(Generals) Johnson Hagood, SC 1829-98 & John Bratton, SC 1831-98. Folio DS with other ex-Confederates 7/20/1881 Hagood as Governor & Bratton as Comptroller General & 2 BPPs 270.

(Lt. Genl.) Wade Hampton, SC 1818-1902 who replaced Jeb Stuart then was SC Governor. ALS Baltimore 2/10/1873 to former CSA Genl. James Simons, 1 Pg...\$525., CDV 225.

(Capt.) Wm. Miles Hazzard, SC (GA) 1835-1904. He led a company of Cavalry who used double barreled shotguns rather than long knives in Georgia. ALS 1896 35.

(Col.) H(illery) A. Herbert, Montgomery (SC) 1834-1919. He led the 8th Alabama Infantry & was wounded at the Wilderness. Large Clipped Signature 45.

(Lt. Gen.) A. P. Hill, VA 1825-65. He led the CSA 3rd Corps who replaced Stonewall Jackson. He was a Veteran of Mexico & the Seminole Wars. Killed In Action at Petersburg. Framed Large Signature 12x17 2,750.

A. P. Hill CDV head only or waist up. Each is 250.

B(en) J. Hill, McMinnville, TN 1825-80. He led a brigade under Cleburne & later Cavalry under N. B. Forrest. His Check 10/22/1869 Nashville, pen cancelled 150.

(M. Gen.) Thomas C. Hindman, AR (Nashville) 1828-68. Three times wounded: Shiloh, Chickamauga & Atlanta and assassinated in 1868. Clipped Signature (pre-war) 275.

(General) John B. Hood, Signature as 2nd Lieutenant, TX (KY) 1831-79. Wounded at Gettysburg & lost a leg at Chickamauga. His Signature...\$425., His CDV 275.

Eppa Hunton, VA 1822-1908. This Gettysburg Veteran was wounded in Pickett's Charge at Gettysburg & later captured at Saylor's Creek. ALS 5/15/1851, 1 Pg USS & US House, postwar 270.

(Lt. Genl.) T. J. Jackson, VA 1824-63. Wounded at 1st Manassas & mortally wounded at Chancellorsville by friendly fire. DS as Lt (in Mexico), Framed Document approximately 24x18... 8,500.

Bradley Johnson, MD 1829-1903. He burned Chambersburg, PA after Sheridan burned the Shenandoah Valley. ALS on Letterhead as Attorney, 1 Pg 2/11/1869 145.

(Confederate & Cuban Rebel Genl.) Thomas Jordan, VA 1819-95. Sherman's WP roommate who served on Staffs of: A. S. Johnston, Beauregard & Bragg. 6-lines 1853 to Genl. Jesup 125.

Thos. Jordan ALS 3PP 2/11/1889 to Gen. Marcus Wright, speaks of the CSA War inlayed 245.

(M. Gen.) James L. Kemper, VA 1823-95 who turned the tide at 2nd Manassas & was shot, captured & rescued in Pickett's Charge. He was later Virginia Governor. 1882 Check 220.

(B. Gen.) John D. Kennedy, Camden, SC 1840-96. A scarce Gettysburg General & Lt. Governor of South Carolina. H was 5 times wounded. ALS Personal Letterhead February 2, 1884, 1 Pg 345.

(Major) Emile La Sere, LA (Haiti) 1802-82. Of the 10th Louisiana who fought 18 duels. This tiny man usually won. He was later Chief Quartermaster Trans-Mississippi Dept. His Signature 40.

(B. Gen.) Col. Dan Leadbetter, AL (ME) 1811-66. He was 3rd in his 1836 WP Class. After 20 years in US Army he joined the CS Army. ADS part-printed Ft. Morgan, AL 2/1/1861 350.

(Lt. Gen.) Capt. Stephen D. Lee, Charleston, SC 1833-1908. A Certified true copy of an ALS (of A. C. Myers) 6/5/1861 425.

G. W. C. Lee, VA 1832-1913. Signed & Addressed 1900 Envelope & 6-line Pencil ANS re a 5-line Ink Note unsigned by his father beautifully framed, approximately 22x20 1,450.

