

**ECONOMIC BENEFIT SUMMARY** 



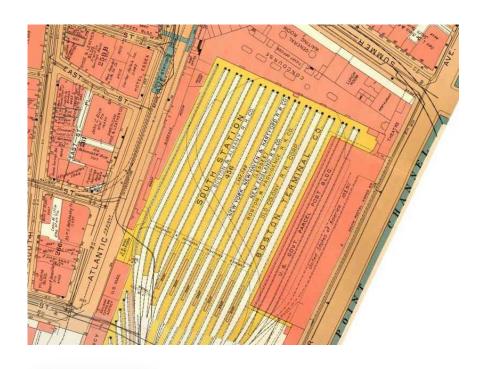
- Creates approximately 6,600 direct construction jobs and \$413,100,000 in wages from salaries to construction workers;
- Results in approximately 5,300 permanent jobs, of which 1,300 are direct new permanent jobs resulting in approximately \$98,700,000 in wages and salaries annually;
- Generates approximately \$26,000,000 in estimated property taxes annually;
- Provides additional recurring income to the MBTA (bus gate fee and retail revenue);
- Provides contributions to off-site affordable housing and provides onsite affordable housing;
- Contributes to the Neighborhood Housing Trust and Neighborhood Jobs Trust;
- Additional sales and wage tax revenues.

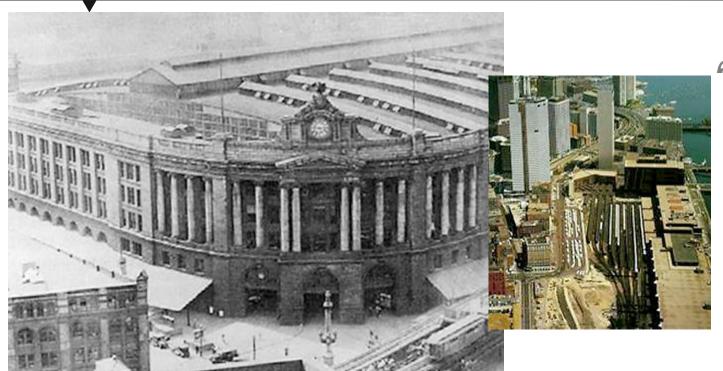
- Convert the value of the air rights above South Station into significant, privately-funded transportation infrastructure improvements;
- Facilitate and reduce the MBTA's cost of the South Station Expansion Project;
- Increase bus terminal capacity by 50%;
- More convenient and comfortable intermodal connections;
- Increase train station platform circulation reducing congestion;
- An architecturally significant public space at the train station concourse that enhances the image of South Station as a gateway to the city;
- A weather-protected environment for all patrons of South Station;
- Lighting, fire and life safety and security enhancements in rail yard and platform areas;
- Provide wayfinding, access and safety enhancements for transit patrons with disabilities

SOUTH STATION OWNERSHIP HISTORY



1961 The New Haven Railroad, the owner of South Station, files for bankruptcy 1965 The Boston Redevelopment Authority (BRA) acquires South Station The BRA sells South Station to the 1979 MBTA, retaining ownership of the air rights above for a private development project 2019 The BRA sells the air rights to a private development entity which will fund and manage the construction of the improvements to the transportation center and develop the air rights

THE EVOLUTION OF SOUTH STATION



When completed, the South Station Transportation Center will be one of the most successful and talked about transportation developments in the nation and will serve as a model for other intermodal facilities.

