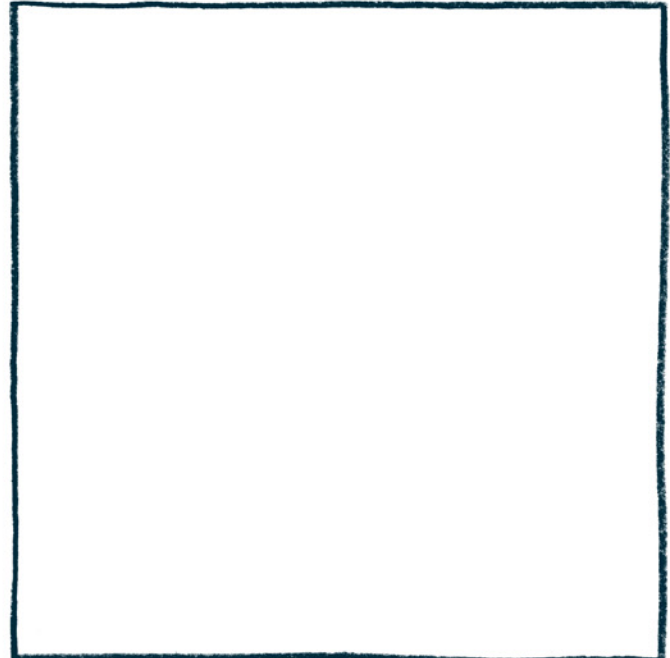
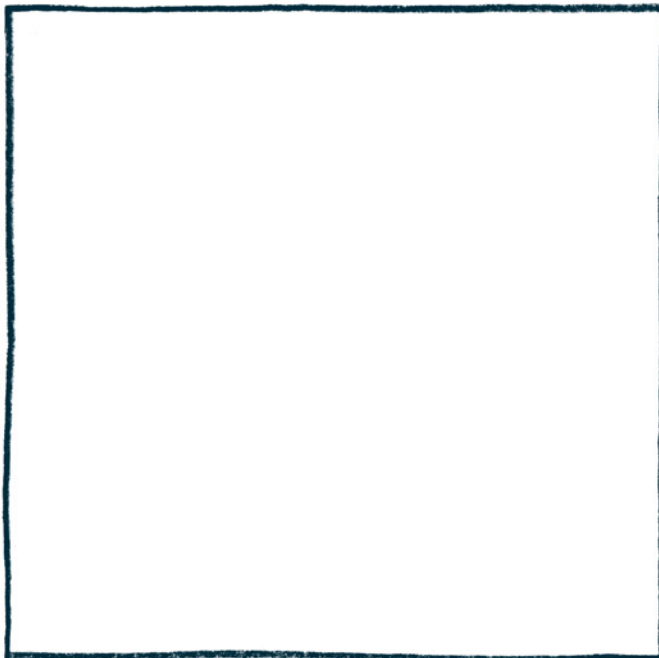
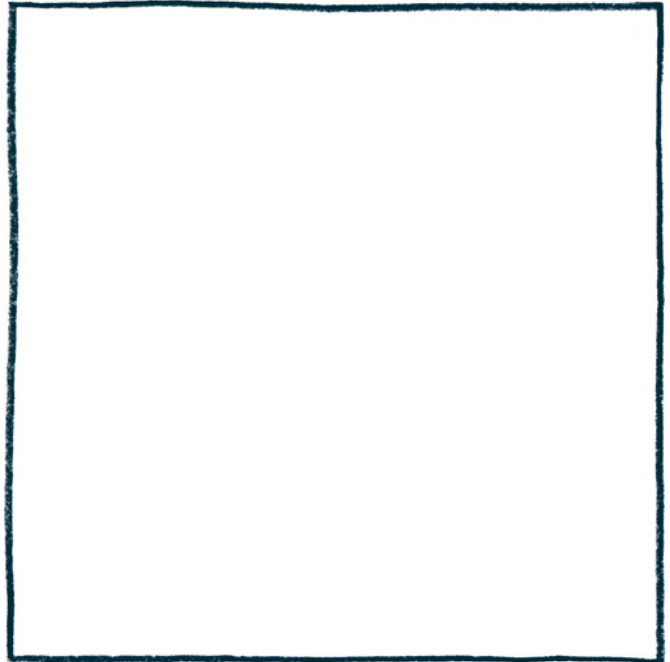
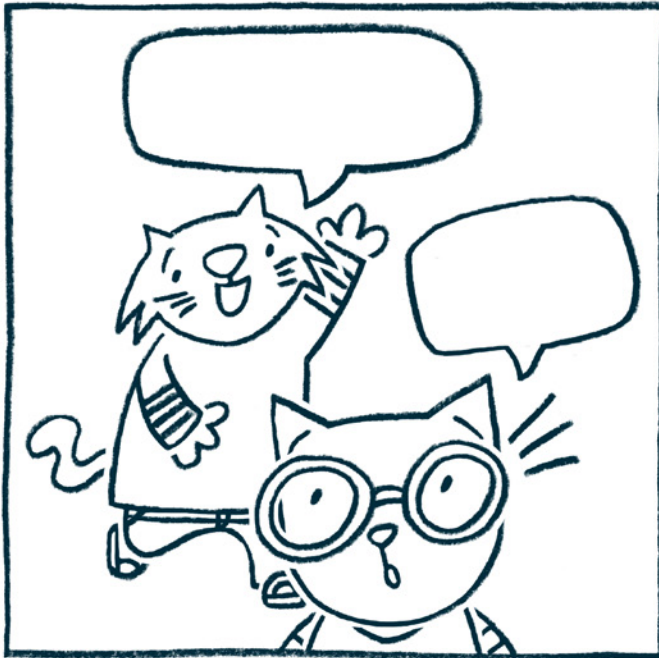
	Visit a Free Little Library. Leave a book. Take a book (or two!).	Read a children's book of poetry.	Read a favorite story out loud to a plant or flower.

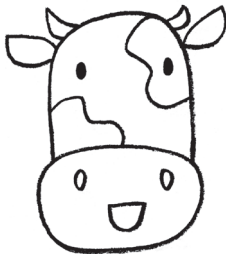


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Farm Animal Matching

Springtime on the farm is quite noisy! Below are five farm animals. Can you match each animal to the sound they make? You can color them, too, if you like.



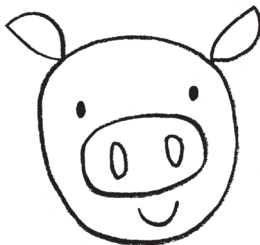
