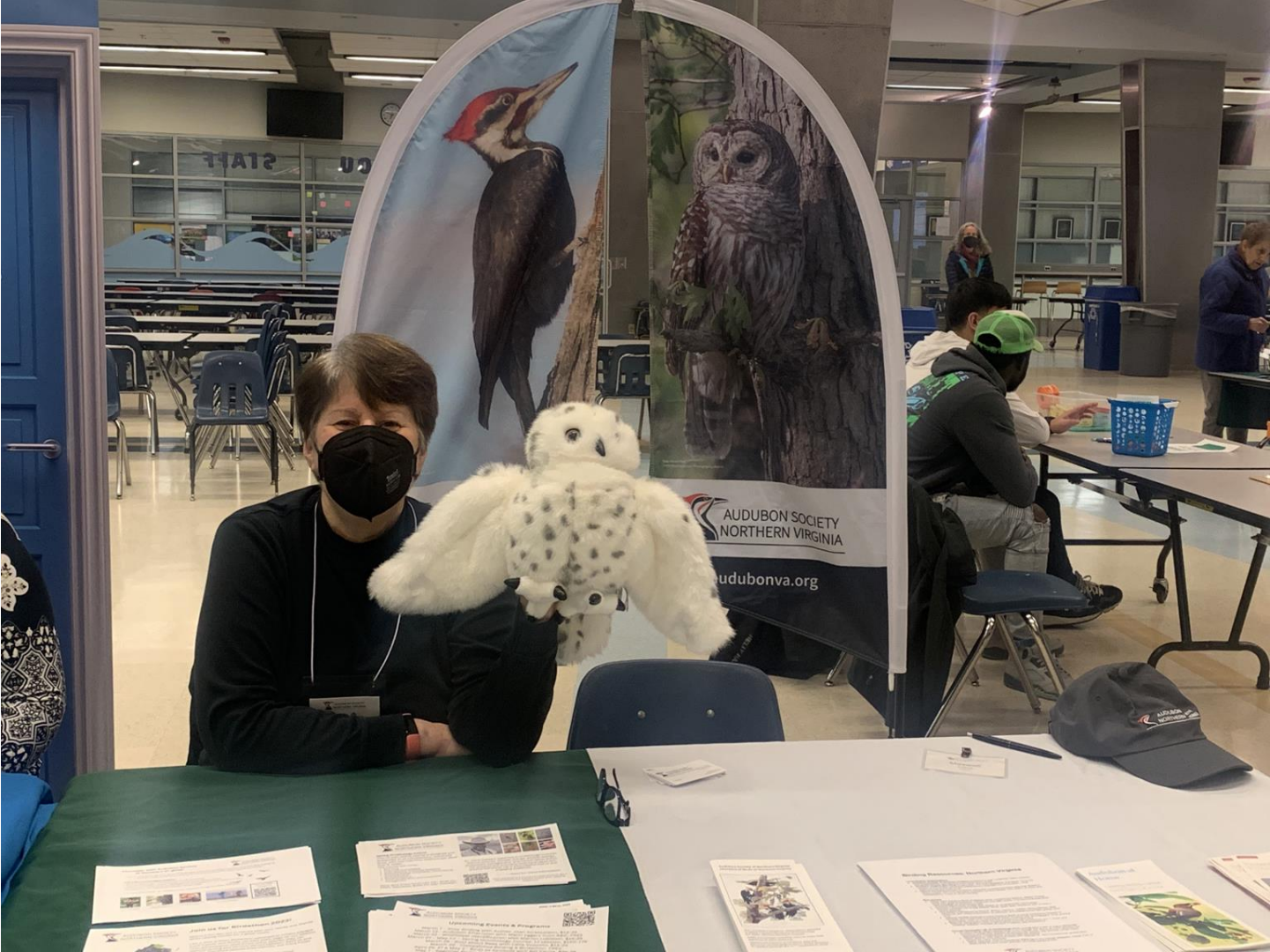

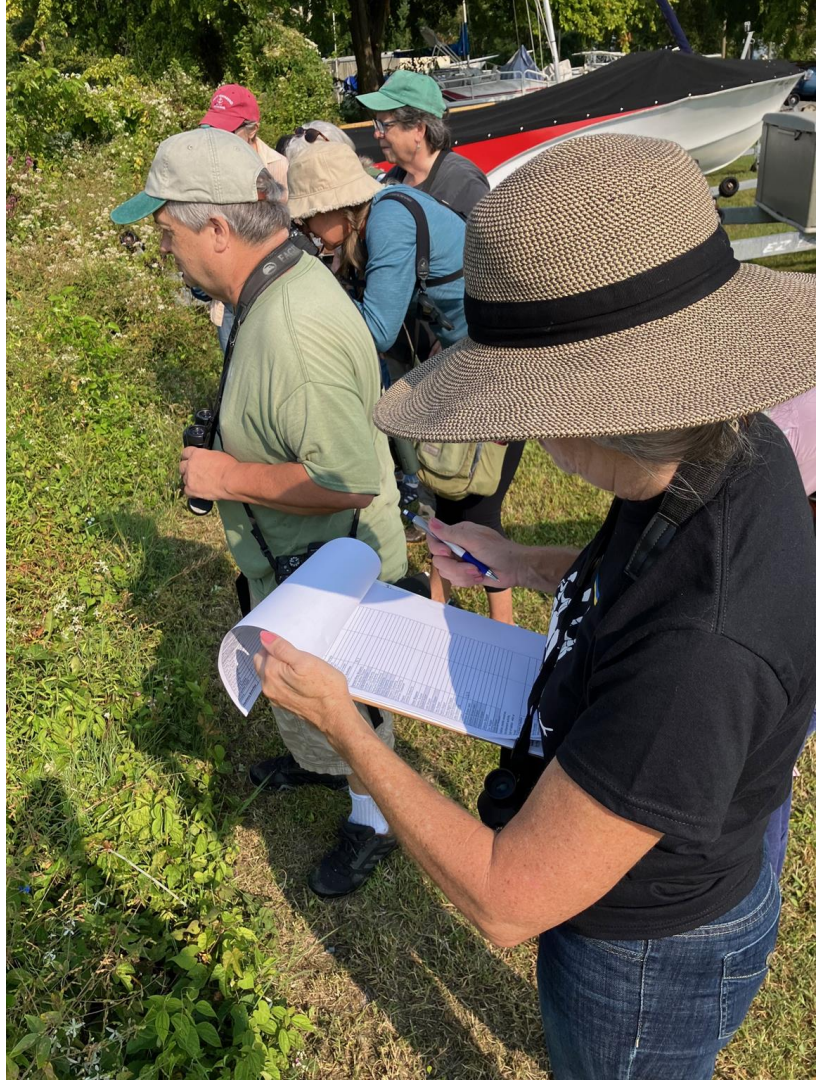

