42% of LGBTQ youth seriously considered attempting suicide in 2021, including more than half of transgender and nonbinary youth. Our LGBTQ+ youth need community.

As we envisioned expansion, we also knew we wanted Encircle to be a reliable home base for LGBTQ+ youth and their families—not just in the short term, but for years to come.

Together, there's no limit to what our love can do.





Proceeds from art sales both support the artists and provide for the life-saving services offered at Encircle.



Seeking A Safer Space

81% of our LGBTQ+ youth guests have been to Encircle 21+ times.

Authenticity - 99.7%

Humans thrive when they are able to be their true, genuine, self.

Social Connection - 98.4%

Healthy social connections are consistently and positively associated with all indicators of psychological well-being.

Positive Emotional Experiences - 99.0%

People who have positive emotions in their everyday lives tend to be happier, healthier, learn better, and get along well with others.

Psychological and Emotional Skills - 98.9%

Skills like sharing emotions, countering negative thought patterns, and mindful acceptance of emotion all contribute to greater mental health and increased well-being.
