

SYRACUSE FLAG REDESIGN SUBMISSION FORM

Adapt CNY is organizing a flag re-design initiative to propose a new flag to the City of Syracuse.

Our current flag is the City seal on a banner. The City seal is meant to be viewed on paper, up close, and flat. A flag is meant to be seen at a distance, hanging or waving in the wind. We also think the flag and the seal should be separate as the seal represents the government of the City of Syracuse. **We want a flag that represents the people.**

We are asking **YOU** to submit designs for a new flag for the City of Syracuse. We will then work with a committee of Syracuse volunteers to develop the flag submission process and ultimately review and decide, with public input, on the final flag design.

City of Syracuse residency is *not* required for submission, but will hold weight in the final selection process. REMEMBER THE FIVE PRINCIPLES OF GOOD FLAG DESIGN:

Keep it simple	Use meaningful symbolism	Use two or three basic colors	No lettering or seals	Be distinctive or be related
The flag should be so simple that a child can draw it from memory.	The flag's images, colors, or patterns should relate to what it symbolizes.	Limit the number of colors on the flag to three which contrast well and come from the standard color set	Never use writing of any kind or an organization's seal.	Avoid duplicating other flags, but use similarities to show connections.

We want to see the flag displayed not only on poles but on t-shirts, coffee mugs, murals, and more! We hope for a future where the new Syracuse flag is a **beacon of pride** for the City.

Syracuse, New York is a city of 26 neighborhoods in Central New York. Perhaps best known for its snowy winters, Syracuse boasts of a hardworking, diverse, and resilient history. Syracuse was incorporated as a Village in 1825 and a City in 1848 on the homeland of the Onondaga people, one of the five nations of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy. While sharing a name with the local University, Syracuse is more than one organization and is home to a wide collection of employers, heritages, and traditions. Like the Erie Canal that once moved through the heart of the City, Syracuse has a history that flows with the exchange of ideas, cultures, and innovation. While the history of Syracuse includes a legacy of division, conflict, and racism, the city is working towards an equitable future for all people. Syracuse will continue to be a growing city that embraces diversity and creates opportunity for all.
