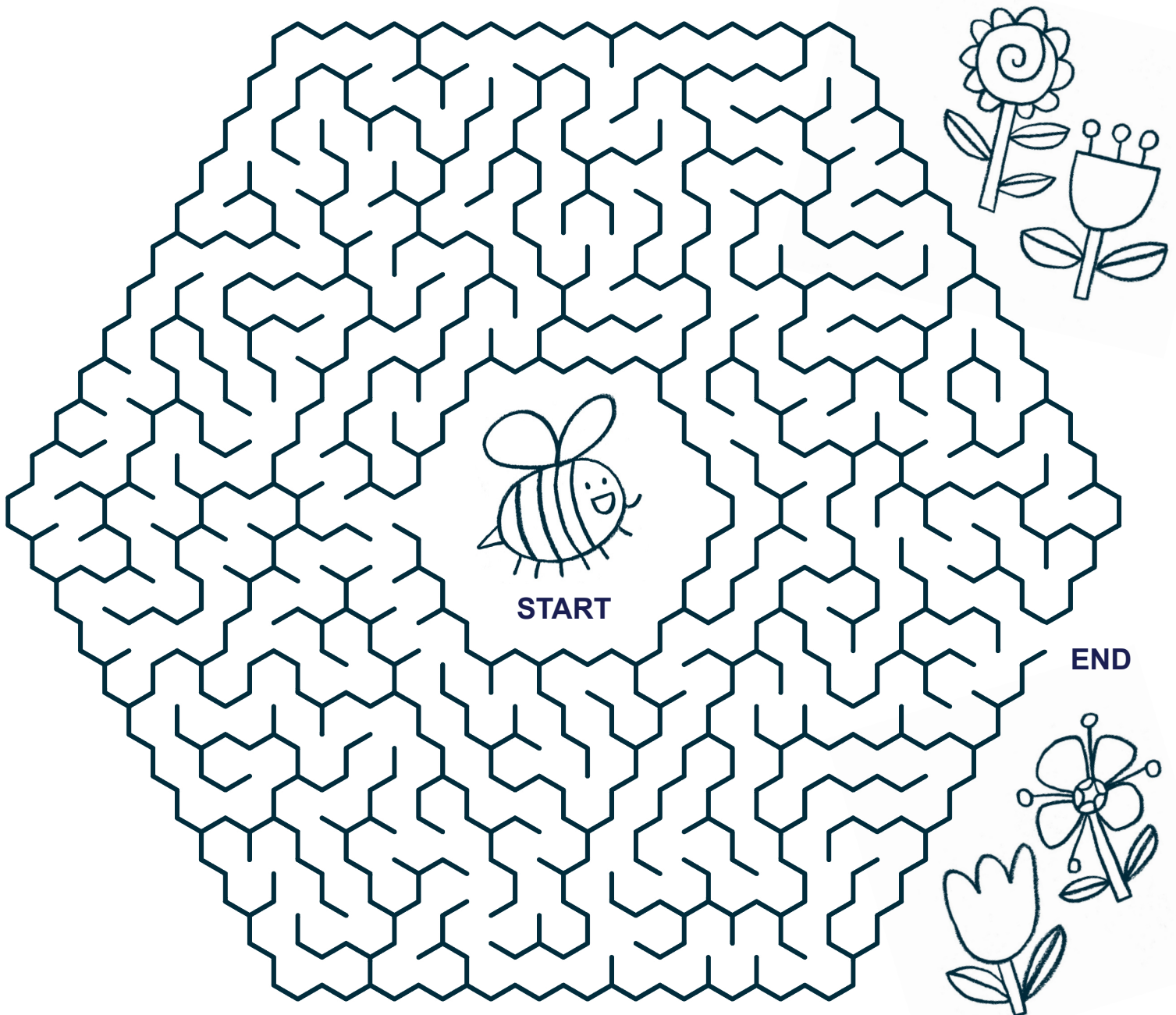
	Make a nest of blankets, get cozy in it, and read a book about a bird.	Read a book about your favorite spring holiday.	Read a book outside on a sunny day.