R. E. Lee, VA 1807-70. SCDV Photo (Brady Backmark). He gave this photo to one of his students, Charles M. Hanna at Washington & Lee 5,750.

(B. Gen.) Thos. M. Logan, Charleston, SC 1840-1914. One of the youngest CSA Generals. DS Railroad Stock Richmond & West Point, Signature as President 225.

(Lt. Genl.) James Longstreet, GA (SC) 1821-1904. Wounded at the Wilderness by friendly fire. ALS 3PP 1/16/1901 as a McKinley bureaucrat...\$550., His CDV 225.

L. L. Lomax, Major General CS Cavalry, VA (RI) 1835-1913. An Army brat & Rhode Island's only CS General. He led Cavalry at Gettysburg. ANSC 4-lines 195.

(M. Gen) Bvt. Lt. Col. J. Bankhead Magruder, VA 1810-71. a/k/a "Prince John" US Army, CS Army & a Mexican General. 1859 ADS (Ft. Adams, RI) 8x5 inches 175.

(M. Gen.) Wm. Mahone, VA 1826-95. One of Lee's stars at Gettysburg & postwar a RR President. Signature Clipped...\$70., DS 1867 Norfolk & Petersburg RR Bond also Signed by (Col.) Thos. J. Corprew, VA 1830-73. 6th Virginia. DS & 2 BPPs 195.

(M. Gen.) Dabney H. Maury, VA 1822-1900. Van Horn's Chief of Staff at: Elkhorn, luka, Corinth & Mobile Bay. ALS Chattanooga, TN 1/3/1880 to Genl. Wheeler 325.

Maj. Genl. (Wm. T.) Martin, KY 1823-1910 who led a Cavalry Division for Joe Wheeler. ANS in 3rd person, 4-lines February 10, 1865 250.

(B. Genl.) Gilbert S. Meem, VA 1824-1908. A Virginia Militia General who saw action under Stonewall Jackson in the Shenandoah. His 1901 Check 90.

L(afayette) McLaw, Savannah (Augusta, GA) 1821-97. He led a Division at Gettysburg & later in Georgia versus Sherman. 1876 DS as a Revenuer 195.

(B. Genl. & Gov.) Edwin A. O'Neal, AL 1818-90. He fought at Gettysburg & Atlanta, was wounded at 7 Pines. ALS 1 Pg 8/22/1884 as Alabama Governor (Governor's Letterhead) 245.

J(ohn) C. Pemberton Lt. General, VA (PA) 1814-81. Captured at Vicksburg by Grant's much larger Army. ANS as Lt. General, 4-lines laid down, WE 275.

(B. Gen.) Roger A. Pryor, VA 1828-1919 who served in US & CS Congress. He negotiated at Fort Sumter & postwar was "Beast Butler's" lawyer & served on the NY Supreme Court. ALS NYC April 13, 1868 175.

(B. Gen.) P(hilip) D. Roddy, AL 1826-97. A North Alabama Sheriff who led a brigade under Forrest. DS 9/1/1852 as Sheriff of Lawrence County, AL 275.

(B. Genl. & NC Gov.) Alfred M. Scales, NC 1827-92. A future North Carolina Governor who was wounded at Chancellorsville & again at Gettysburg. ALS 2PP 4/13/1884 back-to-back pages on US House Letterhead 225.

(Chief Justice SC) Eugene B. Gary Cokesbury 1854-1926 who was also SC Lt. Governor & Associate Justice of the SC Supreme Court. ALS 9/28/1885 on his Abbeville Letterhead, 1 Pg..... \$40.

(Capt.) D(an) B. Gilliard, Charleston 1842-1918. He served locally & fought in many SC battles. ALS undated on his legal Letterhead, 1 Pg 20.

(Capt.) H(enry) A. Gaillard, St. Stephens 1837-1921. He served in the 6th SC Infantry. ALS 4/11/1881, 2PP to fellow Confederate Joseph W. Barnwell 20.

