Methodology and summary of findings



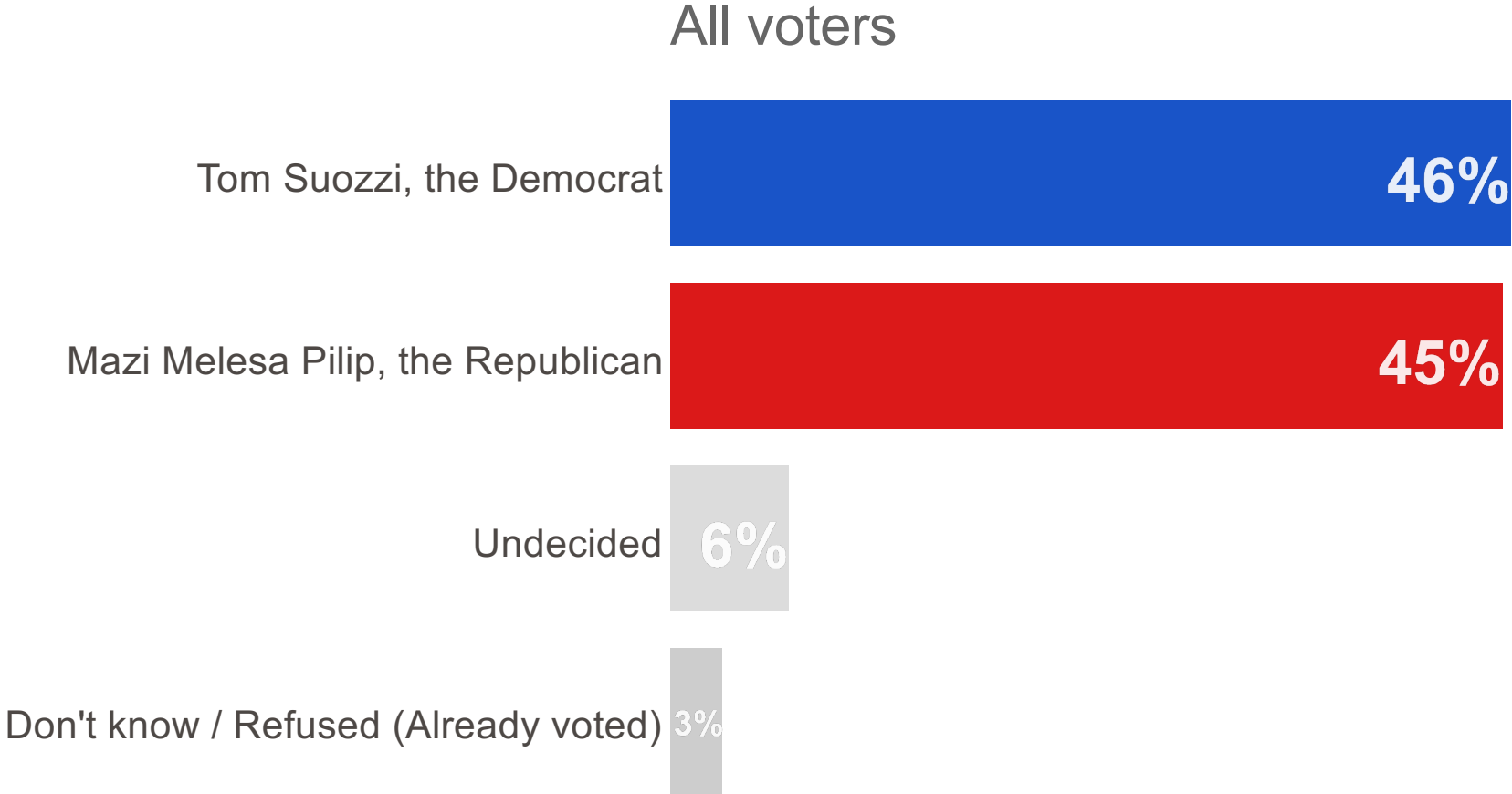
Methodology: polling

- J.L. Partners polled a representative sample of 500 special election likely voters or people who have already voted in NY-03
- Fieldwork dates of 10th–12th February 2024
- Sample drawn from a modelled universe of likely voters drawn from a state voter file, collected using mixed methods:
 - Live landline call for 125 responses (25%)
 - Live mobile call for 125 responses (25%)
 - SMS for 250 responses (50%)
- Quotas were added to ensure representative data: on gender, age, education, partisan registration, race, 2020 vote, and county
- The sample was weighted back to the population using the following variables: on gender, age, partisan registration, race, 2020 vote, and county
- 5-minute survey
- Margin of error: 4.4%

