a Note from Herbie

Dear Friends,

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ! I wanted to take a moment to write to you—the congregation of Palmetto Presbyterian Church—on this important day as you gather to vote on my candidacy to become your next senior pastor.

Over the past six months, I've had the sincere pleasure of getting to know the remarkable individuals you elected to the Pastor Nominating Committee. From our very first conversation, I sensed something special. In their questions and comments, in the tone of their voices, and even in their body language, I recognized people who were at peace—with themselves and with one another. They were deeply invested in the mission of Palmetto Presbyterian, and most importantly, they were people deeply in love with Jesus Christ.

Speaking from the candidate's side of the table, I can say without hesitation that your committee represented you well. They extended genuine kindness, asked thoughtful and discerning questions about my theology and vision, and modeled grace throughout the process. The spirit of joy and harmony that marked your PNC convinced me there was an "X factor" in them—something intangible yet unmistakable—that drew me beyond casual interest and into the serious, prayerful discernment that Palmetto might be my next call.

As I began exploring Palmetto more deeply, I immersed myself in everything I could—an occupational hazard of my graduate training! I read your mission study, pored over your website, spoke with references, and listened closely to your PNC. What I discovered was a shared bedrock conviction: that the gospel of Jesus Christ is the center of our identity, both individually and as a church. And that Christ-centeredness isn't just a phrase—it shapes our priorities and decisions.

I was especially struck by the language on the church's homepage, which beautifully captures the theological heartbeat of this congregation:

"In the midst of asking tough questions, we pull good news from the gospel. Our worship service is a joyful and uplifting experience where the focus is not 'what must I do to be saved,' but what Christ has already done to save me. In true Presbyterian form, we start with God. Anything we do is a response to God's grace."

This is the gospel.

Christianity proclaims that our lives are sustained by God's love, and that our only hope in life and in death is found in the unmerited grace given to us in Jesus Christ. The church can do many things, but if it is not a place where the gospel is proclaimed, it has lost its mission. When I read those lines on your website, I felt an immediate sense of theological alignment and joy.

As I prayed about the possibility of coming to Palmetto with my family, I asked Jesus to help me see clearly: to see this church as it truly is, and to see myself as I truly am. I prayed for clarity about my strengths and weaknesses, my priorities, and my vision for ministry—and the courage to be honest about those things in my conversations with the PNC. (As anyone who's interviewed for a job knows, there's always the temptation to say what you think others want to hear.) But one of the greatest graces of this process is that I haven't felt the need to pretend. From the very beginning, there's been a sense of mutual honesty and trust between the PNC, the presbytery, and myself. That authenticity has been a gift—and a sign of the Spirit's work.

It is an honor to be considered by you today. If called, I look forward to beginning a long and fruitful season of ministry with you this summer—building on the rich, Christ-centered, gospel-shaped legacy of this congregation and stepping together into the future God is preparing for us.
