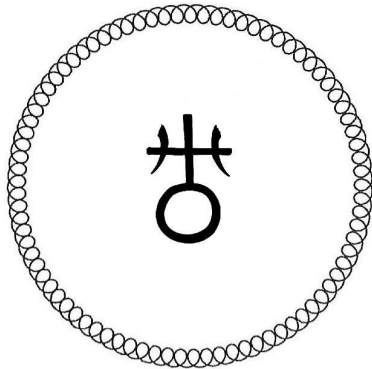

A Modest Prediction

What is this about?

By strange coincidence, the three Great Events of United States history were all 84 years apart – which suggests another major cataclysm by the end of this decade.

By stranger coincidence, this pattern fits with the cycle of Uranus, which is also around 84 years.

Astrology? Like star signs?

Yes, but mostly no. Astrology is much more than *sun* signs. The core of astrology isn't the zodiac but the planets and their cycles.

Life is all about cycles – day and night, summer to winter, birth to death. This pattern suggests a society can have a cycle too, and it may correspond to a fellow planet for some reason.

What's with the costume?

Uranus symbolizes revolution, freedom, and Promethean advancement. The cloak's blue reflects its hue, and shimmer reflects its technofuturist meaning.

Uranus is currently a third of the way into the sign of Taurus, thus the bull horns. These Great Events all take place when Uranus is about a third of the way into Gemini.

Do other nations have this regular cycle?

Doesn't seem like it. We're special.

What makes these wars most important?

Some reputable historians cite these events as pivotal, such as Charles and Mary Beard or Bruce Ackerman, but there's no way to objectively assert what events matter most in history.

You can count fatalities or resources gained or lost, but what matters can't always be counted. You either recognize these events as pivotal or don't. Some truths are self-evident.

Can't this be random chance?

Maybe; let's do the math. The likelihood of the past alignments was:

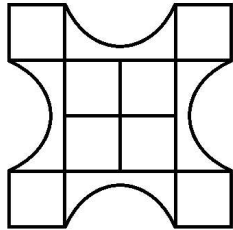
$$1/84 \times 1/84 \times 1/84 = 1/592,704$$

Very unlikely. So the pattern repeating again would be:

$$1/592,704 \times 1/84 = 1/49,787,136$$

Exceptionally unlikely. Such an event offers a rare natural experiment for astrology.

Is there any other precedence for this prediction?

Peter Turchin models the history of many nations as a cycle tensions between the elites and the masses that often resolves in war and plague that resets the balance.

In his 2016 book *Age of Discord*, he uses statistical data throughout American History to argue we are in a period of tumult that mirrors the decades before the Great Depression and World War II. His book highlighted 2020 as a year when tensions would sharply rise.

Bill Strauss and Neil Howe model cyclical history that fits with the astrology more precisely, highlighting the same Great Events as pivotal moments in American history.

In their 1991 book *Generations*, they suggested a “Crisis of 2020.” Their 1995 follow-up *The Fourth Turning* predicted terrorist attacks and a financial crisis in the 2000s to kick off a “Winter” of American history.

Both theories have gained popular attention in mainstream media over the past year for their prescience. Neither relate to astrology nor make as firm a timing prediction.

Are there other cycles involved?

Yes, but they’re less precise.

Pluto, which has a 248 year orbit, is currently transiting its position during the United States’ formation, the first modern nation-state that foresaw the end of monarchical dominance in the West.

One cycle earlier was around the Protestant Revolution, which ended the supreme power of the Roman Catholic Church over the West.

The Protestant Revolution was possible due to the invention of the printing press. The American Revolution was aided by the mass distribution of newspapers and pamphlets. We are currently navigating the digital revolution.

Additionally, Neptune is approaching where it last was during the Civil War. This preceded a period of popular interest in the occult, seeing the invention of hypnosis and the rise of mystical practices like seances-- and astrology.

So that’s the two outer planets (and a beloved dwarf planet) emphasizing this moment as historic.
