The Celebration of Palm Sunday, Sunday, April 10

10:00 a.m.

Liturgy of the Palms and Holy Eucharist
Music by the Trinity Choir
Reading of the Passion Gospel by members of
the congregation

This Sunday we observe the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem that was marked by the crowds, who were in Jerusalem for Passover, waving palm branches and proclaiming him as the messianic king. The Palm Sunday service also includes references to what is to come during the somber week to follow, when Jesus' crucifixion takes place. The celebration and loyalty of the entry into Jerusalem turns into the pain and betrayal of Good Friday.

Maundy Thursday, April 14

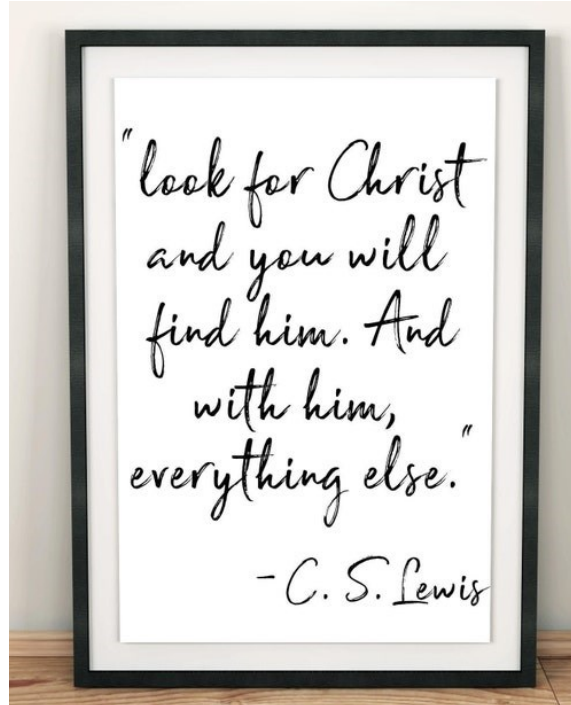
6:15 p.m. Simple Supper in the May Room

7:00 p.m. The Eucharist of the Last Supper
and the Washing of Feet

Music by the Trinity Choir
(Childcare for infants and toddlers will be offered)

On Maundy Thursday Christians remember the gathering of Jesus and his disciples for the Last Supper. Foot washing has also been a tradition of Maundy Thursday, following Jesus' command: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." We demonstrate this love by re-enacting the scene from the Gospel of John when Jesus washes the feet of his disciples.

At the end of the service, as the choir chants Psalm 22, the bread and wine that remain from Communion are moved to the Altar of Repose. Slowly and reverently the candles, other vessels, and books are removed. When the sanctuary is bare, all depart in silence.



Good Friday, April 14

12:00 Noon The Liturgy of Good Friday & Communion from the Reserved Sacrament
Music: Organ Prelude and Hymns

The veneration of the Cross on Good Friday is an expression of our faith and hope in Christ whose Paschal Mystery we celebrate and share in most fully in the Easter celebration of the Resurrection.

7:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross

We reenact Jesus' walk to the cross with brief prayers and readings.

Urban Stations of the Cross (any time)

A self-guided walk through Covington, pausing at various locations to reflect on how Jesus' trials and tastings are still faced by people today. This brochure is also available at trinitycovington.org.

Easter: The Day of Resurrection Sunday, April 17

10:00 a.m. Holy Eucharist (no incense)
Music by the Trinity Choir and the Brass Ensemble
Special Sermon for Children

11:30 a.m. Easter Egg Hunt for Children (outside, weather permitting) We encourage children to bring Easter baskets in which to collect eggs. The baskets will be blessed during the service.

11:30 a.m. Champagne Mini-Reception for Adults in the Courtyard (weather permitting), with punch for the children.
