# LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

#### A YEAR OF NEW OPPORTUNITIES

2019 was a year of building infrastructure and expanding partnership efforts for the Housing First Minnesota Foundation. With a new name, brand, and strategic direction, Housing First Minnesota Foundation propels forward with our work of building futures through housing. With change comes new opportunities to lead with the intentions of sustaining the organization, expanding partnerships in the community, and selecting projects that will have a lasting impact of serving the housing needs of Minnesotans now and in the future.

The momentum surrounding our community build projects presented opportunities to share our partnership model with various city officials, council members, and staffers. I was impressed with local government responses toward the thought of building housing for Minnesotans who are experiencing homelessness in their communities through a land donation.

I have learned firsthand that land acquired at no cost comes with several challenges. I witnessed what builders go through when trying to develop new projects, such as environmental testing, variances, platting, and inspection requirements. Thank you to Lennar, Mega Remodel, and Cardinal Remodeling, their subcontractors, and our supporters who demonstrated their commitment to donate their time and resources to complete Foundation projects.

In May, the board of directors and staff held the first of many strategic planning sessions. These convenings provided valuable opportunities to 1) Identify the organization's strengths and challenges, 2) Review our mission, vision, and core competencies, and 3) Discuss our project selection processes and methods to elevate the profile of the Foundation. As a result, the board of directors approved a new plan, identity, and procedures—setting the Foundation's direction for the next three years and beyond. It has been a privilege to serve as president and work with such talented and passionate leaders, partners, and staff. Thank you to the board and committee members for their tireless work toward our goal to eradicate homelessness in Minnesota. Thank you, Donnie and Shelly for keeping the Foundation on point in 2019 and Housing First Minnesota staff for their help and support. We appreciate City of Bloomington Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) for donating land used to construct housing for veterans. I will end with a special thanks to Housing First Minnesota members for supporting our industry foundation.

# HOUSING FOR HEROES: BLOOMINGTON

Our Foundation secured land from the City of Bloomington HRA to construct a new home for veterans experiencing homelessness and to provide them with a dignified place to live. The Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans (MACV) will own a new 4-bedroom residence, provide veterans with case management services, and work with them to regain confidence and self-sufficiency. Lennar leveraged relationships with their trade partners to construct the house within 100 days.

# FAMILY RECOVERY HOUSING

Our Foundation partnered with Avivo to renovate a basement apartment that was once used for storage and in dire need of repair. The 1-bedroom unit was turned into a 2-bedroom apartment with a new floor plan to include bathroom, kitchen, cabinetry, lighting, flooring, trim, and paint. The new space increased Avivo's capacity to serve more mothers and children. We hope the new space now serves as an environment where mothers can heal and nurture their children.
