




Shared Parenting Polling New Jersey, August, 2021

In August, 2021, National Parents Organization, in coordination with Father's And Children Equality, commissioned an independent poll, conducted by Researchscape International, of the attitudes of those in New Jersey concerning shared parenting when parents live apart. 
95% of those in New Jersey believe it is in the child's best interest to have as much time as possible with each parent.

Furthermore, 94% in New Jersey expressed a commitment to vote their beliefs in being *"more likely to vote for a candidate who supports children spending equal or nearly equal time with each parent following separation or divorce when both parents are fit and willing to be parents.*




Best Interest of Children

- It is in the child's best interest to have as much time as possible with each parent.
- It is in the child's best interest to spend as much time as possible with just one parent.




Influence on Voting

85% of those in New Jersey indicated they would support a change in New Jersey law that awards children as much time as possible with each parent.




77% believe that when there is conflict between parents, awarding sole custody to one parent increases conflict

Parental Conflict and Sole Custody




■ Increases conflict ■ Has no impact ■ Decreases conflict

75% believe that in instances of divorce or separation when both parents are fit and willing to be parents, shared parenting is best for children.



- It's better for children to have two homes, one with each parent.
- It's better for children to have only one home with one of their parents.

88% believe that both parents should have equal rights and responsibilities following divorce or separation.



Both parents should have equal parental rights and responsibilities.

- Mothers should have greater parental rights and responsibilities.
- Fathers should have greater parental rights and responsibilities.

Data based on a professional poll conducted by <u>Researchscape International</u> from August 25 to31, 2021. The sample size of 575 respondents, representative of New Jersey adults with respect to race, gender, age, income, political alignment and more, provides an estimated credibility interval of plus or minus 6%.
