Festival Safety information, please read

Please don't sit in the areas marked with white lines. These make getting around the main field easier, and are safe evacuation routes. You will be asked to move.

Don't put tents or gazebos in the main field - they block the view for audiences and stewards and block exits. You can set up camp in the family gazebo area.

No BBQs or camping stoves are permitted on site.

We have wristbands for children at The Shed and the FOCP stall. Write your phone number on your child's wristband. Lost children (and people) will be looked after at The Shed.

First Aid is by the main entrance on Franklin Road.

Report crime at the time: Call 101 or dial 999 if life is in danger or a crime is in progress.

Please don't drive to CoCoMAD as there is no parking available.

Due to the residential location, we ask you to use public transport, walk or cycle. You can lock up your bikes at your own risk at the courts. There are a small number of spaces for drivers with limited mobility. These are available on a first come first served basis. Chairs are available for those waiting at the entrance for collection and drop offs.

Get in touch, book a slot and plug in and play. It's your chance to perform! Here at CoCoAcoustica - we offer a warm and encouraging welcome to all performers.



No booking needed – just come and look up!







amazing volunteers. Last year they donated a total of 7886 hours. At the Real Living Wage that means the volunteers donated £99,370 of their time.



How is it 'FREE'?

Like everything we do in Cotteridge Park CoCoMAD is "free at the point of delivery", so no one is excluded if money is tight. But that doesn't mean it's free to put on. This year's festival is costing around £34k, much cheaper than many other festivals because almost all of the hard work is done by volunteers.

The cost of the festival is paid for by a mix of:

- Local businesses sponsoring the festival programme (see them listed in the programme and feel warm about what lovely people they are)
- The traders paying fees for their pitches
- Grants from trusts and funders (but applying to them takes lots of volunteer time)
- And donations, big and small, made on the day from everyone who can afford to

CoCoCamp, 23rd-24th August


CoCoCamp is back - did you know you can camp in the park overnight?
