MORE THAN A PORCH

The scariest part of a porch should be Halloween decorations, not an ever-present fear of being injured. Unfortunately, for Mr. and Mrs. V, both their front and back porches served as a constant threat to their well-being. The couple, together for over 65 years, became confined to their home when the old wooden porch steps became too rotten to walk on— not to mention their steep design barred Mr. V from using his walker for extra support.

A team of six MiA volunteers made it their mission to address this unacceptable situation. They replaced the front porch entirely and installed a 10-foot accessibility ramp on the back porch. This act of service has changed the lives of a devoted couple and will allow them to remain in the home they love.

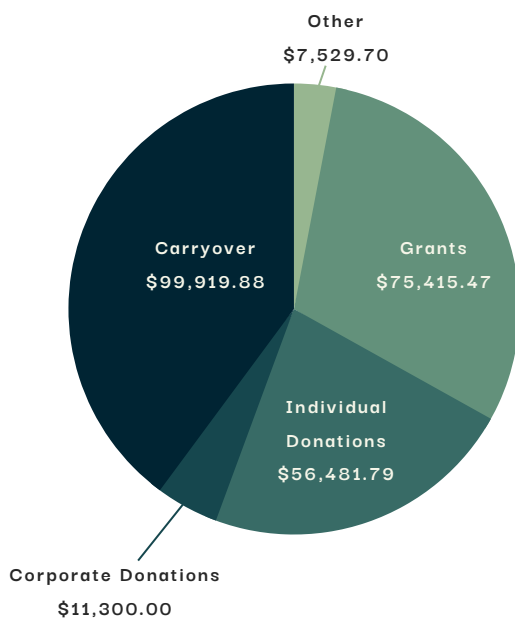
Exterior Hazard Checks

Volunteer-led program to raise awareness of potential high wind hazards

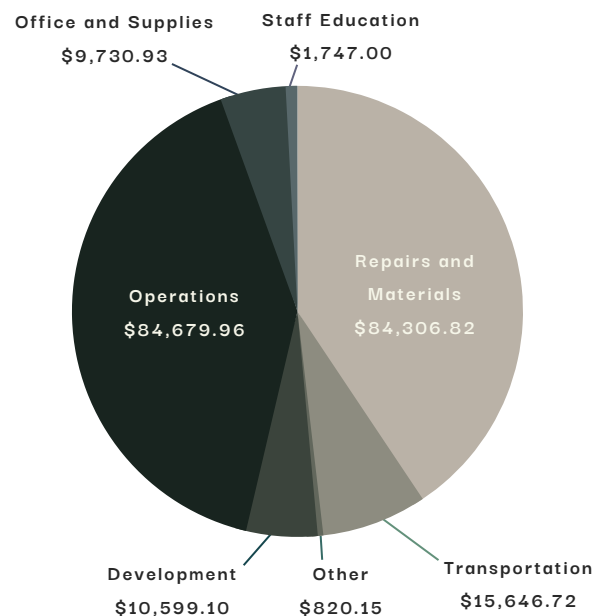
- Over 30 homes inspected by two groups of volunteers
