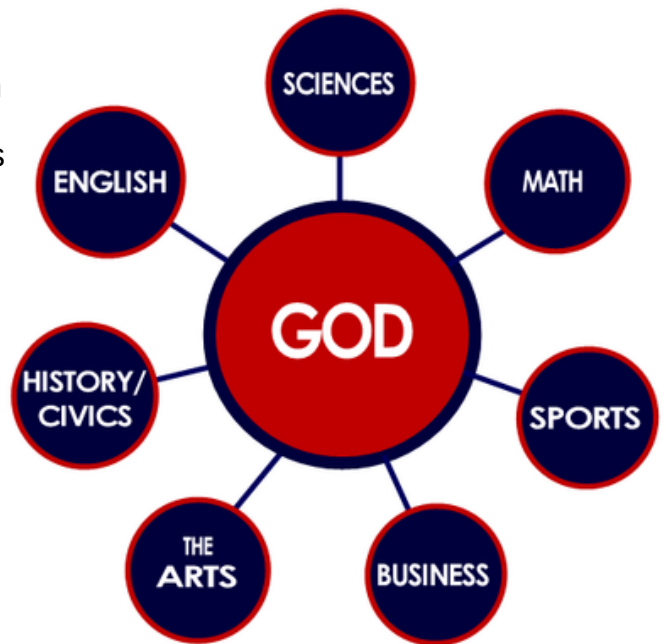
PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION

Paul challenged the church of Colossae with the following words...

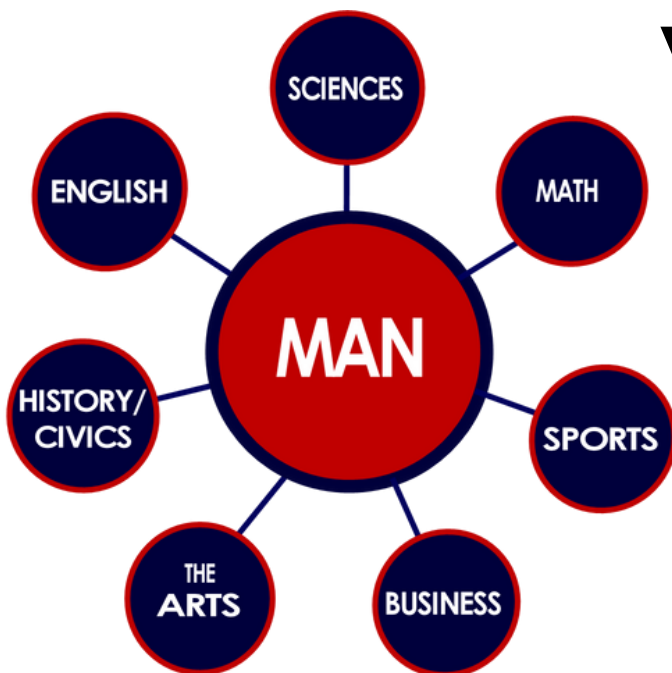
"See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy based on the principles of this world rather than on Christ." Colossians 2:8