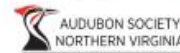

You help us reach a broader audience.



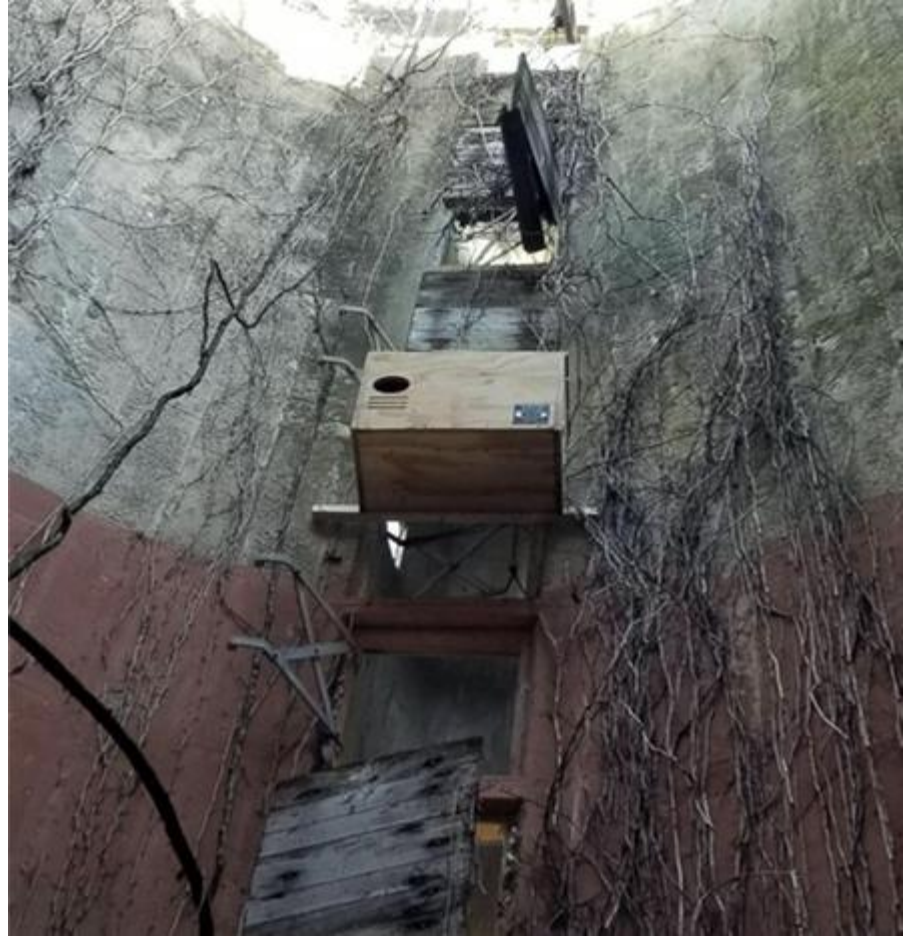
