EIHS' mission includes a commitment to honoring and preserving the nation's ethnic and cultural diversity and to foster respect and understanding for the varied communities that constitute our country. In support of these goals, in 1986, EIHS began awarding the Ellis Island Medal of Honor to individuals of immigrant descent and others of distinguished character who have made it their mission to share with those less fortunate their wealth of knowledge, indomitable courage, boundless compassion, unique talents, and selfless generosity, all while maintaining the values of their ethnic heritage as they uphold the ideals and spirit of America.

In addition to honoring and promoting examples of immigrant contributions to the United States, the Ellis Island Honors Society supports the preservation of the Ellis Island National Monument, ensuring this gateway of hope is available for future generations of visitors. Ellis Island Honors Society also supports the education of students with immigrant heritage and raises funds for culturally focused events, emergency relief, and humanitarian programs by mobilizing its community of awardees and friends.









ELLIS ISLAND MEDALS OF HONOR

The Ellis Island Medals of Honor embody the spirit of America in their celebration of patriotism, diversity, and the importance of immigrants to our nation's economic and social success. The medal is presented each year on Ellis Island to a select group of individuals whose accomplishments in their fields and inspired service to our nation are worthy of commendation. The medal has been officially recognized by both Houses of Congress as one of our nation's most prestigious awards and its honorees are recorded annually in the official Congressional Record.

Since the medal was founded, we have honored many distinguished and diverse Americans including Presidents Ronald Reagan and Joe Biden, as well as six additional Presidents of the United States.



LEGENDS AWARDS

The Legends Award is presented to Ellis Island Medal of Honor recipients who deserve special recognition for continuing to make significant contributions to our nation after receiving the medal. These individuals have shown a lifetime of commitment to humanitarian causes and have earned the respect of their peers.

Founded in 1996, the Legends Award has been presented to Muhammad Ali, Gov. George Pataki, Sen. John McCain, Lee Iacocca, John B. Goodman, and other distinguished recipients.

The Legends Award is a natural progression for those exceptional individuals who have received the Beacon Award and the Ellis Island Medal of Honor.




BEACON AWARDS



Prior to CNBC, she was a part of the Wall Street Journal's Money & Investing team and began her career on Wall Street at the age of seventeen working at Citigroup—which is where she earned the nickname "Wall Street Maneet."

She was also the host of Spotify's special-edition podcast Megatrends (Gimlet media, 2019) and author of The Alpha Masters: Inside the Genius of the World's Top Hedge Funds, which has been published in five languages and sold over 30,000 copies.

FOUNDER AND PRESIDENT IDEAS BEYOND BORDERS

Born in Babylon and raised in Baghdad, Faisal Saeed Al Mutar experienced the villainy of extremism and authoritarian regimes firsthand. He survived the Iraq Civil War, the murder of his brother, and several kidnapping attempts before becoming

a refugee in the United States in 2013. His brother's murder led him to start fighting against al-Qaeda in West Baghdad at 15 years old, using a contraband cell phone to send coordinates of al-Qaeda forces to U.S. commanders, and later from the United States as the founder of Ideas Beyond Borders, a non-profit dedicated to empowering people across the globe with access to new ideas and fresh perspectives

A practitioner of countering extremism and misinformation on an international scale, al Mutar has traveled to conferences and spoken on campuses across the globe about his experiences working to create positive change in the Middle East. IBB funds a network of underground schools for girls in Afghanistan and has educated tens of millions of MENA youth about Enlightenment ideas during its six-year history, breaking through the censorship imposed by regional authoritarians. IBB's Innovation Hub program, a small grants program that aims to empower individuals who are changing lives and creating hope in their communities, is revolutionizing how the international development world works in the Middle East. IBB cuts through the red tape and corruption of many international aid organizations and brings help directly to the people who need it. When earthquakes ravaged Turkey and Syria, IBB, under Faisal's tutelage, sprang into action. They not only facilitated direct humanitarian aid to those who needed it most on the ground, but they also continue to work with Innovation Hub grantees in the region to create jobs for those impacted.

