SAFETY FIRST

To the General Public

In the interests of safety please keep out of the horse walks, Collecting Rings and working in areas which have all been signed. Crossing points have been provided across the horse walks at regular intervals.

To Owners / Exhibitors / Riders / Competitors

Due to the rigid safely regulations laid down by the Health and Safety Executive, you are strongly requested to take great care when moving horses on the Showground and remain within designated horse areas. Competitors who fail to do so may be asked to leave the Showground. The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

Grooms and other helpers other than the person leading the horse or pony who fail to comply with stewards requests to leave the horse walk may be subject to disqualification.

DOGS TO BE KEPT ON LEADS AT ALL TIMES

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY/GENERAL RULES

ENTRIES

a) Postal Entries - Postal Entry forms for all classes must be completed by the owner or representative and sent to the Secretary: Marion Hardy, 4 Knutsford Road Cottages, Knutsford Road, Chelford, Macclesfield, Cheshire, SK11 9AS. Entries will NOT BE ACCEPTED unless accompanied by the correct fees (and must include first aid tariff of £4 per competitor).

If paying via cheque, these must be made payable to The Cheshire Horse Show Ltd.

- b) **On the Day Entries** (where eligible see schedule of classes for details) may be taken with a surcharge of £5.
- c) Amendments to Entries Under no circumstances will entries be changed, substituted or amended once received. Any entries received after the closing date will be subject to the additional fee. Postal Entries/On The Day Entries will only be accepted on the official entry form. In the event of a horse or pony being unable to compete through illness, accident or the like, the Society will refund the whole of the entry fee on production of a Veterinary Certificate.
- d) FIRST AID: A levy of £4.00 will be charged per competitor towards the cost of First Aid provision.
- e) **PRIZE MONEY:** No prize money will be given out without production of the Exhibitors number, rosette and class number. Prize money will only be awarded once results have been received by the Treasurer. In the Light horse classes (excluding RIHS/LIHS qualifying classes) where there are **less than 6 entries**, prize money will be awarded to **1st place only**. **ALL PRIZE MONEY MUST BE COLLECTED ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW OTHERWISE IT WILL BE FORFEITED**.
- f) Refunds: Showing Exhibits Only NO REFUND OF ENTRIES WILL BE GIVEN, except in the event of unforeseen cancellation of the show, when a £5.00 levy will be deducted from each entry to cover Administration costs.

NOTE: ALL COMPETITOR NUMBERS TO BE COLLECTED ON SHOWDAY. Please allow enough time to collect

PARKING/ENTRY TO SHOWGROUND

STRICTLY NO EXHIBITOR ENTRY PERMITTED VIA PEACOCK LANE.

- a) Admission to Showground Horse boxes will be checked on entry to the showground and any additional passengers, with the exception of Owner/Rider/Groom will be charged a discounted rate of £5.00 per person. Please have the correct money available to help keep the traffic flow moving.
- b) Parking Exhibitor's boxes and Exhibits must stand in the space allocated for their purposes. The Society will strictly enforce this condition. SHIRE/HEAVY HORSE EXHIBITORS ONLY Please note that there is a dedicated parking area (adjacent to the Shire ring). Please follow the appropriate signs and do not park in the light horse area

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

- a) Hats: A 'Riding Hat', designed to provide protection, must be worn, at all times when mounted by anyone, whether or not a Competitor, at a British Showjumping competition. Harnesses must be properly adjusted and fastened at all times when mounted. When jumping, including warming up, all Competitors must wear 'Protective Headwear' i.e. a hat which meets one of the following standards: British: PAS 015 (2011) and European VG01.040 2014-12, provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC Marked. ALL RIDDEN CLASS COMPETITORS must wear a hard hat to the current BSI and EU standard. Riders in BSPS classes please see rule relating to hat specifications.
- b) Body Protectors It is recommended that competitors involved in jumping wear a body protector of the appropriate BSI and EU standard. Body Protectors are compulsory when competing in the LIHS Working Hunter Pony Classes.

c) **Falls:** Competitors having a fall on the Showground must be checked by a First Aider before remounting and continuing in other classes. In any case it is recommended that they are checked by a First Aider before leaving the Showground.

GENERAL

- a) Owners may enter as many horses as they wish, and all competitions are open unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
- b) **Exhibits** to be on the showground half an hour before judging.
- c) **Judges Decision:** The decision of the judge is final and no competitor or spectator may approach the judge on the Showground over the decision.
- d) **Rosettes:** Rosettes to 4th place will be awarded.
- e) **Trophies -** All trophies must be returned in good condition at least one month prior to the date of the next Show.
- f) Welfare: The Committee have the right to disqualify/remove any person found to be ill-treating any horse/pony, riding in a dangerous manner or behaving badly. They will be told to leave the Showground without refunds. It is unacceptable to leave a horse/pony unattended when tied up outside vehicles. The welfare/fitness of the horses/ponies must be taken into account if you are considering doing numerous classes. If any member of the committee or judge has concerns about the welfare of a horse/pony/rider/handler, they have the right to challenge entry to a class.
- g) Liability: Neither the Cheshire Horse Show or any of its officers, assistants or stewards shall in any way be responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants of other members of the public, or to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought onto the showground or while entering or leaving the same. It is necessary for all exhibitors to carry Public Liability Insurance for an adequate indemnity to protect against their negligence including any injury caused by their animals or property.
- h) **Objections:** Any objection or protest must be made in writing to the Secretary, stating the grounds for such objection, within 30 minutes of the end of the class and must be accompanied by £20 deposit. This will be refundable if the objection is upheld.
- i) The Committee reserves the right to divide or combine any class or reduce the number of prizes awarded due to the number of entries.
- j) **Dogs:** All dogs must be kept on a short lead at all times and if possible, restrained from barking at the ring side.