Special election: voting intention

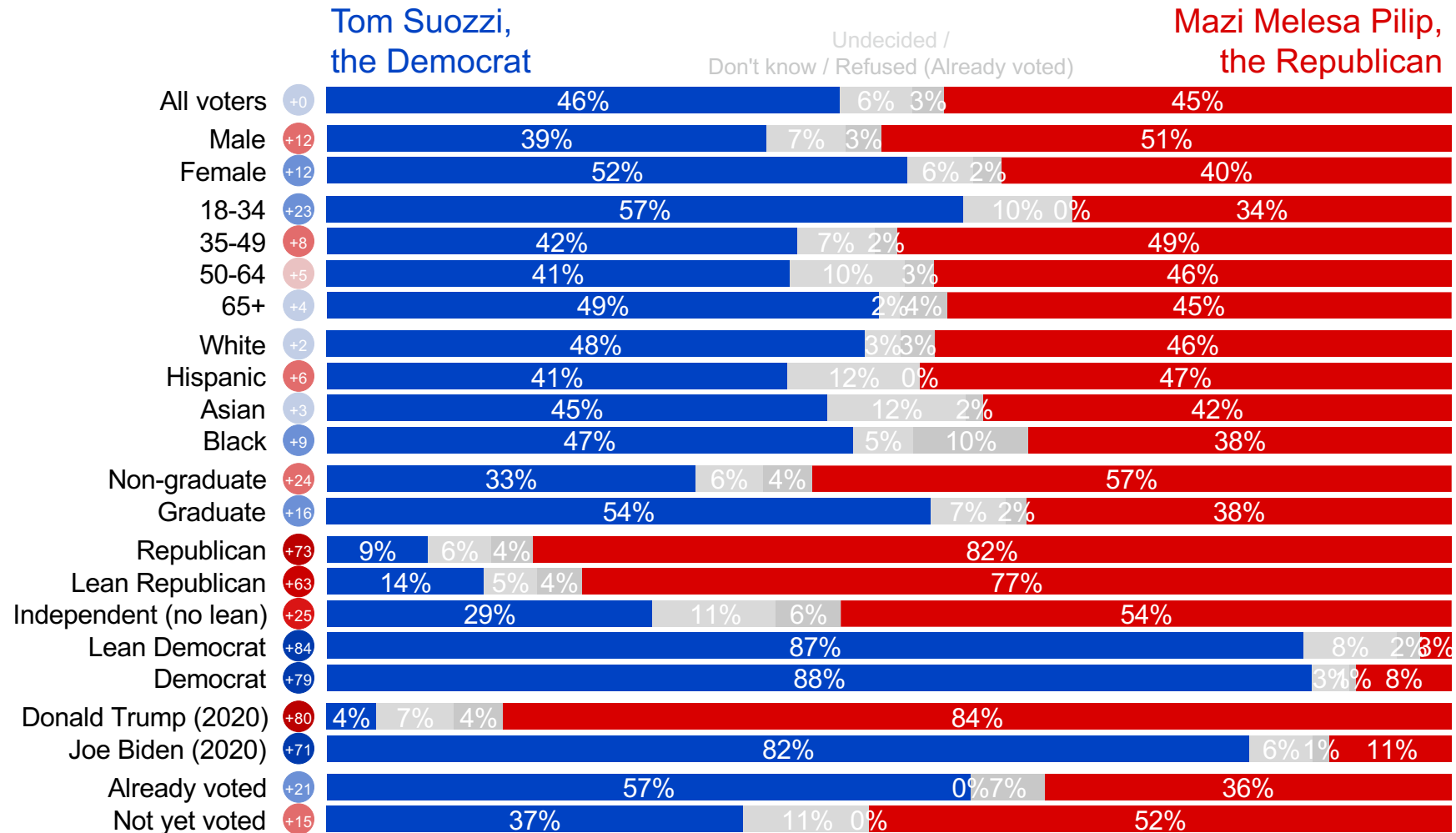


Tom Suozzi leads by 1 point with 6% undecided

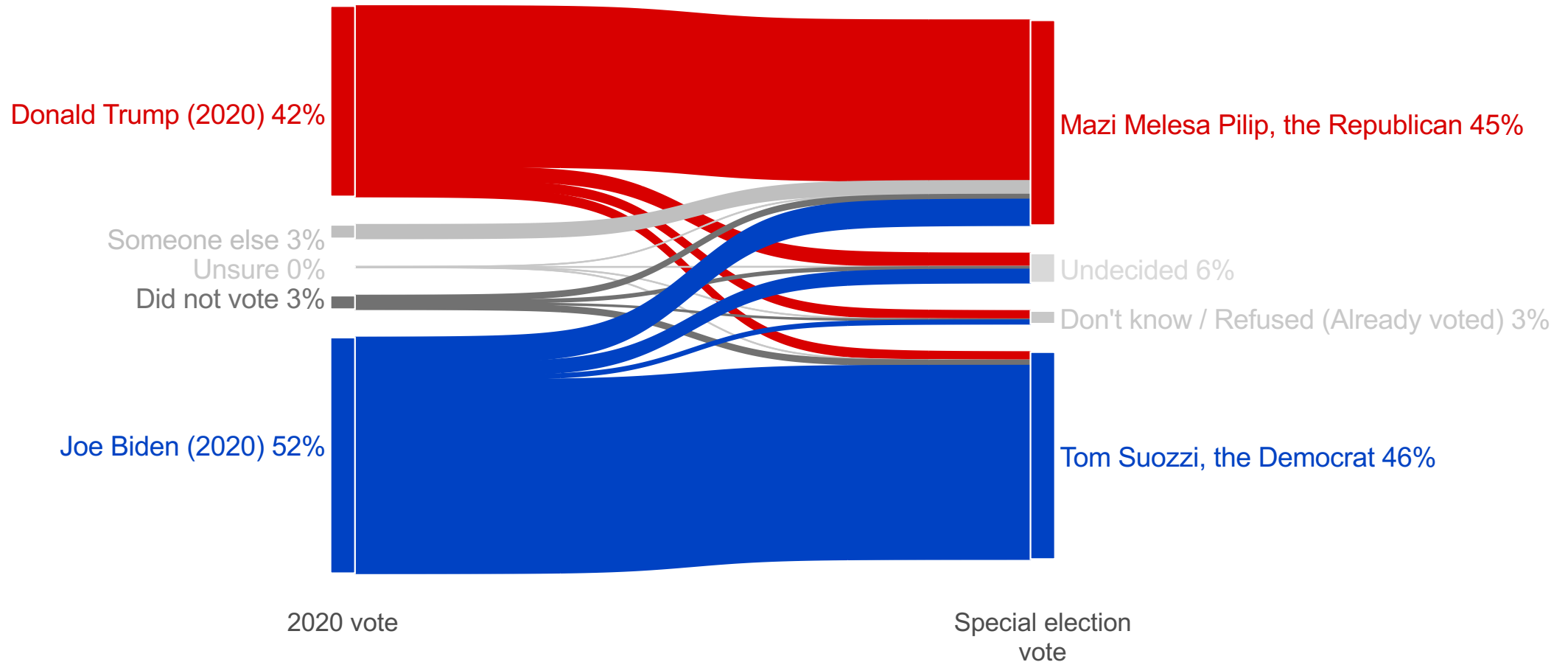


Q3a. If the Special Election for New York's 3rd Congressional District were held today, who would you vote for if the candidates were: Q3b. In the Special Election for New York's 3rd Congressional District, who did you vote for?

Suozzi leads by 21 points among early voters with Pilip up 15 among those yet to vote