1980: ORIGINAL BRA/MBTA/FRA REDEVELOPMENT PLAN





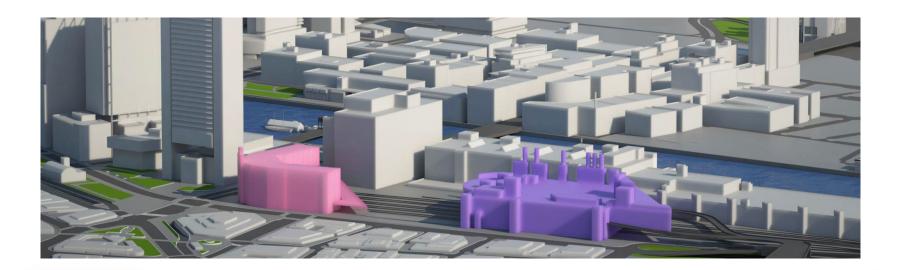

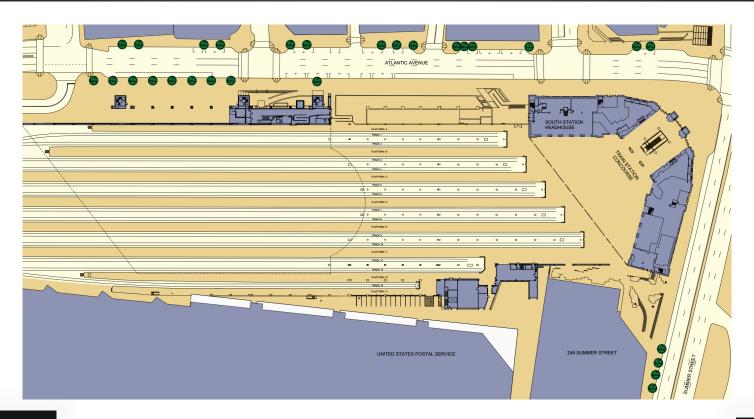


1995: BUS TERMINAL AND PARKING DEVELOPMENT

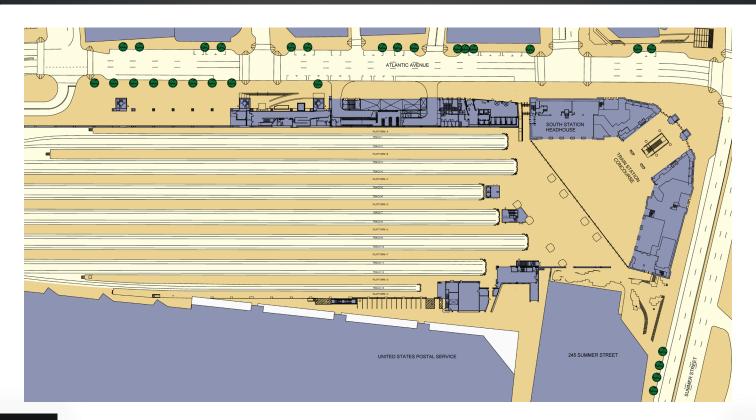

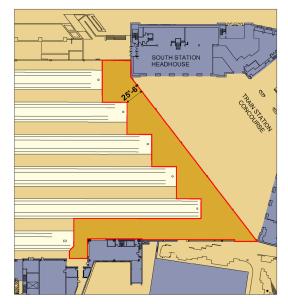
#### EXISTING PLATFORM LEVEL PLAN



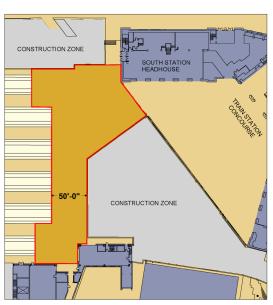
FUTURE PLATFORM LEVEL PLAN



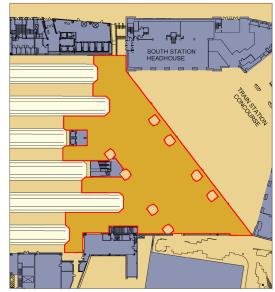
### PLATFORM CIRCULATION SPACE



Existing Platform Area: 18,440 sf

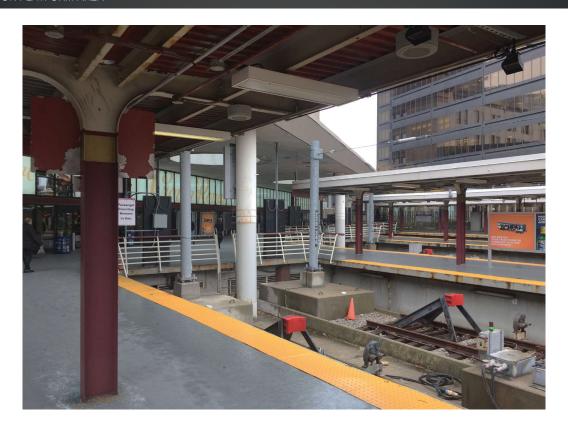


Temporary Platform Area: 22,580 sf (+22%)

