## ReCap ASáp: regaining capacity in a changing Sápmi

Another period in the ReCap ASáp project is done, and despite the summer holidays taking place, we have kept busy! There is just over one year left of the project, and during this period some of the large deliverables have been completed.

The project team has met twice in the period. They met in Guovdageaidnu May 20-22, where the final preparations for Lávdan Sámi Arena was the priority. In Romsa August 6-7, the team kicked off after the summer, and started preparing for what's happening in the coming autumn and winter.

Suoma Sámiid Guovddášsearvi held their annual meeting, May 9-10 in Gáregasnjárga. At the meeting the Badje-Deanu Sámit Association, located in Karigasniemi, was accepted as a new member organisation which means SSG now has 8 member organisations. The ReCap ASáp project is excited to see that SSG is crowing! The meeting also elected a new board for 2025-2027, and Aslak Holmberg continues as chair.

The annual meeting included a workshop on the democratic participation of the Sámi people in green transition projects, held by the SápmiDem project, and a luohtegeavli joik evening held by Niillas Holmberg, with the aim of bringing joik closer to everyday life.

In a continued effort to further strengthen the relationship with the Sámi organisations, Åsa Larsson Blind from the project team attended Riksorganisationen Same Ätnams annual meeting in Giron, May 9-10. This was also a celebration of their 80 year anniversary - making it one of the oldest Sámi organisations still operating!

The Leadership Network met for the 3rd time, this time in Anár, August 18-20.

There were great collaborations with other organisations and institutions, which created a programme with something for everyone. In this period they also participated in conferences such as the Nordic Culture Forum 2025, and in the EU Arctic Forum, Indigenous Peoples' Dialogue and Arctic Youth Dialogue. Their active participation in conferences, in panels and such, truly shows that they are stepping up to their roles as advocates for Sápmi. This will not be the last we see of them!