Pilip is winning one in ten Biden 2020 voters

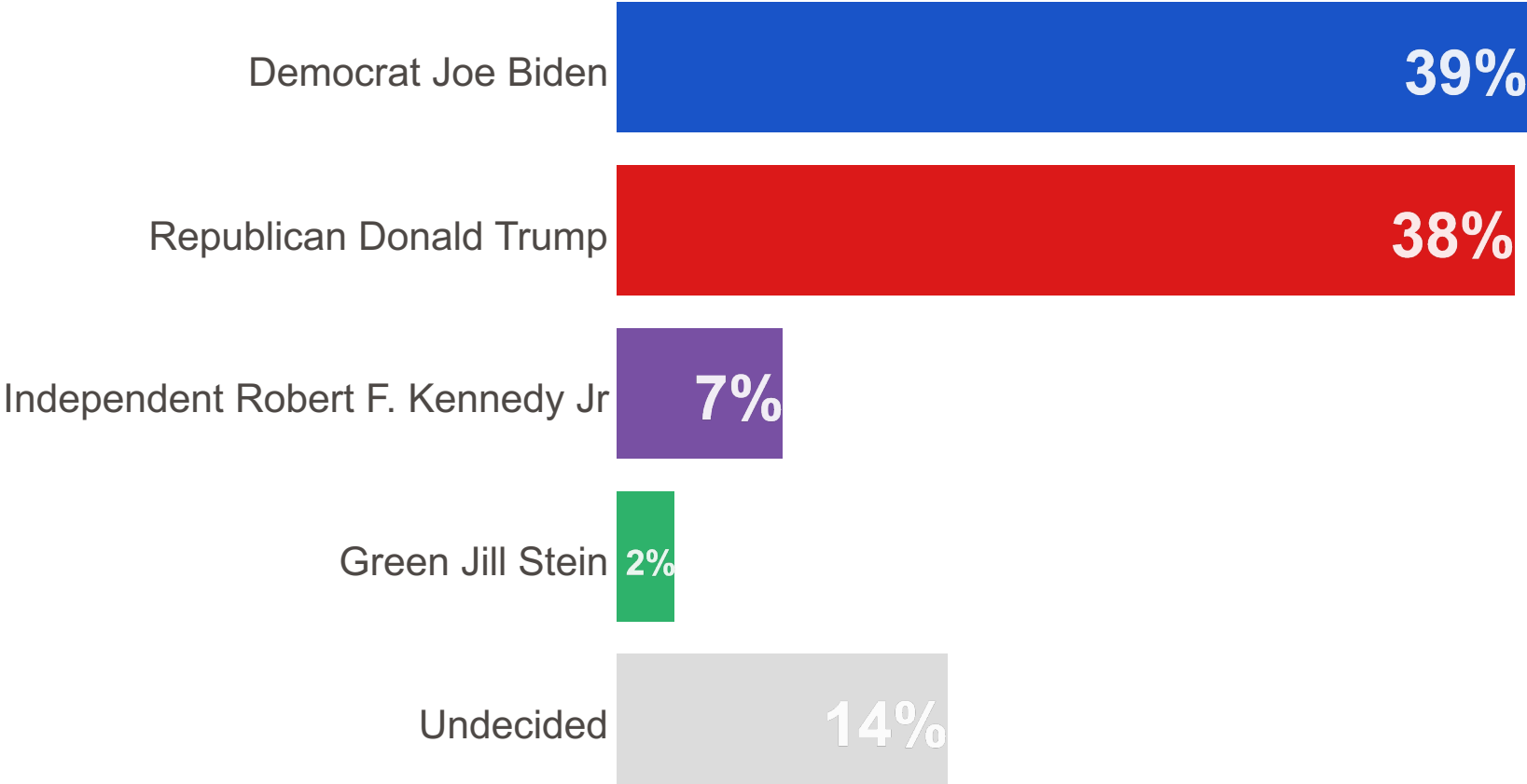


