An update from Commissioner Dr. Dan Manson

In 2011, leaders from regional and national NSF ATE Cybersecurity Centers and other institutions formed the National Cyber League. Our vision was, and still is, to provide an ongoing virtual training ground for students to develop, practice, and validate their cybersecurity knowledge and skills using next-generation high-fidelity simulation environments, based on industry-relevant learning objectives.

While initially inspired by the seminal 2005 paper "Exploring a National Cybersecurity Exercise for Universities," we expanded the scope of NCL to include:

- · High school students in addition to college students
- · A Spring and Fall season to align with school semesters
- · Individual Player Scouting Reports, and
- · National Power Rankings

We are the most inclusive, performance-based, learning-centered collegiate cybersecurity competition today.

As we enter the new decade, we are nurturing the growing NCL community with much more content, learning tools, guidance and career support than ever before. Our NCL Player Ambassador Board, led by Crypto Kait, is now producing six days of NCL-related content a week, through blogs and live, interactive video coaching. Composed entirely of dedicated NCL Players and Coaches, this team's unyielding passion and energy represents everything NCL stands for.

NCL's technology partner, Cyber Skyline, is mapping challenges and scouting reports to the NIST NICE Framework to better highlight for recruiters the equivalency of the NCL competition to real-world needs for recruiters, talent scouts and hiring managers.

We are mission-driven to expand the NCL community through the inclusion of more schools, more partners, more NCL offerings, and more resources to enable players to be successful. NCL embraces, supports, and encourages any high school student with a passion for learning, any student — whether in high school or college, those taking a full course load or just one class, students just starting their learning or already in love with CTFs, and students of any age — who want to explore and become part of the cybersecurity community. We are proud of the NCL, and our Player Ambassadors live the culture of supporting and celebrating diversity and inclusion of any participant, regardless of ethnicity, race, gender and sexual orientation, religion, age or disability.

Critical to NCL success is growing our community of Coaches who teach, mentor and support students. NCL is a sport, and good coaching makes all the difference for the success of anyone or any team playing a sport. Coaches are also critical to the integrity of the game. 







Degree Pursuing




NCL Encourages Diversity

NCL Players by Race





Ways to partner with NCL

NCL is working with industry organizations to partner strategically. Our goal is to prepare students to hit the ground running as they enter the cybersecurity workforce, addressing the critical shortage of qualified cybersecurity talent at the same time.

Ways to partner include:

- **SPONSOR STUDENTS** Sponsor students to participate. Individual cost is just \$35 per student, which gives them access to a Virtual Gym, a Preseason Game through which they are bracketed (Bronze, Silver, Gold categories), an Individual Game and a Team Game. A small administrative fee is added when sponsoring.
- · CO-HOST WEBINARS Your informative/educational content promoted and delivered live to NCL's community.
- **INTEGRATE YOUR TECHNOLOGY** Work strategically with NCL to continuously incorporate new and advanced challenges to the games.
- PROMOTE YOUR BRAND Reciprocal co-branding opportunities, including website logos and social media.
- PARTNER ACROSS ACADEMIA, INDUSTRY AND GOVERNMENT Academic alliances in which industry partner and NCL offer services to academic institutions.
- CREATE NEW CTF COMPETITIONS Collaborate on Capture-the-Flag (CTF) competitions at conferences.
