

LEADERS ARE READERS

Planting People Growing Justice Leadership Institute partnered with D.E.L.O.R.E.S. Works and the Links, Inc., Minneapolis/Saint Paul Chapter, for a Leaders are Readers program to promote literacy and diversity in books.

In just one day, we donated 414 books and 380 Build-A-Bear® toys to children in Saint Paul Public Schools.

Full Circle Publishing, Build-a-Bear Foundation, and Sheletta Brundidge, joined us in working to end Minnesota's reading crisis by investing in the lives of our children.

This is one way in which the PPGJLI is working to address Minnesota's literacy gap.

As of this year, Justice Makes a Difference:
The Story of Miss
Freedom Fighter,
Esquire has traveled to 9 countries and 36
States in the U.S. to inspire youth.

Literacy levels across the U.S. have dropped significantly over the years. One in 4 children have never learned to read and students that haven't learned to read by the 4th grade are four times more likely to drop out of school.


One of the most effective ways to encourage literacy is through books that enable youth to see themselves represented in the pages and it's a goal to which PPGJLI is committed.

61% percent of low-income families have no books at all in their homes for their children.



Our goals for young scholars are to inspire them to lead and advance social change.


We start by asking them "What is in their hands to make a difference in the world?"


Of the 27 countries in Africa where data was available, Ghana ranked 11th in literacy as of 2018.








MINNESOTA TWINS PROMOTES READING