Presidential election: voting intention

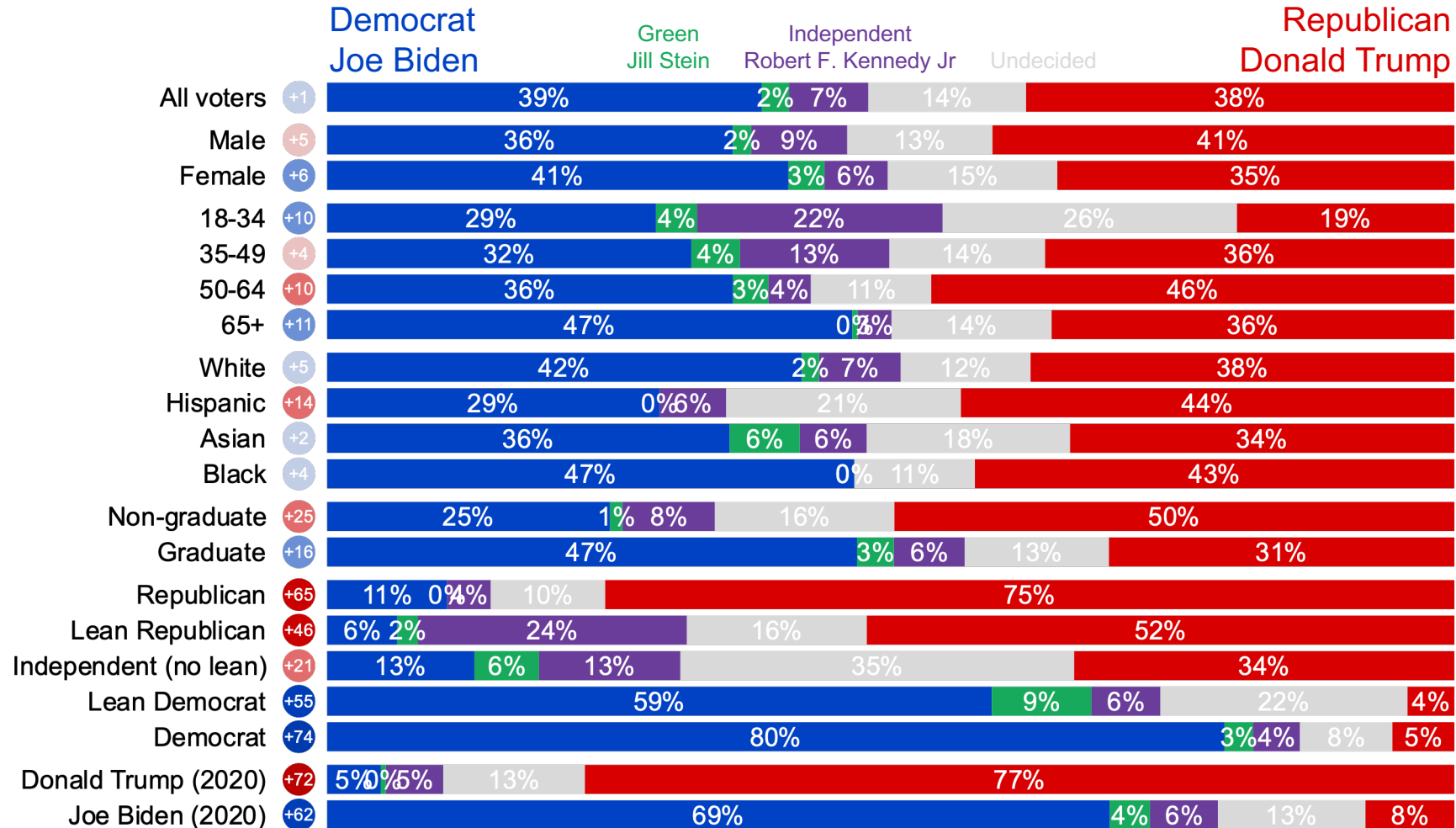