Area: 30,710 sf (+67%)

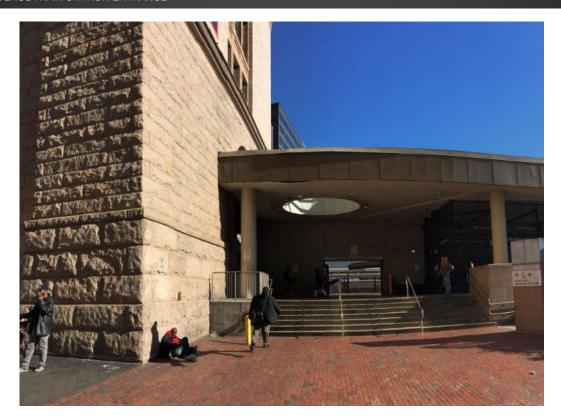
EXISTING TRAIN STATION PLATFORM AREA



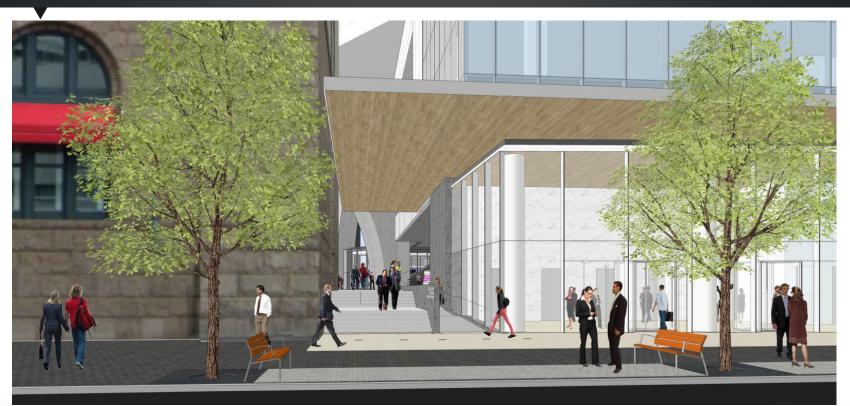
FUTURE TRAIN STATION PLATFORM AREA



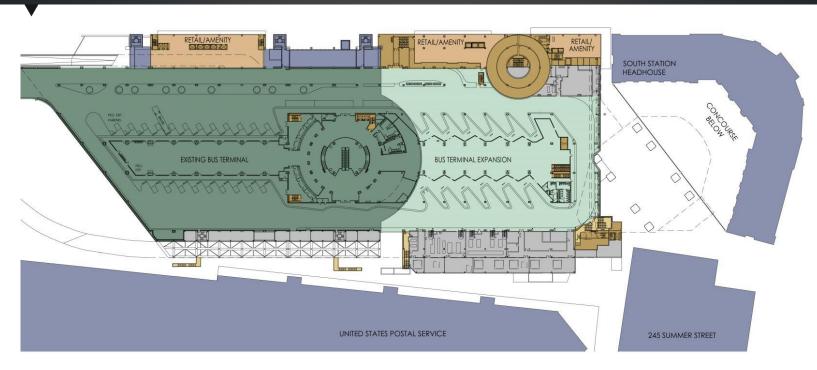
EXISTING ATLANTIC AVENUE TRAIN STATION ENTRANCE

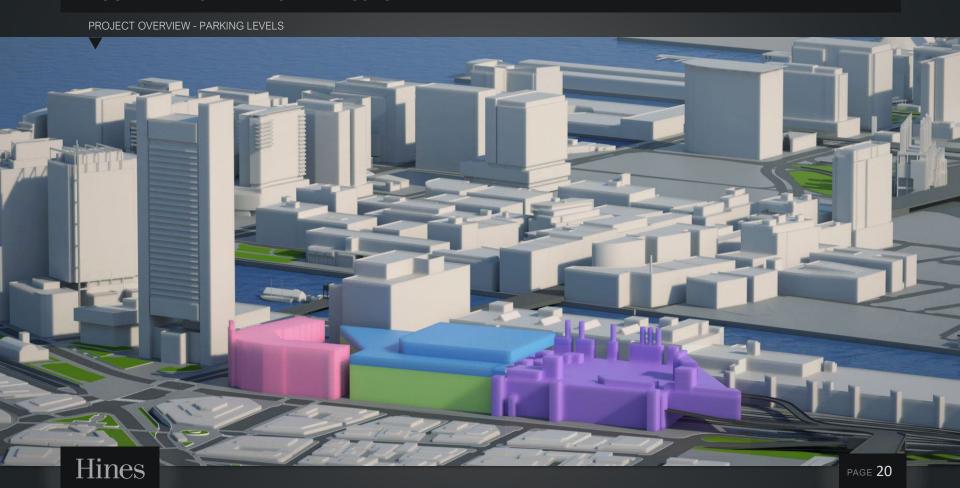

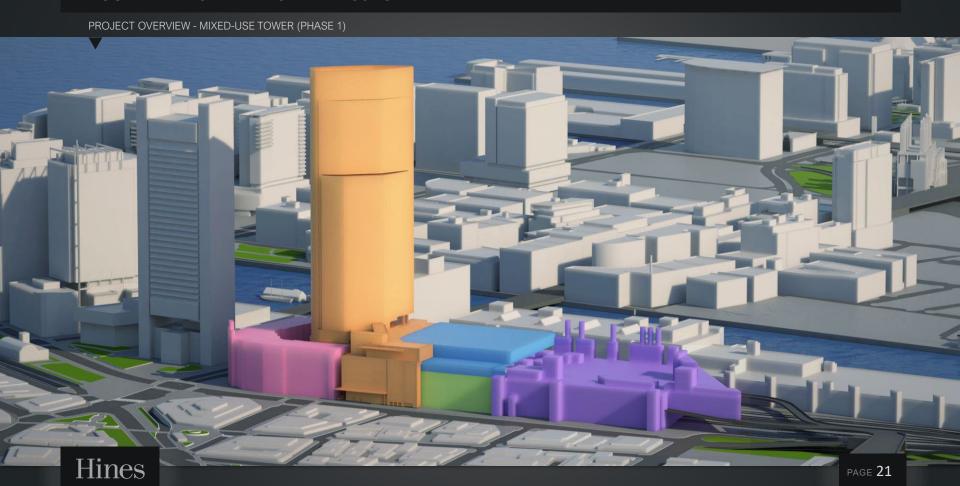
NEW BUS TERMINAL CONCOURSE AREA

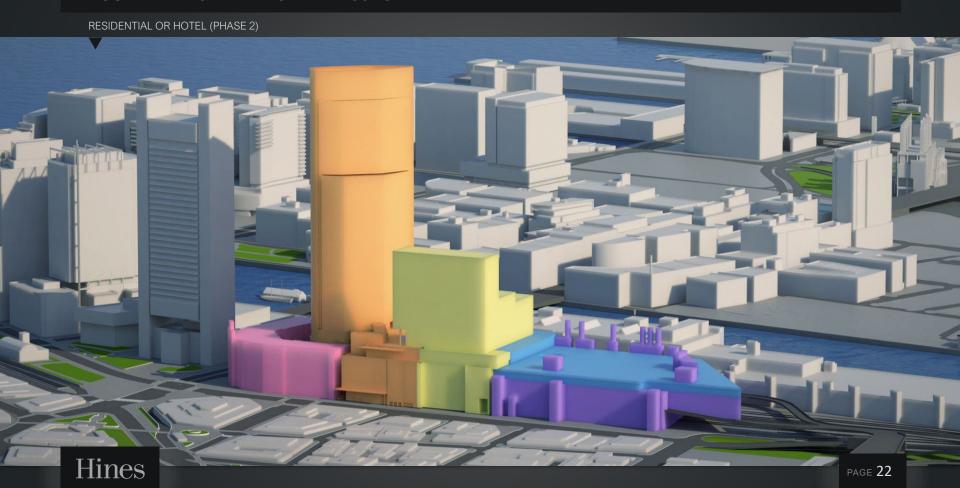

