What to expect in Eviction Court.

Canyon County currently offers in-court Mediation Services. These services involve a court appointed third party Mediator who will work with you and your Landlord to attempt to resolve your dispute with a formal agreement you may each contribute to with your own terms.

If you are able to reach an agreement this settlement, (once approved by the Judge) will be the outcome of your hearing rather than an eviction judgment. Note: If you do not adhere to your terms of the agreement you can default, and the result will be a judgment for eviction.

If you do not show up to eviction court, you will receive an automatic eviction judgment on your record. If an eviction gets on your record, it can ruin your credit score and stay on your public record for your entire life. It can make getting into a new rental much more difficult.