With a full field, Joe Biden leads by 1 point

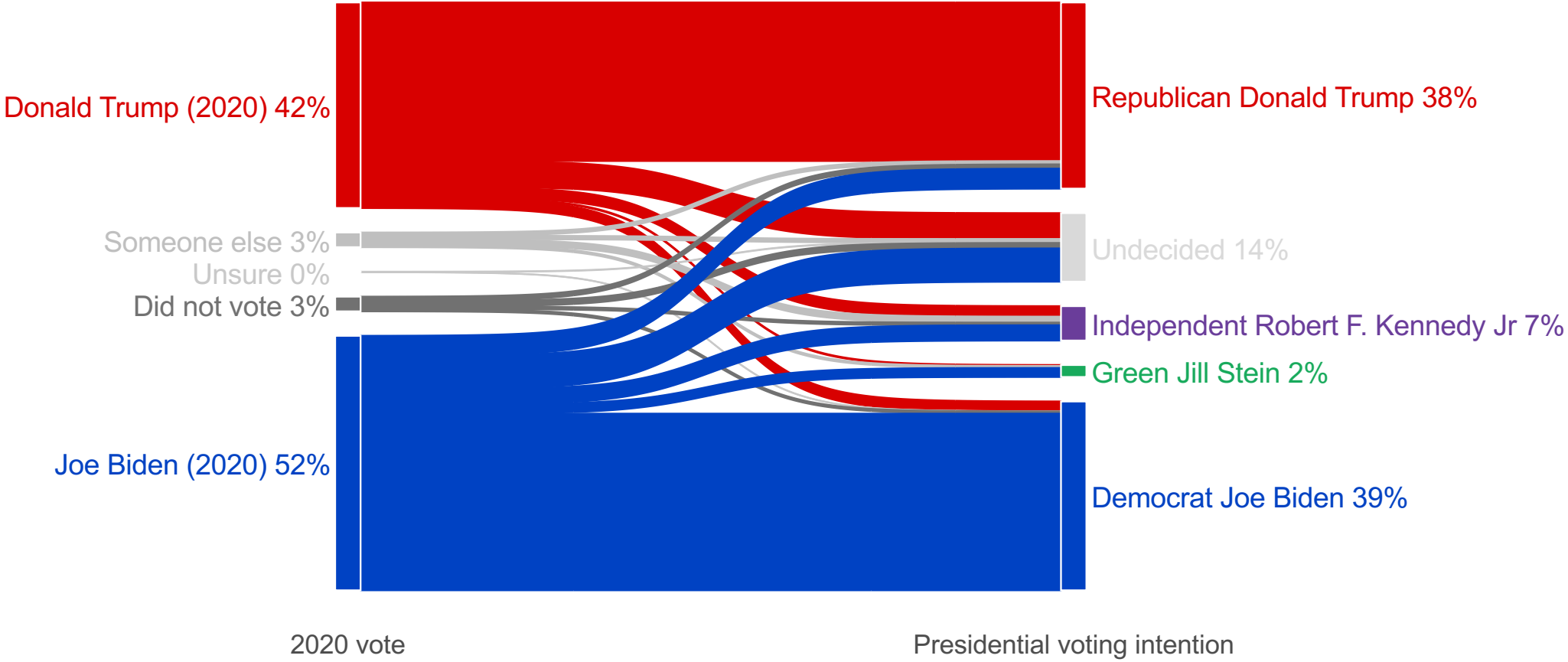
All voters