(Col.) P(eter) C. Gaillard, Charleston 1812-89. He led the 27th SC Volunteers. He was wounded at Secessionville & lost a hand on Morris Island, SC, was captured & escaped at Weldon RR in North Carolina. DS 5/28/1878 as Charleston County Treasurer 50.

(Capt.) Wm. J. Gayer, SC (VA) 1833-95. He served as Provost Marshall of Charleston, SC. ADS 2/7/1876, 2 Notes Signed, can be clipped 25.

(Dr.) Eli Geddings, Newberry 1799-1878. The first graduate of MUSC in 1825. He served in the CS Army. ADS March 2, 1871, \$2.50 for a house call 125.

German Evangelical Lutheran Church funeral bill Charleston, SC 7/9/1881 for Henry Kuck's funeral: hearse, sexton, grave digger & carriage for \$47 30

(L. Col.) Wm. P. Gibbes, Chester 1817-90. A Custer classmate at WP who served as Artillery & served as a POW guard at Charleston & Florence camps. 2 ANS's on a Document March 6, 1868 Chester, SC 40.

(Judge & CSA Soldier) P(atrck) E. Gleason, Charleston (Ireland) 1843-90. He served in the Irish Volunteers of Augusta & was also a courier for Genl. A. S. Johnston. ALS 3/11/1885 on his judge's Letterhead, 1 Pg 30.

Mortimer Glover, Orangeburg 1838-1921. He served in Company A, Hagood's 1st SC (Edisto Rifles). ALS Orangeburg 2/28/1891, 1 Pg legal rhetoric on Letterhead 25.

Ambrose E. Gonzales, Colleton County 1857-1926. Author, founder & editor of the State Newspaper in Columbia, SC. He was a Captain in the Spanish-American War, the son of a CSA Colonel & Hampton's kinsman. TLS 4/23/1926 50.

(Dr.) J(ames) H. Goethe, SC 1833-99. An MUSC graduate who served as an Assistant Surgeon for the CS Army. ALS 2/19/1880, 1 Pg from Varnville, SC to Dr. C. P. Aimar 35.

(Col.) R(obt.) F. Graham, Marion 1833-74. He led the 21st SC & was the first battle on Morris Island. ADS, 1 Pg October 28, 1871 45.

Thos. M. Hanckel, Beaufort 1822-88. SC Secession Signer & (Capt.) Louis D. DeSaussure, Charleston 1824-88 who served of the Staffs of Generals Elliott & Hagood & (Major) R(obt.) Q. Pinckney (?) who served on the Staffs of Generals Traper, Withers & J. P. Anderson all Signed this Folio. DS 5/8/1875 re real estate w/3 BPPs 50.

J(ames) T. Hay, Columbia 1847-1907. Company D 5th Reserves Battalion. They served in North Carolina & also prison guards at Florence, SC. ALS 7/13/1905 w/Letterhead..... 25.

Theo. B. Hayne, Capt., Montgomery 1841-1917. Great grandson of Col. Isaac Hayne, Revolutionary War Martyr. He was a Citadel man (non-graduate) who served in both Carolinas. His Check 12/23/1916...\$25., DS, an Enlistment Signed twice at Battery Ramsey (James Island) April 23, 1864 enlisting a Irishman P. M. Kelly..... 125.

(Maj.) J(ohn) J. Gooding, SC 1841-1911 of the 11th SC who postwar was Auditor of Hampton County for 34 years. ALS 7/1/1904 as Auditor 20.

(Capt.) Wm. J. Gooding, Barnwell 1835-1912 who served in the 11th & 24th SC. Wounded at Swift Creek, VA. ALS December 2, 1867 as Beaufort Sheriff, 1 Pg..... 30.

(Lt.) D(avid) E. Gordon, Williamsburg 1831-? One of the Immortal 600 who served in the 9th & 4th SC Cavalries and was captured at Trevilian. ADS 9/5/1894..... 30.

(Mayor) John P. Grace 1874-1940. Charleston Mayor & eponym of the first Cooper River Bridge. DS 9/9/1915...\$25., TLS on his legal Letterhead 9/28/1938..... 35.

