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

Front Page exhibition is an opening exhibition for PINKGUY Art Gallery for the year 2011. This exhibition is also the first group exhibition ever held at the gallery since it first opened its door at Marc Service Residence, Jalan Pinang, Kuala Lumpur.

I am thrilled that Suzlee Ibrahim, a well known abstract painter has allowed some of his time to curate this exhibition. Suzlee, a very experienced artist at local and international art scenes, had chosen the six artists of Front Page based on their interests, specialty and hard earned work in producing their arts.

Based on Suzlee's twenty four years experience in the art scene and eighteen years in academic field; Suzlee has made Front Page a special exhibition. Suzlee coordinated six artists of different backgrounds, styles and techniques under an umbrella to portray the future Malaysian artists.

curatorial's remark

Colours Of 'Front Page'

"Our goals can only be reached through a vehicle of a plan, in which we must fervently believe, and upon which we must vigorously act. There is no other route to success." - Pablo Picasso

Picasso clearly states that believe in plan and action would equal to success. Trusting to Picasso's words, the PINKGUY Gallery has taken the initiative to enlighten the Malaysian art scene with an exhibition by a group of six hardworking artists; en route to success. The PINKGUY Gallery worked hard through the lists of emerging artists and decided that these six artists are amongst those who would mould the future Malaysian art scene.

'Front Page' exhibits the coordination of these six artists for the first time. The artists are Mohd Faizal Md Suhif, Farid Raihan Ahmad, Mohd Farif Jalil, Noriyati Hassan, Nur Azlina Zulkafli and Sukor Romat. They all have different background, experiences and level of art education, formal and informal. However, their hard work and experiences mature in their art works and allow them to walk and stand tall together. Their dreams are one; to accomplish the highest achievement in the art scene locally and internationally. This group is chosen for their quality of artworks, seriousness and determination in work. Some of them had also involved with solo exhibitions and actively joined group exhibitions internationally such as Japan, Germany and USA.

Mohd Faizal Md Suhif uses print techniques as his medium of work. The wild life of endangered animals has been his subject matter and inspiration. Elephant, rhinoceros and alligator made interesting compositions for his woodcut whether on canvas or paper. He also uses unwanted objects such as remains of cement, wood and plywood as his print block.

Farid Raihan Ahmad translated history into his paintings. The image of Kuala Lumpur as cosmopolitan city with luxury and lime lights hid the bitterness and pain of its society. Cassette is used to portray history, which the cassette itself is an old format of recording moment. We use it again and again; as long as it works. However, many choose to betray the tool to new technology. Farid's paintings merely portray past events for today's story. We sometimes need tragedy to remind us of our roots.

Similar to Farid Raihan, **Mohd Farif Jalil** also looked at history but from a different perspective as his inspiration of work. Mohd Farif studied the Essence of Malay Old Coins as symbol and metaphors to guide him in producing his paintings. Mohd Farif explains that the images of old coins represent the symbol of power, energy, wealth, prestige and the ingenuity of humanity. He views his work from a new perspective of ART and represents the meaning of the History of Malay Old Coins not only to the Malaysian society but also to the outside world. Red is used as focal point. To ensure its antiquity he uses texture in some places in his paintings.



'Floral Rhapsody' by **Noriyati Hassan** represents the unspoken language of flowers. Noriyati adapted her works from the nature and environment show love, gratitude, bereavement, joy, prayers, happiness, comfort, hope and above all to be admired. Noriyati feels that the flowers often move the human heart and has a subtle influence on one's feelings. 'A thing of beauty is a joy forever' a saying goes but when the flower withers and dies, it's gone from sight. By painting it on canvas it allows her to appreciate the flower forever even when the real one is gone. Noriyati uses acrylic paint in various shades of bright, pastel and sometimes black and white. She paints her subject in larger than life size to give the audience an in depth feeling; when each colour merges with another or one colour dominates. The different hues represent different stages or parts of the flower and as the petals unfold it reveals a new life within.

Nur Azlina Zulkafli uses acrylic and mixed media in her works. Her abstract paintings are individually produced and manifested based on her life experiences. The paintings involved various techniques and cleverly mastered to enable the audience to appreciate her paintings based on each owns interpretation. In addition to brushes and palette knives, she also uses her hands and fingers thus giving each of her paintings different textures and mood. Nur Azlina expresses her colours based on her emotions and events of the time. Her paintings reflect a combination of a sense of harmony, romance and gracefulness evoking a vision of spiritual enlightenment to the viewer. They also portray an insight into her love, passion on daily adaptation to the hidden beauty and happiness of life. She believes that sometimes as an artist, one should paint like a child without having to worry too much and enjoy the experience as he/she is painting.

The last member of the group, **Sukor Romat** experiments circular shapes; dots that bring us back to 'pointillism' paintings by Georges Seurat and Chuck Close. Sukor's paintings play with light and colour, which also the concept he borrowed from the impressionist. He explores and captures light in contrast and fills in colour. Sukor places buildings such as KLCC and images from his surroundings in his works.

Various techniques, media and images are used by these artists, which produced a unique combination for this exhibition. The artists cleverly composed and portray skilful handling of their own material and techniques.

The PINKGUY Gallery certainly hopes that this very first group coordinated by the Gallery would initiate more group artists in the future. Placed at Marc Service Residence, Jalan Pinang, Kuala Lumpur since 2007 the PINKGUY Gallery welcome artists that share the spirit of Picasso's route to success.





Mohd Farif actively involved with exhibitions since 1999 and now a lecturer at the Faculty of Art & Design, MARA University of Technology, Shah Alam. 

Noriyati Hassan first learned painting at the Galeri Shah Alam in 2008. She immensely attended Paint Using Acrylic Class that was held weekly at the gallery. She had displayed her paintings at many exhibitions such as Art Village Open Exhibition, Bangsar (2008), Master's Mystery Art Show, Florida, Miami, USA (2008) and '2nd Contemporary Art of Malaysia Exhibition', Shanto-Mariam University of Creative Technology, Dhaka, Bangladesh (2009). 'Floral Rhapsody', This series of paintings on flowers represent my first foray into the world of nature which have been a constant interest since young. Using acrylic paint in various shades of bright, pastel and sometimes black and white, I choose to paint my subject in larger than life size. Sukor Romat was born Kuala Lumpur and now completing his Masters degree at the Faculty of Art & Design, MARA University of Technology, Shah Alam. He had his first solo exhibition at the Artvillage Gallery (2009) and actively involved in art exhibitions since 2002. He achieved his Honorable Mention Award from the NBC 1st Screen Print Biennale Japan (2007). He is also a member of the Meroon Studio, which operates at Meru, Klang. I make the dots experiment and experiences for people to look at. My artwork is basically about light and color. I borrowed from the concept of impressionism, explore and capture light in contrast and fill in colour. I tried to construct scenery of landscape and representing the Malaysian. I linked my painting to pointillism artist's work such as Georges Seurat and Chuck Close. I studied the pointillism approach, based on the science of the light spectrum and the way in which colours are perceived by the eye. I used the pure colours of the spectrum, using the variation of dots and layer coloured background. The process itself gives a chance of experimentation in setting-up my memories of joy and happiness.





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
