#### **CELEBRATING 40 YEARS OF ARTISTRY & FAMILY!**

The Denver Brass, presenting brass music of national and international renown, was formed in 1981 by Kathleen and Charles Brantigan. The organization was built on a vision of a one-of-a-kind professional chamber ensemble that would be at the forefront of brass performance, entertainment, original commissions, education, and community service.

Unique in the world, Denver Brass has set itself apart through its sound, original repertoire, and state-of-the-art multi-cultural show productions.

The elements of The Brass' trademark sound include more than 13 distinct instruments—including an array of rarely-used trumpets in various pitches—and the exceptional technical and expressive expertise of some of the nation's finest brass musicians. Together they produce a rainbow of timbre: not a band, not an orchestra, but an entirely new phenomenon. Exploration of fusions of music from diverse cultures and electronic and digital technology is central to groundbreaking artistic development. Today's Denver Brass is heard live by more than 40,000 persons at more than 130 season series, community, and educational events annually, as well as on popular social media platforms and 30+ acclaimed recordings.

#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

#### **Hope in Perilous Times - WORLD PREMIERE**

A Gift from the Max DiJulio Fund

The Denver Brass commissioned bass trombonist Andrew Wolfe to write a new work that would address the emotional impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The result, *Hope in Perilous Times*, is a reflective, moving piece that takes the listener through the emotional cycle many of us felt during this period of time. From initial mystery, to ominous menace, on to anxiety, sorrow and grief, Andy captures the undulating sentiments of precarious times. The piece builds and builds, leading to what can be described as a sense of relief before launching into a reflective end, filled with hope, joy, and remembrance. Andy comments that "the music can mean something different to each person," a reflection of the fact that we all find ourselves with entirely different reactions to the pandemic and how we are all, ultimately, working to rediscover hope and joy at the end of this perilous time.

#### **ALAN HOOD - TRUMPET**

Alan Hood is one of today's most prominent trumpet performers and educators. He has served as Professor of Trumpet at the Lamont School of Music and performed with the Denver Brass since 1999. He is one of the rare trumpeters who is equally at home in both classical and jazz performance. Alan hails from upstate New York. He attended the University of Kentucky as an undergraduate, North Illinois and the University of Texas at Austin as a graduate student, and the University of Miami as a doctoral student. He has studied with many inspirational and highly regarded teachers including Vince DiMartino, Ron Modell, Ray Crisara and Gil Johnson. He has also performed with world-renowned musicians including Woody Herman, Glenn Miller, Harry James, Ray Charles, Natalie Cole, Manhattan Transfer, Arturo Sandoval and Wynton Marsalis, to name just a

few. Alan has recorded extensively over his career, appearing on more than 50 albums, and it was his first solo CD release, Just a Little Taste, where he found his own voice in the world of trumpet virtuosos.



#### STEVEN TAYLOR - BARITONE

Steven Taylor is known to audiences throughout the Rocky Mountain region both for his beautiful, expressive singing and his dramatic interpretations. His versatile singing career ranges from opera and oratorio to musical theatre, gospel, and Jazz. He has appeared onstage with Central City Opera, Opera Theatre of the Rockies, Boulder's Dinner Theatre, and Opera Colorado, and in concert with major symphonies and choral organizations throughout the west, including two soloist performances in Carnegie Hall. As a member of the internationally acclaimed Gospel Quartet LEGACY, Steven has performed concert tours in Australia, Canada, Cuba and South Korea. Often sought after as a teaching artist and narrator, Steven currently serves as Dean of the School of Music at Colorado Christian University.

#### **MEET OUR MUSICIANS AND STAFF**



Warren Deck, conductor -Warren has had a long and illustrious career in music performance, education. instrument development, and recording production. The recipient of the International Tuba and Euphonium

Association's Lifetime Achievement Award. he served as Principal Tubist of the New York Philharmonic for 23 years. Warren made his solo debut with the New York Philharmonic performing the world premiere of Roger Kellaway's Songs of Ascent for Tuba and Orchestra, commissioned by the Philharmonic for Warren and conducted by Zubin Mehta. He has made numerous orchestral recordings under the leadership of such conductors as Leonard Bernstein, Zubin Mehta, and Kurt Masur and in addition, made four recordings with The Canadian Brass. Warren collaborated with the Meinl Weston Company of Germany on three models of tubas that are currently being sold. He works as a tonemeister/producer for both solo and ensemble recordings in a wide variety of genres and has traveled as a clinician throughout the world. Warren teaches at the University of Denver's Lamont School of Music and the Aspen Music Festival.



David Artley, trumpet -Formerly a member and soloist of the United States Army Field Band and later the United States Army Band, "Pershing's Own," David has performed live for

7 former U.S. Presidents. You may also have unknowingly seen and heard David at the White House or one of many major United States ceremonies as a member of the U.S. Army Herald Trumpets. In 2014, David brought his talents to the Denver Brass where he now sits in front of 7 different pitched trumpets that give the Denver Brass its unique one-of-akind sound. David is passionate about writing, reading, photography and history. He can be found hiking, scuba diving, and/or maintaining the family farm in lowa, owned by his family since 1877, with his wife Andrea and daughters Sophia and Elisabeth.



**Tim Allums, trumpet** – Tim Allums comes to the Denver Brass from many years of service to his country with the United States Air Force as a member of the U.S. Air Force Academy Band, where he was a member of the famed "Stellar

Brass." Formally trained in music and trumpet performance at the University of Oregon, Tim is a born entertainer. He also performed in the Air Force Academy concert band and renowned "Falconaires" jazz band. Equally at home in all genres of music, Tim has performed with rock and salsa bands as well as symphony orchestras, and now, The Denver Brass, Tim can be found woodworking, deck building, and at the gym. Sam Oatts, trumpet - A seasoned professional. Sam is currently teaching and completing his Doctoral degree at Arizona State University. A Broadway show musician for more than 15 years, Sam has

of the U.S. Air Force Academy Band. Susan is the number one freelance horn player in the region. She's played with the Colorado Springs Philharmonic, Inside the Orchestra, Colorado Opera Festival, Denver Center for the Performing Arts, and has toured the U.S. and Japan with the Aries Brass Quintet. When not playing horn, Susan's husband, children and grandchildren occupy most of her free time. Her son Jesse is also a professional horn player in the Cleveland Orchestra.



Lauren Varley, horn – Lauren Varley, a native of Pennsylvania, received her B.M. from Boyer College of music at Temple University and M.M. from San Francisco Conservatory of music. Previously, she performed professionally throughout the