(Capt.) James W. Grace, Walterboro (Bristol, MA) 1830-95 who led Company C 54th MA. They fought on James Island, Morris Island & in Florida. DS as Colleton Clerk of Court January 1872 also Signed by planter Dr. Francis Y. Glover, SC 1817-96 who owned "Rosinwood" Plantation & 107 slaves prewar 75.

H(orace) Harby, Sumter 1846-1905. A CSA soldier of the Jewish faith. ADS May 14, 1896 on his livery stables Letterhead, 1 Pg..... 35.

(L. Col.) John C. Haskell, Abbeville 1841-1906. Hampton's son-in-law who lost an arm at Gaines Mill after staff duty with Generals Joe Johnston & G. W. Smith. He served with the Artillery. He was at Appomattox. ALS 1 Pg 5/23/1897 Bristol, VA 65.

(Sgt.) Isaac Hayne, Charleston (Montgomery) 1839-88. He served in the Marion Artillery & on the Staffs of Gen. Chesnut & Hagood. ADS 12/30/1879, 1 Pg 25.

(SC State Senator) James Hemphill, Chester 1813-1902. A lawyer & planter who owned \$10,000 value in property & \$66,000 in his 25 slaves. ALS 2/27/1885, 1 Pg on Letterhead 30.

John J. Hemphill, Chester 1849-1912. A state & federal legislator who ran for the US Senate & lost. ALS 2 separate pages 7/16/1894 20.

(Sgt. Major) Robert R. Hemphill, Abbeville 1840-1908. He served in many Virginia battles in the Orr Rifles & also served under Genl. Bonham. Brief ALS 9/20/1887 25.

(Lt.) C(ampbell) G. Henderson, SC 1839-? He fought in many SC battles with the 3rd SC Cavalry & postwar was a redshirt. ADS Walterboro 1/21/1893, 1 Pg 20.

D(an) S. Henderson, Walterboro 1846-1921. He was a courier for Genl. Elliott. TLS Aiken May 11, 1896 on his legal Letterhead..... 20.

BPP = Biographical Picture Page

(Gen.) Robert E. Lee, VA 1807-70. Chief of the ANV who invaded the North. Signature (Clipped from a Check, not by me)...\$2,300. CDV pictured him head to toe...\$250., (unsigned) as President of W & Lee given to Charles M. Hanna, one of his students, a little under book at\$5,650.

Dr. James Sanford (III), VA (Ireland) 1830-1904. Surgeon of the Rockbridge Artillery at Gettysburg & elsewhere. His 1874 Check & his Tax Receipt (\$2.60) is Signed. 2 items..... 45.

(BG, NC Governor & MC) Alfred M. Scales, Reidsville, NC 1827-92. A future NC Governor who was wounded at Chancellorsville & Gettysburg. ALS 2PP back-to-back 4/13/1884 on US House Letterhead 225.

(M. Gen.) John Sedgewick 1813-64. Three times he was wounded at Antietam. At Gettysburg he led the 6th Corps then KIA by a sharpshooter at Spotsylvania. He's the ranking Union General to be KIA. Small Clip...\$250., CDV..... 250.

(Generals) Sedgewick, Heintzelman & J. H. H. Ward all on a furlough 12/31/1861 near Fairfax, VA. All are Gettysburg Vets, the soldier was in the 38th NY. DS & 3 BPPs 550.

(B. Gen.) L. Col. Alexander Shaler, NY 1827-1911 who earned the Medal Of Honor for Marye's Heights (Fredericksburg). ALS Camp Harrison, VA 8/14/1862, 1 Pg..... 250.

M. Gen. D(an) Sickles, NYC 1819-1914. He lost a leg at Gettysburg below Cemetary Ridge & earned the Medal Of Honor and was reprimanded by Genl. Meade. His 1887 Check..... 145.

(Lt.) Rudolph Siegling, Port Royal, SC 1839-94. He led German Artillery under Hampton. They were at Gettysburg. He had been badly wounded at 2nd Manassas, reported to be KIA, a funeral was held at Charleston & the newspaper he later owned printed his obituary. 1878 DS...\$35., 1891 DS.... 40.