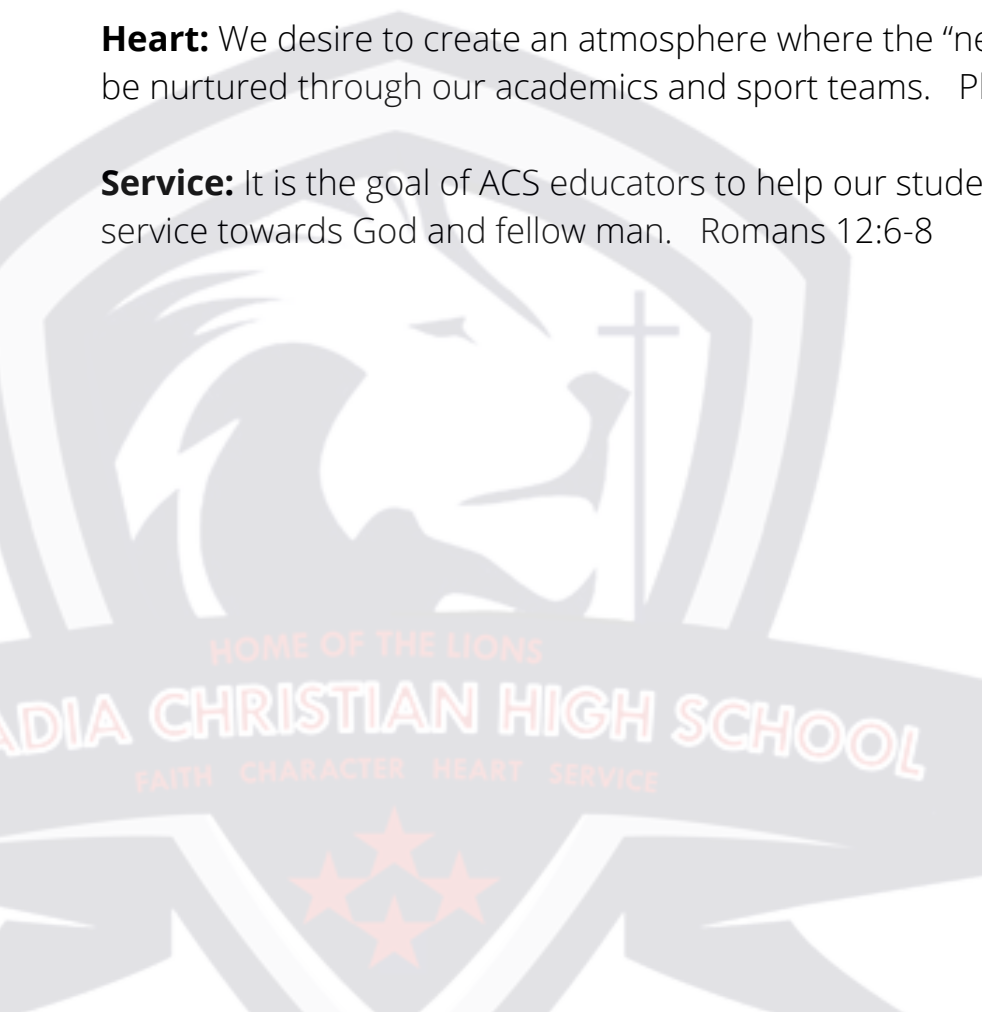
It is our goal as Christian Educators of ACS to live up to our four values:

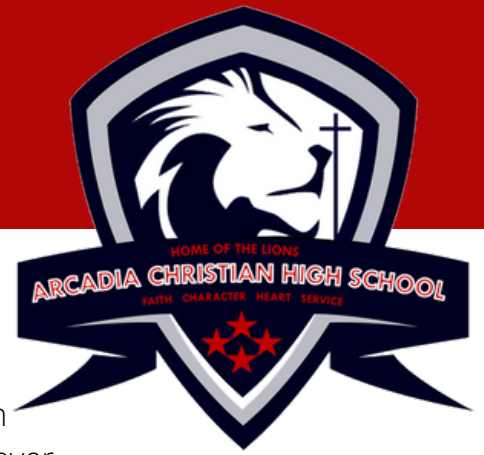

1. Come Visit Our Campus

ACS has many different tour experiences, each designed to give you and your student a window into our community.

Shadow Visit: A prospective student may wish to shadow one of our students to get a first-hand view of campus life. Shadowing is available from 8:00am to 11:50pm on Monday through Friday with a 72-hour notice, excluding special-schedule days. Please contact Front Desk, Chris Kolb-Nelson, 626.574.8229. Shadow visits are available for an individual student. If you wish to schedule a visit for a group of students, please contact to arrange a tour. Shadowing is not available from the second week of May until the end of August, after the first week of December, and the first two weeks of January.

2. Submit Your Application & Documents

Applications are completed online. Create a Student Information System (SIS) profile and submit the student application via our website:

3. Click "Apply"
4. Fill out

Each application will have required supplemental documents, listed and linked within the online application. Both the online application and its supplemental documents must be turned in to complete this step of submitting an application. There is a one-time \$125 non-refundable application fee. Preschool applications are accepted year-round. If you wish to enroll your preschool child, please contact ACS Lion Cubs Director Cherry Gan at 626.574.0805 or email cgan@acslions to confirm space availability. When ready, please contact Mrs. Gan and she will provide you with an enrollment packet.

3. Administrative Interview

Upon receipt and review of the completed application and required supplemental documents, ACS will contact you to schedule an interview. School interviews are conducted with the family and campus administrator. Secondary interviews are typically conducted as a one-on-one with the applicant and the campus administrator.

4. Decision Letter & Registration

At the time of acceptance, you will be invited to proceed with the enrollment process. This will include:
