HAVI PROGRAM MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

- Must be a hospital-based or hospital-linked program that provides violence prevention/intervention services to violently injured patients
- Initial referrals must be based on the treatment for violent injury or the identified risk of future violent injury
- Initial contact with the client must take place in the hospital whenever possible
- Post-discharge intensive case management services are made available to all clients for at least 6 months
- Have a clearly stated program vision and mission*
- Have been in continuous operation for at least two full years
- Have had encounters with at least 50 violently injured patients annually
- Services are provided, when possible, by trained staff from the same or similar communities as the patients they serve
- If located within 25 miles of an existing HVIP, must demonstrate that this program complements rather than competes with the existing HVIP
- Have at least 2.0 FTE staff assigned to the program (including a Program Manager and Frontline Worker)
- Demonstrated exposure and engagement to the HVIP model, as evidenced by participating in/attending The HAVI Annual Conference, How to Start a HVIP Workshop, site visits to HAVI member programs, and/or has been active as a HAVI emerging program for 2 years

*Program Vision and Mission should directly relate to:

- Strengthening the social determinants of health
- Addressing retaliatory violence
- Addressing violent re-injury
- Supporting the emotional and mental health of clients
- Providing services using a trauma-informed approach



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QUALIFICATIONS FOR HAVI EMERGING PROGRAM MEMBERSHIP

- Must be a hospital-based or hospital-linked program that provides violence prevention/intervention services to violently injured patients
- Initial referrals must be based on the treatment for violent injury
- Initial contact with the client must take place in the hospital whenever possible
- Post-discharge intensive case management services are made available to all clients for at least 6 months
- Have a clearly stated program mission and goals*
- Have been in operation for at least one full year
- Have had encounters with at least 20 violently injured patients annually
- Services are provided, when possible, by trained staff from the same or similar communities as the patients they serve
- If located within 25 miles of an existing HVIP, must demonstrate that this program complements rather than competes with the existing HVIP--demonstrates collaborative relationship
- Have at least 2.0 FTE staff assigned to the program