COB / HACK / RIDING HORSE SECTION - Ring 3

This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Horse Association (BSHA). RIHS Open Qualifying Classes are held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association (BSHA). Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. **Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form. Open Classes 2-3, 5-6, 8-10 are qualifiers for The Agria Royal International Horse Show**. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then third will go forward. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Agria Royal International Horse Show 23 - 28 July 2024 must submit their entries ONLINE at: <u>www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling/the-Agria-royal-international-horse-show</u>. Schedules will be available to download by April. **Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter Sections of The Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.**

RIHS Amateur Qualifiers - Classes 11-14 are qualifiers for the Amateur Championships at the Agria Royal International Horse Show. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob class. The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship. Please refer to rules 6 & 7 in the 2024 BSHA Rulebook. The Amateur qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualification in order to confirm qualification. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Agria Royal International Horse Show 23 - 28 July 2024 must submit their entries ONLINE at <u>www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-results-schooling/the-Agria-royal-international-horse-show.</u> Schedules will be available to download by April.

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top five, in each **Open** affiliated class will qualify to compete in the **BSHA Supreme of Season Final.** The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Show in September 2024.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each **Open** class and a Champion rosette for each section (with the exception of Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes). Recipients of the Young Rider rosette will qualify for the BSHA Young Rider of the Year at the National Championship Show in September 2024.

DAY TICKETS - Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS (except Amateur & Working Show Horse) or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket on the BSHA website.

DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT THE LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW (LIHS) – Classes 16-20 qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show (December 2024), highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a "wild card" will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

Rising Stars Rules – Open to members and non-members, 15 years & over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules. Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2024 are separate to BSHA Amateur rules. Please see the full list of Rising Star rules section available on the BSHA website (www.britishshowhorse.org). If in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed. FINALISTS – A qualification card will be presented in the ring detailing how to confirm qualification and register with the BSHA. Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS Rising Star Supreme Final MUST complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 14 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down to the next eligible exhibit. The BSHA will offer training clinics nearer the event to prepare all competitors before the finals.

This show is affiliated to **UK Ponies & Horses Limited (Affiliation Number 24/A18/8354) UK PONIES & HORSES GOLD MEDAL SERIES** - Classes 2-3, 5-6, 8-14 are qualifiers for the Gold Medal Series at the 2025 UKPH Spring Classic, Equifest 2024 and BSPA 2024. **The 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each qualifying class will qualify**. Qualification cards will not be awarded in the ring however placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary. This show is affiliated to the NCPA (Affiliation Number 103/24) and is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show in September 2024. 1st & 2nd prizewinners in Classes 4, 7 & 15 will qualify.

This Show offers qualification for **THE NATIONAL WELSH CHAMPIONS SHOW**, 11th August 2024 at Three Counties Showground, Malvern. See Sections relevant to registered Welsh breeds (In-hand & Ridden) for qualification details. Qualifiers will be directly contacted after this show with details of qualifications and entry details. For Show details and Schedule see our Facebook page. Classes 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9 & 10 are qualifiers for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024 - National Ridden Welsh Part Bred Championships.** All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in each class (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry

Special Prize: The BL Bane Perpetual Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the Champion Hack.

OPEN CLASSES:

- Class 2 **RIHS Small Hack Qualifier** Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hds) but not exceeding 154cms (15hds).
- Class 3 **RIHS Large Hack Qualifier -** Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 154cms (15hds) but not exceeding 160cms (15.3hds).

Championship: The horses placed 1st and 2nd are eligible to go through to the Championship.

- Class 4 Novice Riding Horse Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms. Not won a first prize of £25 or more, or more than a total of £150 (including Championship Prize Money) in any showing classes excluding Working Show Horses, Best Trained, Pairs, Side Saddle or In-Hand classes that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a 4 year old are exempt, unless that 4 year old has won an Open Ridden Class with a first prize of £25 or more. If the category has changed from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa, it may not revert back to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a Day Ticket in order to compete in Novice classes. Animals which have been placed in the top 5 at either the Royal International Horse Show or Horse of the Year Show in any OPEN ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of the Search for a Star finals, are ineligible to compete in Novice Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip" for conformation.
- Class 5 **RIHS Small Riding Horse Qualifier** Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hds) but not exceeding 158cms (15.2hds).
- Class 6 **RIHS Large Riding Horse Qualifier** Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms (15.2hds).