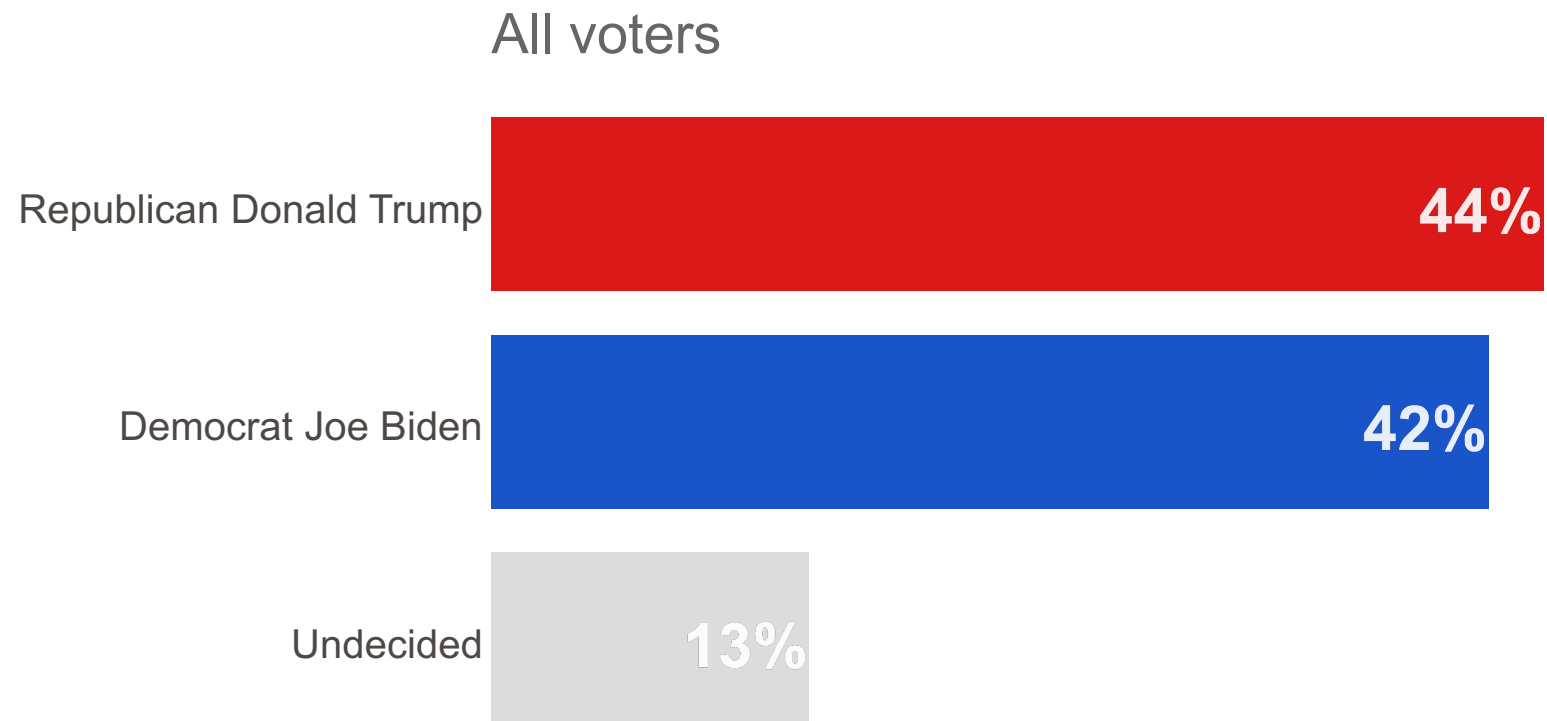
Trump leads among non-aligned independents by 21 points



