an ongoing trade dispute between Boeing and Airbus. If you haven't seen any price increases yet, it's because of retailers such as Maurice Amiel at The French Wine Merchant. "Monsieur Maurice," as he's known to his devoted clientele, employed a two-pronged strategy to ease the effects of the tariffs on American consumers. He absorbed some of the price increase himself, and he also decided to concentrate on the higher-end French wines his customers prefer.

We have some of the most affluent wine buyers in the world here in Palm Beach," he observed in a New York Times interview last year. "If they love the wine they'll buy it, regardles, of price."

As a result, The French Wine Merchant was able to gnore wines such as Beaujolais Nouveau and focus on the exalted growers of Bordeaux and Burgundy so popular in Palm Beach. Now, however, retailers face a far more dangerous threat: the administration is threatening to slap French wine imports with tariffs up to 100%

"If that happens," says Maurice, "it would be a disaster for everyone. Concerned customers are asking me about it, and I'm giving the best advice I have: stock up for the season now, just in case."

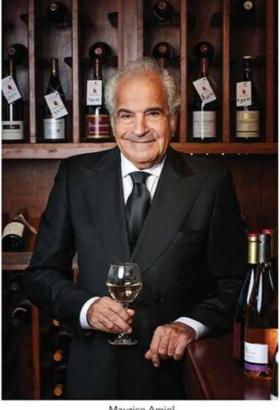
