BUILD YOUR OWN KIT



Be ready for the next hurricane by making your own Hurricane Preparedness Kit!

- Water- 1 gallon per person per day for several days
- Food- at least 3 day supply
- Battery-powered or handcrank radio
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- Whistle
- Moist towelettes
- Garbage bags
- Wrench or pliers
- Manual can opener
- Cell phone charger and backup battery
- Prescription medications
- Non-prescription medications (pain relief, allergy meds, etc.)
- Prescription eyeglasses and contact solution

- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes, and cream
- Pet food and extra water
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Important documents
 - Insurance policies
 - Identification
 - Bank account records
- Sleeping bags
- Complete change of clothes
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine and personal hygiene products
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels, and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

Emergency Alerts and Warnings

WEAs

Smart phones are able to receive Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEAs), make sure that these are turned on so you can receive important information from local and national officials including the National Weather Service

EAS

The Emergency Alert System (EAS) is a national public warning system that allows local and national authorities to broadcast information to the public. Make sure to pay attention to these alerts for information on national emergencies.

NWR

The NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) broadcasts information 24/7 concerning both weather and non-weather emergencies on these frequencies: 162.400, 162.425, 162.450, 162.475, 162.500, 162.525, and 162.550

Prepare Your Home

De-clutter your drains and gutters Bring in any outside furniture Consider using hurricane shutters

Search for open shelters by texting **SHELTER** and a **ZIP code** to **43362** (example: "SHELTER 77581")

EVACUATION GUIDE



Before an Evacuation

- Identify possible shelters for you and your family. Remember to make sure that they allow pets if you have any.
- Plan your route ahead of time, but be familiar with alternate routes.
- Prepare a "Go-Bag" don't forget to pack medications, important documents, snacks, and water.
- Keep a full tank of gas if an evacuation seems possible. During hurricane season it is best to always keep half a tank of gas.
- Communicate your plan with family members.

During an Evacuation

- Unplug electronics such as televisions and small appliances.
 Leave freezers and refrigerators plugged in unless there is a risk for flooding.
- Lock all doors and windows before you leave.
- Leave early enough to avoid being trapped by severe weather.
- Do not drive through flooded areas and avoid back roads.

After an Evacuation

- Make sure that is ok to return home before leaving.
- Bring supplies like food and water back with you.
- Be prepared for loss of power when you return home. If you have a generator, remember to follow all safety guidelines.