(Brevet B. G.) Orland Smith, OH (ME) 1825-1903. He led the 73rd Ohio at Gettysburg & the brigade. A hill he captured at Wauhatchie, TN is named for him. DS February 28, 1877, 1 Pg..... 40.

(B. Gen.) George J. Stannard, Georgia, VT 1820-86. Led a brigade of Vermont men who faced Pickett's Charge (wounded in the leg). Pension Check 1874 written by Gov. John L. Barstow, VT 1832-1913 who chased CSA guerillas into Canada after they robbed 3 Vermont banks. After negotiations with Canada these men couldn't be hanged as spies but could return to US only as POWs. WE of Stannard & 2 BPPs 250.

(Bvt. Major) Wm. Stone, SC (ME) 1842-97 who enlisted in the 19th Massachusetts & collected his 3rd wound at Gettysburg Postwar he stayed in SC with the Freedman's Bureau, married a Quaker school marm (they both were Abolitionists). He was SC Attorney General under Gov. Chamberlain & left SC in 1877. ALS NY 4/23/1886 Broadway, NYC, 1 PG 45.

J. E. B. Stewart, Patrick County, VA 1833-64. Lee's Chief of Cavalry A.N.V. who was mortally wounded at Yellow Tavern less than a year after Gettysburg. Signature in a beautiful gold fame...\$4,000 + shipping or come pick it up..... 4,000

(Dr.) B(en) B. Temple, MD, Danville, VA (?) who served in the 13th VA Infantry, Pegram's Artillery Battery & 13th Cavalry. Several times he was slightly wounded. A DS, a doctor's bill 1/25/1872 35.

(Col.) F(red) L(yman) Tremain, Albany, NY 1843-65. A Veteran of Gettysburg who fell at Hatcher's Run, VA leading the 10th NY Cavalry. ALS to Lt. Col. Gardner, 1st PA Cavalry, 1 Pg 8/7/1864 95.

(James Wade) the father of Jenny Wade, the only civilian killed in the Gettysburg Battle. A subpoena for him 4/22/1839 Signed by the Adams County Sheriff & others 120.

(B. Gen.) James Wadsworth, NY 1807-64. After Gettysburg he was KIA in the Virginia Wilderness leading a division of the 5th Corps. CS & CDV 295.

(Genls.) James S. Wadsworth (IBID) & John Wool 1789-1869. Both served versus the CSA & Wool served in Mexico. Album Page with NY Delegation to the 1861 Peace Conference. 9 Biographies & 2 BPPs..... 350.

"Capt." F(rederick) W. Wagener, Charleston (Germany) 1832-1921 who led the German Artillery under Hampton. ANS Mt. Pleasant, SC 10/28/1863 re Corpr. F. Krause, a pass to go to town, 4-lines... 125.

(B. Gen.) James A. Walker, VA 1832-1901. a/k/a "Stonewall Jim" who was dismissed from VMI for trying to get a duel with T. J. Jackson, his Professor. ALS 1 Pg on Letterhead 5/21/1888 225.

(Lt. Col.) Wm. Wallace, Columbia, SC 1824-1902 who was XO of the 2nd SC Infantry, was twice wounded: 2nd Manassas & Gettysburg. Partial DS (postwar)..... 40.

(B. Gen.) D(avid) A. Weisiger, VA 1818-99. A Veteran of Mexico & Gettysburg, wounded at 2nd Manassas. His 1871 Bank Deposit, looks like a check or 2 nice logos on his 1872 Check, both as cashier at Petersburg, your choice..... 175.

(BBG) E(dward) R. Warner, PA 1835-1905. Artillery Inspector for Genl. Henry Hunt. DS 11/28/1864, a Folio Artillery Report on the 5th Corps' Artillery 95.

(M. Gen.) G(ouverner) K. Warren, NY 1830-82. The North's star at "Little Round Top" Gettysburg. His 1881 Newport, RI Check to himself Endorsed, WE 245.
