Conditions of Tours (Wheatbelt to Great Southern Wilderness Escape Tour)

These tours are privately organised tours open to members of the public but subject to the following conditions:

- a) The tours will include 9 days and 8 nights away and many different locations will be visited from Wave Rock to Katanning via Wheatbelt towns and Albany and return
- b) For the comfort of individual guests we must ensure that there is a restriction with respect to the height and weight of guests and these are approximately 95kgs and 6'2"
- c) The tours are non-smoking for the betterment of the other guests
- d) Personal hand luggage is restricted to 15kgs weight with the exception of personal equipment such as photographic gear and a personal day bag (see note e below)
- e) The baggage restrictions above will not include any medication that must be used for the good health and wellbeing of the guest. Medication to prevent allergies must be taken on the trip. A small personal "day bag" along with a water bottle should be taken
- f) Breakfast start times are between the hours of 7.30-8.00am and lights out in the evenings at 10.00pm and special dietary requirements must be clearly stated at the time of booking
- g) A brief induction will occur prior to departure which will also include an "acknowledgement to country" and any special medical conditions noted
- h) Toilet stops will occur at frequent locations whilst travelling between destinations
- i) We have a mobile phone protocol that means urgent calls can be taken as required however non-urgent calls can be attended to when regular stops are taken and must be taken respecting the privacy of the other guests
- j) A reasonable level of fitness is required as there is some walking required with visitation to numerous locations including climbing up major rocks eg Wave Rock and the Humps etc.
- k) Free time is available on some days and particularly when travelling the 2,000kms
- l) Guests will be accompanied by the tour guides on most occasions as the safety and security of guests is of paramount importance
- m) Technical training sessions for guests are available throughout designated times on tour – most days will be provided with educational and learning experiences eg birdlife, geology formations, mining history
- n) People should wear the appropriate clothing and footwear:
 - Preferably steel capped shoes or walking boots
 - Sunscreen and hat for protection from sunburn
 - Protective sunglasses
 - Good casual clothes for commemorative dinners are required otherwise casual travel attire
- o) Costs are all inclusive and cover all visits, morning and afternoon teas, breakfast, lunches and evening meals.
- p) Alcoholic beverages are provided with some evening meals and the afternoon "sundowner" only (you may wish to bring additional drinks)

- q) Binoculars, maps, bird and wildflower references are useful
- r) Travel speeds are restricted to 100kms on bitumen and 90kms on gravel (driving to the conditions noted)
- s) Pick up in Perth at 8.30am outside the WA Visitor Centre or a nominated location
- t) We have adopted a cancellation policy whereby 30 days notice must be provided for a full refund, 50% refund on 15 days notice and no refund with less than 7 days notice. A deposit of 20% must be made at the time of booking to secure your place on the tour with the remainder due within 30 days otherwise your place may not be available
- u) Whilst all risks are mitigated all personal risks associated with the trip are the responsibility of the guest
