### Using Technology for Geography | Discovering Norway

#### - Google Earth

- Go to <https://earth.google.com/web/>
- Click the search button and type in "Kvaroy Fiskeoppdrett AS".
- Click the link under Places next to the Location symbol.
- Explore by zooming in and out to see where on the globe the farm is located.

#### - Google Maps

- Go to <https://www.google.com/maps/dir/> and type Kvaroy's address in the "from" field (Kvarøy Fiskeoppdrett AS, Gnr 48 Bnr 40, 8743 Indre Kvarøy, Norway) and your address in the "destination" field. Look at where they both are on the map!
- Now change the destination to Oslo, Norway. Oslo is the capital of Norway. To get to Kvaroy, you have to fly to Oslo, take an 8 hour train, a taxi, and two boats. WOW!

- Scroll down to learn all about the Kingdom of Norway!