Championship: The horses placed 1st and 2nd are eligible to go through to the Championship.

- Class 7 Novice Riding Cob Mare or gelding 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hds). Not won a first prize of £25 or more, or more than a total of £150 (including Championship Prize Money) in any showing classes excluding Working Show Horses, Best Trained, Pairs, Side Saddle or In-Hand classes that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a 4 year old are exempt, unless that 4 year old has won an Open Ridden Class with a first prize of £25 or more. If the category has changed from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa, it may not revert back to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a Day Ticket in order to compete in Novice classes. **Animals which have been placed in the top 5 at either the Royal International Horse Show or Horse of the Year Show in any OPEN ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of the Search for a Star finals, are ineligible to compete in Novice Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob or Riding Horse classes. Horses competing in Novice classes must be ridden by the Judge, before being asked to "strip£ for conformation.**

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a current standard correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout. - Class 29 **Concours de Elegance Class -** For horses/ponies any height, 4 years and over, open to singles, pairs, multiples driven to a traditional type vehicle. The essence of the class is the word "elegance" and the winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect. To include vehicle, horse/pony, driver, passenger etc., but above all the general impression. Attention may be paid to drivers/passengers' personal costume, but fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria does not apply. It is judges from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected. To be driven at park pace.
- Class 30 Lady Whip/Gentleman Whip Class For horses/ponies any height, 4 years and over. This is to be judged entirely on the ability of the driver and good horsemanship. Turnout safe and tidy. Open to any vehicle.
- Class 31 **Pleasure Driving Class -** Pleasure Driving Classes are for newcomers to showing and not intended for those who show in private driving classes. Regular showing competitors are asked to respect this and entries for the pleasure driving class will not be accepted from those who enter our private driving class. Open to horses/ponies/donkeys/mules, 4 yrs old or over. A single, pair of tandem driven to a vehicle capable of seating 2 or more persons. Traditional or non-traditional vehicles are permitted and for the purposes of this class they will be judged on equal merit. Pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (ie., not car tyres) are allowed. Lamps need not be carried. To be judged on general cleanliness, safety or turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability. To be judged: 15% vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness, 15% harness suitability, fit and cleanliness, 70% driver and groom, horse/pony/donkey/mule' way of going and suitability as a family pleasure animal. Competitors may, for example be required to drive and halt between two pairs of cones and/or given other specific movements to execute in their show.

Class may be split at Judge's discretion into 2 sections if sufficient entries. Both sections will be in the ring at the same time.;

This show is affiliated to the **BSPS (Affiliation Number 718)** and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

This show is a Direct Qualifier for the London International Horse Show (December 2024). Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify ie., the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE ponies placed in each class will qualify. Non-members of the BSPS have 7 days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor. Horses/ponies do not need to have a JMB height certificate to compete in these classes. Riders in BSPS classes are required to adhere to Rule 43 in the 2024 BSPS Rulebook with regard to hat specification. Mountain & Moorland Ponies will not be penalized in the Performance Classes for having non-pulled tails and feathers but must be plaited.

The BSPS Performance Coloured Classes are open to mares, gelding and CHAPS (UK) or BSPA graded stallions, 4 years old and over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society (CHAPS UK) or the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA). Ponies can be registered with either of these Societies or the BSPS and owners and riders must be or become members of the BSPS within 7 days to take the qualification.

Method of judging

Exhibitors will go around the ring as whole group, (no pull in). They will then undertake an individual display (rather than a show) where they need to show certain movements which will include walk, trot, canter on both reins, a canter circle, canter transitions on the straight, extension in canter on one rein and a free walk on a long rein and a halt. Competitors in these classes will not be stripped.

Judges should ask the age of the animal and what class the rider competes their horse or pony in e.g WHP, Pony Club, Sports Pony/Eventing, Dressage or Showing etc.

Judges will penalise riders who miss out a movement in the Performance Classes e.g not cantering a circle by **10 points per movement**. The rest of the display will be marked based on the qualify and correctness of performance for the type of animal being judged based on rewarding a strong performance, penalising mistakes, not cantering on a straight line, heavily penalising bad manners and vice e.g bucking, rearing, napping etc

In the Mark section for **Presentation and the Suitability of the Rider** judges will consider the overall turnout. Marks will be deducted if the rider is unsuitably mounted. Presentation must consider and reward horses and ponies that are "fit not fat" and "fit for purpose" for their type, e.g an event/sports pony may carry less overall condition than a Show Hunter Pony.

In the Mark Section for **Type**, **Movement and Way of Going** judges will be awarding ponies that are the right type for the classification it is being shown in e.g WHP/Sports/Event/Hunter Type. Show Pony and in the Coloured classes traditional versus Cob or Native type. The movement of the pony must correspond to its type and way of going must be in accordance with the class it would mainly compete in.

At the end of the test, they will canter down one side of the arena to finish. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. Cantering over the fences will not be penalised. There will be NO conformation marks. **Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed standards.**

Class 140 LIHS BSPS OPEN CRADLE STAKES QUALIFIER – Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 122cms (12hds). Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Ponies must be plaited. Body protectors are compulsory in this class.
