

## The Steam-Up Story

In the late summer of 1969, the Steam Fiends put on a show on a piece of land near Gervais. A group from Woodburn had a big idea in making an annual show there and needed the steam tractors and antique equipment to help draw a crowd.

Later that fall, there was a club formed under the supervision of Ed Currans. He was a Steam Fiend and interested in antique farm tractors, including both steam and gas and old machinery. He was around 65 years old.

Harvey Mikkelson of Silverton had been having threshing shows at his farm for several years. He had a nice collection of old steam and a few gas tractors, which he used for his show. But by this time, he decided to quit having them at his farm as people just took possession of things on his farm; there were such crowds. Harvey was all for this club to buy land and start an antique museum and have annual shows. He also wanted to have Ed Currans as president.

They found property on Brooklake Road, near the little town of Brooks that was for sale. There was 60 acres in the plot.

Steam-Ups continued annually and have been held on this site since 1970.

In March 2001, Antique Powerland Museum Association, Inc. (APMA) was formed to manage, develop, and fund Antique Powerland. The number of partner museums and organizations continue to grow and they work collaboratively to present the Great Oregon Steam-Up. In 2017, the grounds became Powerland Heritage Park.