Faisal received the "President's Volunteer Service Award" from President Barack Obama and currently serves on the leadership council at the World Liberty Congress, which brings together leaders and pro-democracy movements under autocratic regimes to learn and support each other in specific action-oriented areas. The WLC focuses on supporting freedom fighters at a political, strategic, financial, and legal level for movements and leaders. He publishes stories of the triumph of the human spirit authored by brave people from around the world on his Substack, The International Correspondent. Faisal lives and works in New York City.

Daniela Alulema is the Project Director for the CUNY-Initiative on Immigration and Education, a researcher, and a nonprofit leader. Originally from Quito, Ecuador, Daniela brings her

journey as an undocumented immigrant, her passion, and her belief in human-centered policymaking and research into her work. At CUNY-IIE, Daniela oversees the initiative's implementation, which aims to produce and disseminate resources for educators that center the strengths of immigrant communities.

She previously served as director of programs at the Center for Migration Studies, a think-tank that promotes the rights and dignity of immigrants. During her tenure at CMS, Daniela managed community-based research projects on the implementation of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, the impact of fear on how immigrants access services and programs in New York City, and the impact of deportation on US families and communities. She also authored reports on the impact of DACA and the critical role educators play in the lives of immigrant youth. Daniela has a deep commitment to applied research that supports evidence-based policymaking and person-centered work that focuses on the voices of the directly impacted.

Daniela worked at the New York State Youth Leadership Council, the first council led by undocumented youth in the state, participating in advocacy campaigns for the New York Dream Act and the federal DREAM Act, organizing legal clinics and informational sessions on the DACA program, and other initiatives that promote equal access to higher education to all regardless of immigration status. During her tenure, Daniela led the media committee, where she trained members on storytelling and created media placement opportunities to lift up and disseminate the NYSYLC's work. Her immigrant experience has been a driving force behind her work and commitment to inclusive and humane migration policy.


Daniela serves as a board member at National Pastoral Migratoria, an immigrant leadership ministry of service, justice, and accompaniment in parishes across the United States.

She strives to address barriers and drive positive change, particularly for women engineers and veterans, who make up 20% of Paxon's employees.

Nooshin currently serves as the board president for the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO) San Francisco Bay Area chapter, as well as board of directors for Young President Organization (YPO) entrepreneurship, the advisory board for the University of California Davis. Nooshin's work has earned recognition and awards from organizations such as Business Times, Real leaders, the Women Presidents Organization (WPO), Forbes, Fortune, and Inc magazines. Nooshin holds a B.A. in Architecture from UC Berkeley, an M.S. in Civil and Environmental Engineering from UC Davis, and is a graduate of UCLA's EMBA Program. She is also a professionally trained piano player and has played for the U.C. Berkeley Jazz Ensemble.

Rosemarin Belliard is the proud daughter of immigrants from the Dominican Republic and an attorney committed to advancing and protecting the rights of immigrants in the US.

Belliard is an Associate at Gibney, Anthony & Flaherty, LLP, where she advises multinational corporate clients on U.S. Immigration and Nationality law. She assists clients in obtaining employment-based immigrant and nonimmigrant visas, concentrating primarily on the PERM labor certification process. She has appeared at numerous Permanent Resident interviews at USCIS offices throughout the country.

Rosemarin holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from CUNY John Jay College of Criminal Justice and a Juris Doctor from New York Law School. During her time in law school, Rosemarin was awarded the Government Fellowship and Chief Justice Rose R. Bird Award for Motivation in Pursuing Public Interest Law. As a law student, she volunteered with the Safe Passage Project and served as an intern for Chief Judge Dora L. Irizarry of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of New York. Prior to law school, Rosemarin was selected as the New York City Urban Fellow for the Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, where she assisted the office in its mission to facilitate the successful integration of immigrant New Yorkers.

Rosemarin is dedicated to the advancement of pro bono work and diversity, equity, and inclusion in the legal profession. Currently, she serves at her firm as Chair of the Pro Bono Committee and has provided New Yorkers with immigration assistance through the New York City Advocacy Initiative, CUNY Citizenship Now, and Dominicanos USA.

She is the incoming President of the Dominican Bar Association, which supports Latino members of the legal profession and the at-large Latino community by providing scholarships and mentorship to law students, conducting career information activities for high school students and organizing pro-bono events for the community. She is a board member of 100 Hispanic Women National, Inc., a non-profit, non-partisan women's organization which promotes the professional advancement of Latina women in the government and corporate sectors.

