'4TH of July'

Produces an abundance of tangy-sweet, 4-ounce red fruits, extremely early. Grows to a height of 4' or taller, relatively compact, good for patio pots. Indeterminate 49 days

'Amish Red'

The oblong to plum-shaped, bright red fruits have a sharply pointed end. This is a cherry or salad-size tomato with a sweet and tangy flavor. Early and productive, a rare variety created from a cross between Sungold and Amish Paste. 75 days

'Anna Russian'

The large, pink fruits weigh up to one pound, and they are produced in abundance. They have a fantastic, sweet and juicy flavor that is unique to heart-shaped tomatoes. Wispy, drooping foliage are typical for heart tomatoes, do not overwater. 80 days

'Beauty King'^{BG}

Large stunning red yellow bi-color, yellow with flashy red stripes (not blotches). Interior is yellow with bright red streaks, very meaty. Very good sweet tomato flavor. 12-20 oz fruit with good to very good production. Heirloom marriage: Big Rainbow and Green Zebra. Indeterminate 75-80 days

'Berkeley Tie Dye'^{BG}

Berkeley Tie-Dye tomato is one of the most unique varieties in the world. The medium-size fruits have orange-red and yellow-green stripes. The flavor is very tangy, but also sweet. The beefsteak fruits weigh 8-14 ounces. 80 days

Red, deep globes weighing 8 oz with multiple disease resistance. Indeterminate 74 days

'Black Krim' – aka 'Black Crimea'

Beefsteak fruits are a unique combination of violet-brown and purple-red, they turn almost black with sufficient sunlight and heat. Excellent full flavor. Indeterminate 70-80 days

'Black Moor'

Developed in Russia (AKA Black Mauri) this tomato is very early and productive, the small, garnet-brown plum-shaped fruits are larger than cherry tomatoes; it is juicy with a rich, bold flavor. 70 days

'Black Vernissage'

The dark pink fruits are striped with purple with juicy flavor that is rich and tangy. Developed in the Ukraine (AKA Vernisazh Chernyi). 75 days

'Bloody Butcher' Rich heirloom flavor and deep, red color. Five to nine 2" fruits per cluster. Indeterminate 55 days

'Brad's Black Heart'^{BG}

Tomato 'Brad's Black Heart' is a large, heart-shaped variety with a rich, well-balanced flavor. The dense, meaty fruits are a beautiful shade of mahogany. Good production of 8-12 ounce fruits. Wispy foliage. A mother nature discovery in a row of 'Black Krim'.

'Brandywine'

One of the most popular heirlooms. Flavorful but not acidic, large-lobed beefsteaks with thin pinkish-red skins grow on unusually upright, potato-leaved plants. Fruits set one or two per cluster and ripen late – and are worth the wait. Brandywine's qualities really shine when it develops an incredible fine, sweet flavor.

'Brown Sugar'

Early production, beautiful color and delicious flavor. Brown Sugar produces lots of medium-size, round, purple-brown fruits. The dark red interior has a rich flavor that is more sweet than tangy, but not overly sweet. 75 days

'Carbon'

This heirloom boasts the signature rich flavor and meaty texture of a classic black tomato. Resists cracking and cat-facing, a blocky round, 10-14 oz. fruit with dark olive shoulders fades into a very dark, brick red. Rich, complex flavors make this variety the winner of a recent heirloom tomato taste testing at Cornell University.

Great for stewing or canning, as well as eating fresh. Potato leaved plants are scab and crack resistant. High yields. Indeterminate 95 Days AAS Award 2015



'Chef's Choice Yellow' Tomato lovers and culinary gardeners will rave about this large, meaty delicacy. Gorgeous 10 oz. beefsteak-type fruits have a sweet, citrus-like flavor with just the right amount of acid and the perfect tomato texture. Plants produce loads of 6"- 7" golden yellow fruits. Resistant to crack and scab. Indeterminate. 90 days AAS Award 2017

'Cherokee Purple'

colored dusty rose-brown fruits weight up to 12 ounces. Delicious sweet flesh. Indeterminate 75-90 days

'Cherry Brandywine'

Not exactly a cherry-size tomato, fruits weight about 1.5 ounces; the fruits look and taste like a miniature version of Brandywine. They weigh about 1.5 ounces and have a slightly flattened shape with a dark pink skin. The delicious flavor is well-balanced. Early and productive, grown from a Brandywine seed. It is shown with cherry tomatoes for size comparison.

