

Fall Construction Update

So much has been happening on the island since September! We thought an extra copy of the newsletter would be a welcome addition.

Our appeal in July sought funding to extend the utilities to the Adirondack area on the North Side of the island. With the generous financial support of so many, we were able to sign contracts for water and electricity to be run. This included completing the trenching to bury the electric conduit, and bringing enough sand and gravel to fill the trenches.

Volunteers continued the work on the washhouse (started in May) by rebuilding the foundational supports and enclosing the building that had been gutted. As with everything it needed more work than anticipated, but is moving along.







The project is critical to our ability to accommodate more campers and dates to continue the work are already on the calendar for mid-May 2022. The Eagle Island barge has again proven to be a real asset this season, sometimes with two runs a day bringing materials to the island and removing debris.







Fall Construction Update [cont.]

The historic grant work has continued on the Annex, Family Cabin, Covered Walkway, Boathouse 2 (part of Service Dock), Guest House (Loon Lodge), and the Woodshed/Icehouse (check the newly painted green historic tin roof).

With the materials on the island, contractor work will continue for another couple of weeks until freezing temperatures arrive and the last of the boats needs to come out of the water.

We will be ready to get an early start as soon as ice breaks in the spring!