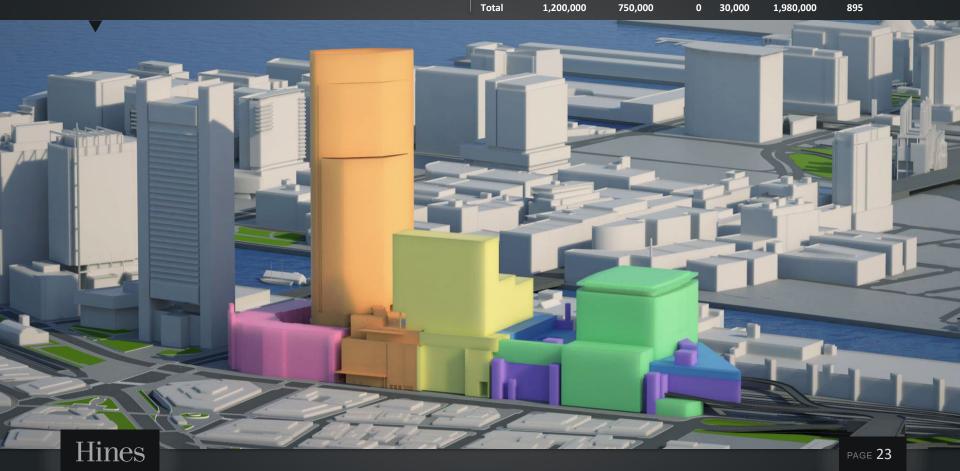

#### PROJECT TIMELINE



- January 2020: Begin creation of construction access and staging areas on Atlantic Avenue, Summer Street and adjacent to Track 13
- February 2020 July 2020: Track and platform modifications (work done at night); retail kiosk relocations; complete construction access and staging areas