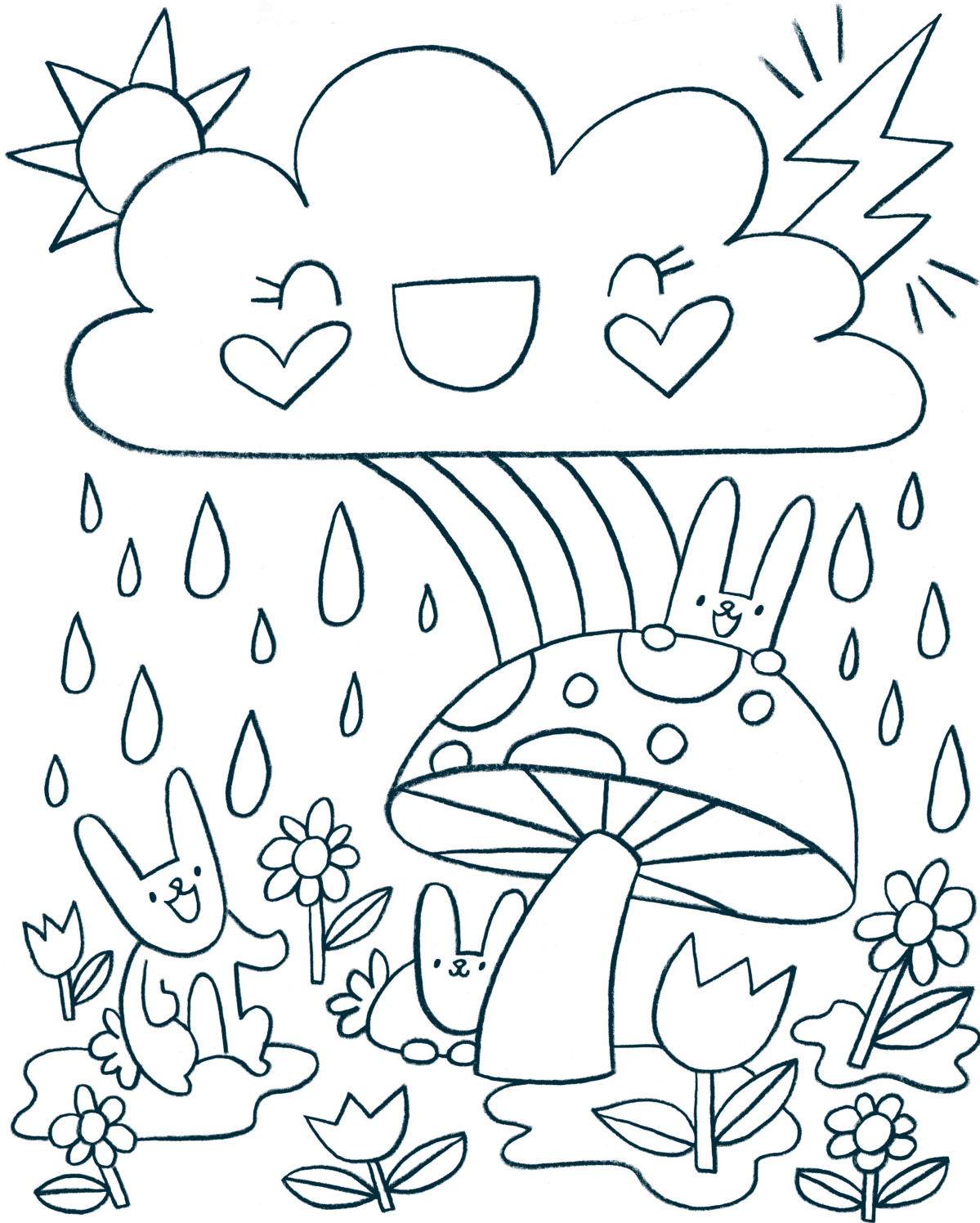

Color this scene! Do you like pastel or primary colors better? Can you think of a story about the 3 rabbits? Maybe your stuffed animals would like to hear it...

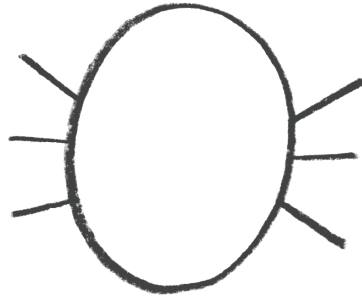


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Story Starter