In 2019, Rosemarin established the Trailblazer Scholarship at CUNY John Jay College in loving memory of her mentor, the former director of the Pre-Law Institute of John Jay College, Vielka Holness, Esq. The scholarship is awarded annually to a first-generation undergraduate student, from a traditionally underrepresented background in the legal profession, who plans to attend law school upon graduation.

Rosemarin is an active runner and 2023 NYC Marathon finisher who believes in the transformative power of running and movement.

Erik Bottcher is a dedicated public servant and activist who has devoted his life to progressive causes and to the betterment of the community he loves. In 2021, he was elected to represent

City Council District 3, which includes the neighborhoods of Greenwich Village, Chelsea, Hell's Kitchen, Hudson Square, Flatiron, Times Square, the Theater District, and the Garment District.

Growing up in a small town in the Adirondack Mountains as the only gay person he knew, Erik's personal struggles with depression sparked in him a lifelong dedication to helping the most marginalized members of our society. His career in public service began in 2009 as the LGBTQ & HIV/AIDS Community Liaison in the City Council's community outreach unit, where he organized grassroots campaigns on issues including hate crimes, transgender rights, housing for people with HIV/AIDS, and marriage equality.

Erik then served as the statewide LGBTQ Community Liaison in the governor's office, where he helped organize the fight for marriage equality in New York State, working with activists from Buffalo to Montauk in an unprecedented grassroots campaign to garner support for the Marriage Equality Act. New York State made history as the largest state to legalize same sex marriage.

As City Councilman, Bottcher has focused on mental health, sanitation, and employment, as well as the needs of NYC public housing and the unhoused.

Jennifer H. Cunningham is an award-winning investigative journalist, editor, and newsroom leader. Cunningham is a versatile media executive, and has spent nearly 20 years writing, reporting, editing, and skillfully managing teams in

the fast-paced, high-pressure world of news. Her mastery lies in implementing content strategies and comprehensive news visions while managing the daily demands of breaking news. Her deep experience in using data and analytics in news coverage decisions has set new standards for the industry.

She is the Editor-in-Chief of the News Division at Business Insider, overseeing bureaus in the United States, United Kingdom, and Singapore. Under Cunningham's leadership, the newsroom won its first Pulitzer Prize, in 2022.

The married mom of one began her career in journalism as a municipal reporter for her hometown papers, the Herald News and the Bergen Record, before working her way up to general assignment reporting for the New York Daily News, where she covered crime, national news, and entertainment.

After spending about a decade as a reporter, Cunningham decided to step into the editing realm. She became senior editor of exclusive news and investigative reporting at Interactive One, working with a small team to cover the intersection of celebrity, entertainment, and the legal system. She later joined Business Insider as Executive Editor during the height of the pandemic, overseeing an 80 person plus newsroom, and was promoted to Editor in Chief in 2022.

Cunningham's own reportage has appeared in the New York Daily News, iOne, Cheddar TV, amNew York, Essence Magazine, and The Bergen Record Newspaper. She's covered historic events like the Sandy Hook Elementary school shooting, Hurricane Sandy in New York City and New Jersey, and both the 2008 and 2012 presidential elections. Her coverage of Whitney Houston's death won an award from the New York Association of Black Journalists.

In her spare time, Cunningham volunteers with the Newswomen's Club of New York – the nation's oldest nonprofit advocacy group for women in the newsroom – where she is the immediate past president.





Junie Joseph, the current State Representative, brings a unique blend of personal experience and professional dedication to her role as a public servant. Living in Boulder as a renter, she faced the challenges of a law student while concurrently serving on the Boulder City Council. Despite the demanding workload,

Junie successfully balanced her responsibilities, eventually earning her law degree, passing the Colorado Bar, and establishing her family law practice. Notably, her grassroots campaign for Boulder City Council in 2019 set a record for the highest votes received by a registered Democrat in a nonpartisan election. During her four years on the City Council, Junie passionately advocated for working people, championing criminal justice reform, bilingual emergency announcements, and transparency through initiatives like OpenGov. 


Serving our pets - and their people - is Anna's passion, and her life's mission.