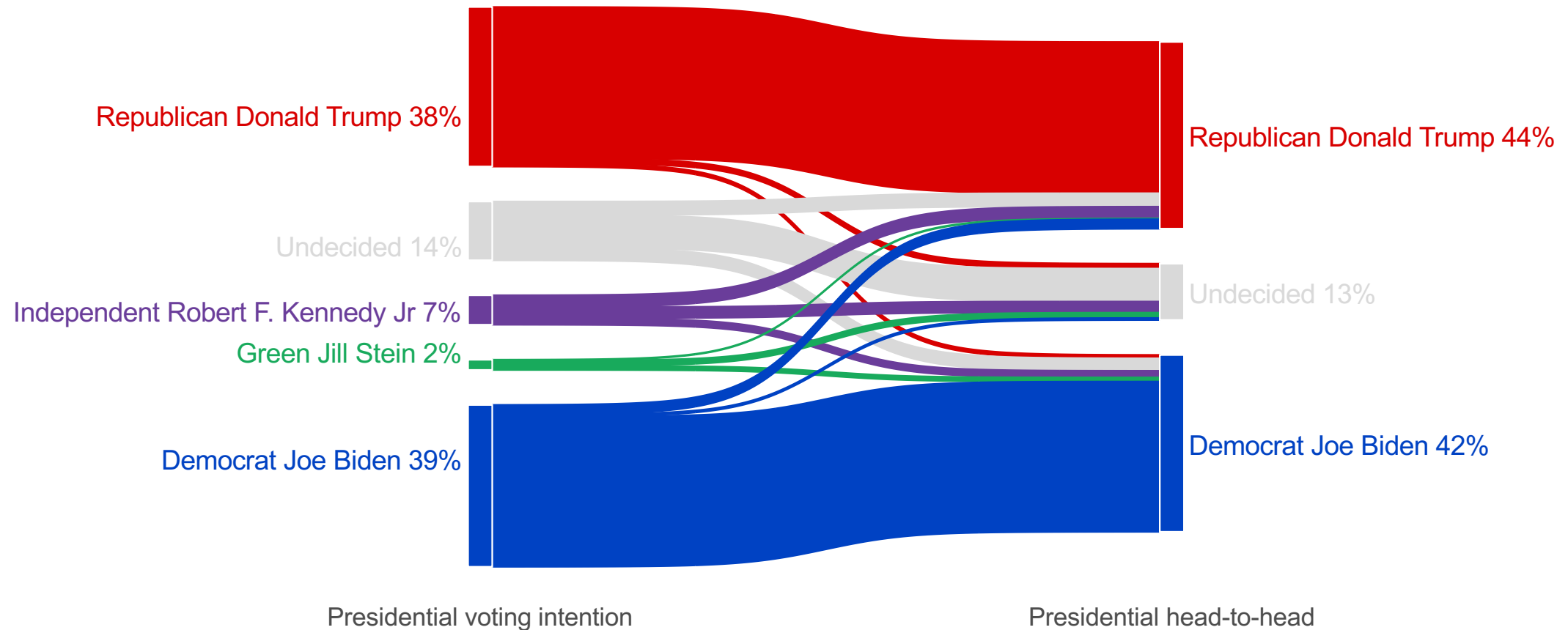
Biden is losing more voters than Trump; RFK Jr's voters in NY-03 tend to have backed Biden in 2020 (45% Biden, 30% Trump)



In a straight head-to-head, Trump leads Biden by 2 points, with 13% undecided



In a head-to-head, more RFK Jr voters are returning to Trump than Biden