'Dawson's Russian Oxheart'

The huge, heart-shaped fruits weigh 1-2 pounds and are yellow streaked with red. They are produced in abundance, and the flavor is outstanding. It is well-balanced, not overly sweet, with just the right amount of tang. 80 days

'Dr. Lyle'

Dr. Lyle tomato is a favorite of seed savers. The huge, deep pink beefsteaks weigh 1-2 pounds. They have a wonderfully rich, sweet and complex flavor. The beautiful fruits are usually crack resistant and blemish free.

'Dr Lyle' is a popular heirloom tomato. So, who is the mysterious Dr. Lyle? Nobody knows. 80 days

'Dr Wyches Yellow'

The 1 lb. fruit is solid and smooth; the color is a glowing tangerine-orange that always stands out in the kitchen or on the vine. One of the best heirloom orange types with its smooth texture and tropical, sweet taste, heavy yields. Indeterminate 75-80 days

'Early Girl'

Large clusters of 5 oz. fruits are borne extremely early and continues longer than most varieties. Globe to slightly flattened shape; bright red and meaty with a lot of flavor and aroma. Indeterminate 59 days

'Eva Purple Ball'

Eva Purple Ball is one of the prettiest heirloom tomatoes. The dark pink, tennis ball-size fruits are produced in abundance. The fruits weigh 4-5 ounces and have excellent flavor. Originally from the Black Forest region of Germany in the late 1800's. 75 days

'Fred Limbaugh Potato Top'

The huge, pink beefsteaks weigh 1-2 pounds and have a slightly smoky, sweet and tangy, well-balanced flavor. Some say better than a Brandywine. 'Fred Limbaugh Potato Top' was saved by Fred Limbaugh of Robinson, PA. It was passed down from his father and grandfather. (AKA Limbaugh's Legacy Potato Top) Potato-leaf foliage. Heirloom 80 days

'Gigantesque'

A rare variety from the south of Ukraine. The orange-red beefsteaks can weigh up to 2 pounds, fantastic flavor; rich, sweet and tangy. 78 days

'Goliath's Sunny' aka 'Jubilation'

A yellow-gold version, pick when fruits first turn yellow or wait until they ripen to rich gold. 7-8 oz juicy fruits are firm and very flavorful. Low acid. Multiple disease resistance. Indeterminate 70 days

'Grub's Mystery'

Grub's Mystery tomato is simply one of the best green tomatoes in existence. The potato-leaf plants produce loads of 8-10 ounce fruits with a sweet and spicy flavor. Outstanding! For sheer productivity and earliness, it beats the traditional Aunt Ruby's German Green. 75 days

'Haley's Purple Comet'^{BG}

The cherry-size fruits are a beautiful, deep mahogany color. The flavor is rich and sweet. Introduced by Wild Boar Farms, it was discovered in a patch of Cherokee Purple. 72 days

'Isis Candy Cherry' Gorgeous bicolor cherry tomatoes are red with a spectacular cat's eye starburst on the blossom end. Rich, sweet, fruity flavor. Plants are loaded with 1 ½" fruits on clusters of 6-8. Indeterminate 70-80 days

'Janet's Jacinth Jewel'^{BG} Large bright orange (jacinth) striped beefsteak. Very meaty. Very tasty. Sweet with some fruity notes. 1 lb. fruit, good to very good production. Indeterminate 90 days

'Kellogg's Breakfast' An orange-yellow beefsteak that is among the most popular heirloom tomatoes of all time. The huge, meaty fruits weigh 1-2 pounds and have an irresistible, tangy-fruity flavor. Production is moderate. An heirloom tomato that originated with Darrell Kellogg of Redford, Michigan 85 days

'Large Barred Boar'^{BG}

Flattened beefsteak tomatoes are pink/brown with metallic green stripes and weigh 8-12 oz. Very meaty pink flesh is very flavorful. Indeterminate 65-70 days

'Mamie Brown's Pink'

Pink beefsteaks of varying shapes, double fruits are somewhat common. Perfect sweet/acid flavor balance. Indeterminate 80 days

'Mexico'

A productive variety with beautiful, dark pink fruits that weigh 1-2 pounds. The flavor is delicious and well-balanced, and the texture is creamy. Heirloom 80 days

