At the annual meeting, the 2024-25 budget presented supported a 3/4 time rather than a full time minister. If this amount was not received by then, it was agreed to hire a 3/4 minister to insure a balanced budget.

We want to thank everyone who has sent in their Part 2 Stewardship increasing their annual pledge. We know there are some questions, but there are so many variables that could give a different response to "WHAT If" scenarios that we ask you to wait at least till the end of July before we address those questions. In the meantime, please prayerfully consider raising your annual pledge.