- July 2020: New Commuter Rail and Amtrak passenger routing in place around tower construction zone
- July 2020 January 2021: The structure supporting the bus terminal expansion is constructed at night
- July 2022: Expanded bus terminal opens
- June 2024: Train station improvements and access to expanded bus terminal from train station platforms complete; mixed-use tower opens

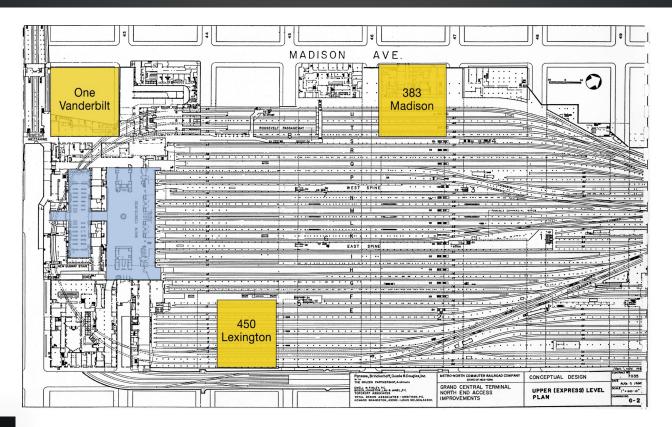




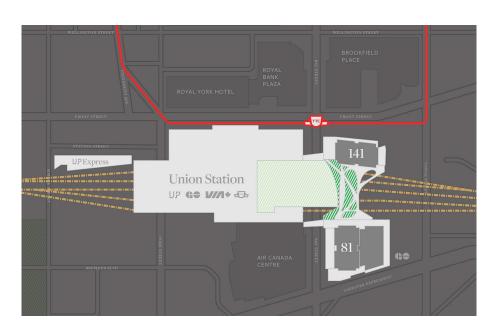