'Mint Julip'^{BG}

Unique plum/pear shaped; 1-1/2 oz. fruits have a pleasant tomato taste with a nice overall sweet flavor that is less tart than other green varieties. *Also known as Michael Pollan*. Extremely high yields with one plant often producing as much as 5 gallons of fruit! Indeterminate

'Monomakh's Hat'

Large, red, heart-shaped tomato that weighs 8-14 ounces. It has a sweet and tangy flavor and smooth texture. The regular-leaf plants are fairly compact with droopy foliage (typical of heart shaped tomatoes, do not overwater). 'Monomakh's Hat' comes from Novosibirsk, Siberia. It is named for the diamond-encrusted coronation crown worn by Peter the Great and other Russian tsars. Determinate 75 days

'Orange Cherry'

Orange Cherry tomato is said to be an open-pollinated version of the popular hybrid, Sungold. The 1" round, yellow-orange fruits are extremely sweet, like tomato-flavored sugar. Early and very productive. It keeps going until frost. 65 days



'Paul Robeson'

Named in honor of the famous opera singer in 1937, Paul Robeson was an Equal Rights Advocate for Blacks in Russia as well as all around the world. This Russian heirloom has almost a cult following among tomato connoisseurs. Amazing flavor that is distinctive, sweet and smoky. 7-10 oz fruits are a black-brick color. Indeterminate 90 days

'Pineapple Pig'^{BG}

1 lb. fruit, large, meaty, creamy yellow striped bi-color with rose blush lower acid – sweet huge, late and worth the wait.

'Pink Berkeley Tie Dye'^{BG}

A tasty blend of sweet and spice. Rosy-blushed, 8-12 ounce fruit have green skin with yellow streaks and fascinating green interior streaked with red and yellow. Early, relatively compact. Indeterminate 65 days

A Russian heirloom, produces medium sized purple-brown fruit. Plum shaped fruit is seedy, but has excellent flavor. A prolific, early producer. A Tomato Girl favorite, seed has been acclimated and collected in her Colorado garden. Indeterminate 65 days



'Sherry's Sweetheart'^{BG}

'Stupice'

One of the best early tomatoes, small, round fruits are juicy and tangy, and they are produced on compact plants until the first frost. They have disease-resistant, potato-leaf foliage. The name is pronounced Stoo-PEECH-ka. Stupice is an heirloom tomato from Czechoslovakia. 60 days

Tim's Black Ruffles tomato is truly unique, the flavor is rich, smoky and well-balanced. The 8-10 ounce, garnet-purple fruits are deeply pleated and produced in abundance. A rare variety, a cross between Black Krim and Zapotec Pink Pleated. 80 days

'Thai'

Spicy anise-clove scent and flavor, also useful in companion planting. Most commonly used in Thai or Vietnamese cooking. Attractive plants are 12-18" tall with medium green leaves and purple stems and blossoms. Beautiful blooms, great for container gardening. Annual.

'Sweet Basil'

A classic basil, ideal for tomato sauces, pesto and salads. Also useful in companion planting, great in containers. 12-18" Annual

'Genovese'

A hearty, classic flavor; it is the best basil for pesto and flavorful Italian dishes. Before the first fall frost, harvest all the leaves to make pesto. Freeze it in ice cube trays, then transfer the blocks to a plastic Ziploc bag. They can be removed from the freezer as needed to bring back a taste of summer to your cooking.

'Dark Opal'

One of the most beautiful of all herbs; it has dark purple leaves due to its high anthocyanin content, which gives it extra nutritional value. The flavor is rich and strong. Great for cooking and herbal vinegar.

'Red Velvet'

A re-emerging heirloom, this variety boasts unusual reddish-purple aromatic leaves, and has a stronger flavor than most types; packed with phyto-nutrients it is a potent anti-oxidant and an excellent source of iron. It is known to repel mosquitoes, used in companion planting, and well suited to containers. Use in salads, fruit jams, sauces, tea, or paired with fresh fruit; used often as a garnish.



