THE SCULPTURE COLLECTION AT THE ARBORETUM

Search for sculptures created by regional and internationally renowned artists. The Evergreen Arboretum Society works with the City of Everett Cultural Commission to purchase, display and maintain the collection. Most artworks are permanent installations. Others are part of a rotating exhibit provided by the city.

WOODLAND GARDEN & FERNERY

A truly contemplative Northwest shade garden invites visitors to walk on a steel and wood bridge built over a rock-filled stream bed among a range of ferns and hydrangea. Stop to admire the small stone patio nestled in tall evergreens. All the plants chosen work well in wooded or shaded gardens.



JAPANESE MAPLE GROVE

Experience the variety and beauty of our Japanese Maple Grove which once earned national accolades in *Sunset Magazine*. Japanese Maples are prized for their seasonal diversity. They boast spectacular spring foliage, summer shade, stunning fall colors, and graceful silhouettes and bark color in winter. The Pacific Northwest offers perfect growing conditions for these beautiful trees.

BACKYARD GARDEN

Explore the landscape features of a typical Northwest home garden. Creative plant design is used for year-round color, texture, scent, flowers and foliage.

HORIZONTAL ROCK GARDEN

Miniature specimens including conifers, shrubs, perennials, grasses and groundcovers thrive in the cracks and crevices of beautiful huckleberry basalt stones. The stones surround *Roundness of the Horizon - The Fossil*, an installation by Katzutaka Uchida. Using a combination of foliage, texture, form and color, the plantings offer year-round interest.

SMALL URBAN TREE WALK

Learn about trees 25 feet tall or less that work well in small garden spaces. Tree varieties showcase different leaf colors, flowers and unusual shapes. Ground cover plants and grasses offer alternatives to lawns.

SNOHOMISH COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS DEMONSTRATION GARDEN

Fall in love with perennials! Perennials grow and bloom March through October, die back every autumn and winter, and then return in the spring. The Snohomish County Master Gardeners tend the garden and use it as a classroom to learn plant identification and plant care. In the spring, the perennials are divided, put in pots and sold at a plant sale to benefit the program.

CONIFER GARDEN

Cone-bearing plants live a long time and provide color, texture and a backbone to the garden. The Conifer Garden demonstrates unique pruning techniques for healthy evergreens.

VIEWING MOUND

Enjoy a moment of meditation with the soothing sound of flowing water from *Fibonacci* by Pam Hom, a water feature inspired by the discoveries of proportionate geometry found in nature. Catch a sweeping view of the grounds from this high point in the arboretum.

ROCK GARDEN

Immerse yourself in a world filled with miniature conifers, shrubs, perennials and bulbs. This garden was built with materials that can be easily replicated by any garden enthusiast.

NORTHWEST NATIVE TRAIL

Journey along this handicap accessible woodland path imprinted with native plant leaves and animal paw prints while you enjoy the diversity of native plants bordering the path. These plants can all be found growing naturally in the Cascade Mountains and coastal region from northern Oregon to Vancouver B.C.

NATIVAR GARDEN

Nativars are cultivated varieties of native plants. This garden displays the unique ornamental qualities of these plants for use in the landscape. The garden culminates at *Siblings*, a sculpture by James Madison.
