

Professor Nik Zeps



Professor Nik Zeps is the current Director of Research at Northern Health and Director of Operations at the Prostate Cancer Outcomes Registry.

He was previously the Group Director of Research for Epworth HealthCare. Prior to that he was the Director of Research at St John of God HealthCare from 2012 to 2016 and head of their translational cancer research program since 2008.

He is an Adjunct Professor at the Eastern Clinical School of Monash University, in the School of Health Sciences at Curtin University and the Centre for Comparative Genomics at Murdoch University. He was a member of the Australian Health Ethics Committee from 2006-2012 and the Research Committee of the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) of Australia from 2009-2015. He is a board member and the chair of the Cancer Biology Group of the Clinical Oncology Society of Australia (COSA) and a member of the Scientific Advisory Committee of the Australasian Gastrointestinal Trials Group (AGITG). He is chair of the Primary Care Collaborative Cancer Trials Group (PC4) Advisory committee and a member of the PC4 Scientific committee. His was a founding director and board member of the Australian Clinical Trials Alliance (ACTA).

He is the Australian representative on the Ethics and Policy Committee of the International Cancer Genome Consortium (ICGC) and was recently appointed Co-Chair of the Communication Committee of the ICGC-Precision Medicine initiative.

Gavin Fox-Smith is a Board Member of Bowel Cancer Australia.

Over his 35 year career Gavin has been a leader and champion of Medical Technology in Australia/NZ and Asia. He has also played lead roles in Industry Bodies, Innovation Initiatives and Not for Profit Boards. Gavin is strong advocate for Gender Equality and Indigenous Engagement.

Professor Frank Frizelle



Prof Frizelle is current chair of the Governance Committee of the Prostate Cancer Outcomes Registry. He is Clinical Director of General Surgery at Te Whatu Ora Canterbury and the West Coast, and is Professor of Surgery at the University of Otago, Christchurch, and Editor in Chief of the New Zealand Medical Journal. He works in the public and private sector as a colorectal surgeon.

He trained in general surgery in New Zealand before undertaking post fellowship training in colorectal surgery at the Mayo Clinic, and Scotland. He returned to New Zealand in 1996 as senior lecturer in surgery at the University of Otago, Christchurch, before being appointed Professor of Colorectal Surgery in 2000, and became Head of the Academic Department of Surgery in January 2006. Frank relinquished this role in 2019 after 13 years as HOD and became Clinical Director of General Surgery for Canterbury and the West Coast in 2021

He has been Editor in Chief of the New Zealand Medical Journal since 2002. Frank has published over 500 publications in peer reviewed journals and given more than 300 presentations at national and international meetings.

Frank has been made an Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit, and been awarded honorary fellowships from the New Zealand Association, the Royal College of Surgeons of Ireland, the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and the American Surgical Association.