Fairytale

Fairy Tale eggplants are white with violet/purple stripes. The fruit is sweet, non-bitter, with a tender skin and few seeds. Perfect for container gardening, you can harvest and grill right on the patio. A 2005 AAS winner; and award for eggplant has not won an AAS award since 1939! Full size fruits are approximately 4 oz. 30" tall 49-51 days

A sweet hybrid bell pepper that yields plenty of firm and blocky fruit that ripens from green to red. Produces 4" x 4.5" fruit, 18-24" tall

'Red Knight'





Silver Princess explodes in a burst of pure white petals that radiate from the soft yellow eyes. Under the flowers, there's a neat backdrop of the glistening, deep green foliage. 12" Perennial Zone 5-9

Denver Daisy/Black-Eyed Susan *Rudbeckia* 'Hirta'

Best known of all the prairie flowers and the easiest to grow. A single plant can produce hundreds of blooms over the summer and into the fall. Excellent cut flower with 6-10 days of vase life. Plants grow 2-3'. Self-seeding biennial or hardy annual. Hardy to zone 3.

Tick Seed *Coreopsis* 'Morning Sunrise'

All-America Selections winner. The first ever perennial to win prestigious Gold Medals from All-America Selections and their European counterpart, Fleuroselect! Uniform sun loving plants grow 24" tall and produce spectacular semi-double blooms of golden yellow from July through September. Adaptable to most soil types. Butterflies adore this versatile Tickseed cultivar. Zone 3-9

Sunflower *Helianthus annuus* Mixed

A mix of colors from yellow to orange to burgundy, these annual flowers average 4-6' tall and start blooming 60 days from seed (even sooner with transplants). Good food for bees and finches love them.

Bachelor's Buttons *Centaurea cyanus* 'Blue Boy'

This easy-to-grow, self-sowing annual bears consistently true-blue flowers that bloom throughout the growing season and are ideal for cutting and drying. This popular cottage garden plant grows 2-3' tall and was brought to America from Europe in the 17th century.

Bee's Friend *Phacelia tanacetifolia*

This annual bears subtle lavender-blue flowers with curved spikes that not only put on a show in your garden but also attract and support many species of bees. This plant's common name is a translation of Bienen-freund, German for "bee's friend." Annual 12-24"

Cosmo *Cosmos sulphureus* 'Diablo'

A native to Mexico and Central and South America, it can tolerate growing with very little water after the seeds germinate. In 1974, heirloom Diablo won the All-America Selections award for flowers. A half-hardy annual, cosmos reseed easily in good soil conditions. The scarlet-orange blossoms are long lasting and grow 2-3'

Cosmo *Cosmos bipinnatus* 'Purity'

A classic variety with pure white flowers and ferny foliage. Purity cosmos are impressive at the back of the border or the center of an island bed. They are especially popular for white gardens. The flowers show up well during an evening stroll through the garden. Drought tolerant.

Pot Marigold *Calendula officinalis* Mixed

The spectacular colors and the array of petal formations in this flower mix make it a great choice for borders and mass plantings. Blossoms are edible, the petals are tangy and sweet; great for container gardens. This European native has been used for thousands of years in creams to soothe irritated skin and resolve other inflammatory problems. Self-sowing hardy annual, 20-24" tall.

Produces loads of 2" double to semi-double blooms in a range of warm colors and bi-colors including gold, cream, orange, mahogany red and chocolate brown. Persian Carpet zinnias are compact and bushy, which makes them an ideal choice for containers.

Garlic Chives *Allium tuberosum*

Garlic Chives are tall and upright with wide, flat leaves. They have a strong garlic flavor that is useful in the kitchen, and they make great companion plants in organic gardens. They repel aphids, and the flowers attract bees, butterflies and beneficial insects. Garlic Chives produce clusters of starry white flowers in late August.



Mojito Mint *Mentha x villosa*

Mojito recipes call for any Spearmint; but the real mojito can only be made with the true Mojito Mint. A culinary mint native to Cuba was previously impossible to get in North America until 10 years ago; we now have the authentic plant from Cuba. Mojito Mint also makes a great seasoning for meats and confections. It is clearly different from most other mints - the scent of this aromatic herb and flavor are agreeably mild and warm, not pungent nor overly sweet, but citrusy and savory at the same time. Zone 5-9

Oregano *Origanum vulgare*

This versatile culinary herb is most often dried and widely used for Italian dishes, tomato sauce, pizza, fish and salad dressing. Oregano requires little maintenance and makes an excellent edging plant or ground covering, even in dry garden spots. Zone 5-9


