

If you suspect that you have endometriosis and are seeking a diagnosis, or have a diagnosis and are seeking care, there are some important questions that you should review, and some that you should ask your primary care practitioner.

Questions to Ask Yourself

- What do I know about endometriosis? Have I done my research?
- What do I know about treatment options, and what sort of medical professionals or alternative practitioners provide them?
- Why do I believe I have endometriosis, and how best can I convey this to my doctor?
 - Charting pain over a few cycles, including bouts of fatigue, pain or discomfort with bowel movements, urination, and/or intercourse, as well as any changes in diet and sleep habits
 - Providing medical history, ultrasound & surgical reports, prescription history
 - Providing reports from your fertility clinic
- What do I want out of this meeting with my doctor?
 - A referral to gynecologist who specializes in endo?
 - To discuss fertility options?
 - To request another course of treatment, because the current one is not working?

Questions to Ask Your Medical or Naturopathic Doctor

- Do you have experience treating many patients with endometriosis?
- What are the short term and long term options available to me for pain management?
- I have heard about [treatment option here] what are your thoughts on whether it may be helpful, and what are the pros and cons of this treatment option?
- Do you have any information on helpful dietary changes that I could make?
- Do you have any information pertaining to endometriosis for me to take home?
- What would be the benefit of having a laparoscopy?

Questions for Surgeons only

- How much of your time in the operating room is spent on endometriosis?
- How many cases of endometriosis do you operate on every year? Approximately how many cases have you operated on in total?
- What are the risks of laparoscopic surgery for endometriosis?
- What surgical method of removal do you use for endometriosis? Will it harm my fertility?
- How long would recovery take?
- What are the outcomes in your patients who have had surgery? Was pain and/or other symptoms reduced or eliminated? If fertility was an issue, was fertility improved?
