

CONTEXT

Decarbonisation, net-zero or carbon neutrality - numerous concepts describe business efforts to reduce emissions in support of the Paris Agreement's target to achieve carbon neutral by 2050.

In their "decarbonisation journey" companies face different challenges:

- 1) For many businesses **the majority of emissions are so-called** <u>Scope 3 emissions</u>, **indirect emissions** that are located in an organisation's value chains chain.
- 2) **Increasing requirements and expectations** for businesses to reduce emissions and a broad landscape of initiatives and approaches to meet these.
- 3) **Different maturities** along supply chains and the need for new solutions
- 4) Global supply chains spanning different actors and industries

The purpose of this atelier is:

- 1) Connect key stakeholders and nurture closer interaction across industries
- 2) Take stock of the status quo, discuss challenges & potential solutions
- 3) Share experiences and best practices, success stories and learnings

Through this Atelier the participating companies will be able to analyse the management of Scope 3 emissions and get exposed to innovative approaches to supplier engagement on decarbonization.

ABOUT THE EVENT

The atelier is a series of connected workshops, with three sessions planned for 2022.

Session 1 - Businesses' supplier engagement, 24 May 2022, virtual workshop (Zoom)

Insights into the supplier perspective on supply chain engagement on decarbonisation. Tour de table with members and their suppliers to map an ideal collaboration picture, status quo including success/failure factors for each aspect of the decarbonisation practices.

Participants: CSR E members, external keynote speaker representing the supplier view on decarbonizing the supply chain

Session 2 - Sector engagement, 13 Sept 2022, in-person workshop in Brussels

Analyzing the role of sector associations for the engagement with suppliers on climate, learnings and areas to be strengthened.

Session 3 - Cross-sector engagement, 24 November 2022, virtual workshop (Zoom)

Analysis of cross-sector sector associations' activities on climate, learnings and areas to be strengthened. Focus on how companies work with initiatives like CDP, SBTi across sectors.

Key learning points:

- Clarify expectations towards decarbonisation engagement and collaboration
- Strengthen members' engagement with key stakeholders on climate, including suppliers, sector and cross-sector initiatives.
- Identify challenges for value chain engagement and collect ideas on how to make collaborative activities on climate impactful.

Who should join:

- Procurement, sustainability/CSR, climate business experts and supplier representatives that engage with the participating members on GHG management/decarbonisation.
- Company practitioners that want to develop a deeper understanding and skills related to climate protection, especially through exchange with peers
- Company practitioners that seek to engage in cross-sector initiatives and look for collaborative solutions
