- **Refugee Population in Germany:**
40,000 (from Afghanistan)
- **Languages:** Hazaragi (main)
German (secondary)
- **Main Religion:** Islam



The Hazaras of central Afghanistan have undergone much persecution, especially over the last 200 years. Thousands of Hazaras have been massacred during Pashtun Taliban invasions. In addition, Christians have faced torture and even death, if they have not renounced their faith in Christ. This has led to a mass exodus from the country. Currently, Germany is host to the largest Hazara diaspora population in Europe.

Team members of All Nations working in Germany have been reaching out to some of the Hazara refugees. In addition to assisting some with their court cases and visa processes, they are discipling five young Hazara men who are a part of All Nations' Persian church, led by A*. These men are currently undergoing Germany's rigorous integration process which requires German language study and a job training internship. All Nations' team members desire to build good relationships with the Hazaras, sharing Christ's love in community together.

PRAYER POINTS

All Nations' team members working in Germany – Please pray for:

- wisdom to know how to encourage and strengthen Hazara refugees during this time of isolation during the COVID pandemic.
- supernatural help with language and communication barriers (as German is a secondary language for many).
- access to more Hazaras in the city.
- divine opportunities to meet and know leaders among the Hazara community.

Hazara refugees in Germany – Please pray for:

- a sense of belonging and oneness beyond small groups of friends
- ethnic healing (struggles with feeling forgotten, often being categorized as Persian).
- perseverance to complete tests and other pre-requisites to advance life in Germany.
- provisions, especially financial and vocational, (so their families can join them).
- housing (beyond the camps).
- cultural integration and understanding of Germany's systems and bureaucracy.
- an encounter with Jesus and to better understand who He is.
- security from being sent back to Afghanistan (would relieve much stress and anxiety).
