## YOUTH & BEACH PROGRAM REPORT





#### In 2020, Save the Harbor:

- Employed 36 local young people through our socially-distant youth jobs and leadership summer program.
- Created a summer art series designed to showcase local BIPOC artists, musicians, wellness professionals, and healers.
- Produced weekly virtual environmental education content to share with our 130 youth program partners across the region through our new Virtual Boston Harbor web page.
- Supported 38 Better Beaches Program partners with a total of \$208,700 to keep their communities safe amid the challenges of COVID-19.



## A YEAR LIKE NO OTHER

When it became clear that 2020 would not be a typical year, Save the Harbor was able to find ways to continue connecting people to Boston Harbor, the beaches, and the Boston Harbor Islands. At the same time, as Black and brown community members continue to endure systemic racism in all its forms, we evaluated our programs, community impact, and grant-giving to better support and invest in community members of color.



We quickly realized that stopping the social spread of COVID-19 was key to keeping our beaches safe and open for everyone. Working with our partners in state and local government, we took the lead in educating the public about how and why to practice social distancing on our public beaches. At the same time, our team created new virtual programs that served the entire Boston area, built new community partnerships, and invested in new digital engagement strategies.

We are optimistic about the future, though these are still unsettling and uncertain times. Despite that uncertainty, you can be sure that, with your support, Save the Harbor will be here to continue sharing the harbor, beaches, and islands with everyone.

With your support during this challenging year, we are proud to report that Save the Harbor/Save the Bay:

- **Hired 36 Boston high school and college students** more than ever before to create more than 50 videos, activities and curriculum units to share the harbor virtually with 130 youth-serving community organizations.
- **Hosted weekly presentations for our youth staff** on topics such as community activism, mental health, sleep and nutrition, public speaking, leadership, and more. The series broadened our youth staff's network and provided new resources that they can use as they navigate their personal and professional lives moving forward.
- Leveraged \$208,700 in Better Beaches Program grants to help our partners adapt to new circumstances. They
  purchased masks, hand sanitizer and other PPE to keep beachgoers safe throughout the summer, and created new, socially
  distant events.
- Piloted a summer art series that directed funds to Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) community members and showcased the strategic and imaginative ways the beach can bring healing to those who have too frequently been made unsafe there.
- **Continued to steward our beaches and harbor** with socially-safe beach cleanups, and produced virtual fishing trips and harbor tours that we shared with the community through our new Virtual Boston Harbor platform.

Though we wish we could have been together in person, we were able to help our partners run programs and connect to the harbor through engaging virtual content.

# YOUTH PROGRAMS



# Rather than sharing the harbor in-person with more than 30,000 young people and their families, Save the Harbor's summer staff found new ways to connect with the community through virtual platforms.

The 36 Boston-area high school and college students who worked for us this summer created and shared engaging online content to connect our 130 youth program partners to Boston Harbor and the region's waterfront. Our staff worked in small teams, exploring the science and history of 7 waterfront sites from Revere to Dorchester, allowing them to gain a first-hand knowledge of the harbor. They also had the opportunity to safely visit The Boston Harbor Islands, participate in fishing trips, and learn about conservation across the region. All of the virtual programs and activities they created during their adventures live on our new <u>Virtual Boston Harbor platform</u>.



# BEATS ON THE BEACH





Beats On The Beach is a collaborative community music contest, in partnership with Brain Arts Organization, featuring samples collected from sounds on the beach by Boston-based producers Rilla Force and LDER. Local beat makers and producers were challenged to use these beach sound packs to create a beat that would be used in a song by local artist and poet Oompa.

This year, we received more than 20 incredible submissions and paid the producers, artists, and contest winner fair wages for their work. The winning beat, "Dive In," was produced by Don Kim aka TheUdon, and Oompa's original song based on his submission is titled "Got to Fly." We are thrilled with the success of the project and look forward to continuing our relationship with Boston's thriving BIPOC music and art community in the future.















### HARBOR HEALING



Harbor Healing is a series of wellness-based workshops and demonstrations that highlight how our beaches can be used for wellness and self-care. This series was created in partnership with Brain Arts Organization with the intention to aid in repairing the relationship that community members of color may have with our beaches by addressing the traumas that have taken place, and providing things to do on the beach that bring spiritual healing and mental wellness.

We partnered with three local Black/Afro-Indigenous womxn-owned organizations to showcase their contributions to the Boston community and beyond. We brought Sistahs of the Calabash to Carson Beach to perform a cleansing Yoruba water ritual; You Good Sis?, a yoga collective for BIPOC femmes, produced a beach meditation video; and herbal remedies business Joyefully Natural created a four-part video series about healing resources at local beaches.
