Condition-Specific Referral Guide for Specialty Care



How This Guide Can Help You

Cincinnati Children's offers many specialty programs and clinics for children and adolescents. But it isn't always easy for referring providers to know where to send a referral.

This guide will help. We've organized it into two sections:

- Behavioral, Psychological and Developmental Conditions
- Other Conditions

Each section describes where to make a referral and which specialty program or clinic will provide care.

How to Make a Referral

Critical Information for Making Patient Referrals

Scheduling delays may occur if any of the following information is missing from the referral.

- Patient name, date of birth and gender
- Date of referral/order
- Reason for referral
- Name of parent/guardian
- Parent/guardian phone number
- PCP practice name, PCP name

 Name of provider responsible for results, if different than PCP

For diagnostic testing, speech-language pathology, OT/PT and audiology: all the above, plus diagnosis code and PCP signature.

Optional Information for Making Patient Referrals

The following information is helpful but not necessary.

- Notes on pre-authorization process
- Need for ancillary services, such as an interpreter, transportation assistance, etc.
- Parent/guardian email address

- Is referral a request for consult, transfer of care, or co-management of patient?
- Patient insurance information
- · Name of PCP office contact

If You Have Questions

Non-Urgent Clinical Questions: Use E-Consult

E-Consult is a free system designed for **local PCPs** who want to ask non-urgent clinical questions to Cincinnati Children's faculty. A faculty member will answer questions within three business days.

Behavioral, Psychological and Developmental Conditions

Behavioral Medicine and Clinical Psychology (BMCP), Division of Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics (DDBP) and Division of Child Psychiatry

Specialists from three divisions see patients with a wide variety of behavioral, psychological and developmental diagnoses at Cincinnati Children's.

These divisions include:

BEHAVIORAL MEDICINE AND CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY (BMCP)

Provides evidence-based treatment based on behavioral theory (e.g. CBT, DBT, parent-child interaction therapy) by doctoral level (PhD and PsyD) psychologists to children and adolescents under age 18 years.

DIVISION OF DEVELOPMENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL PEDIATRICS (DDBP)

For children up to 12 years, 11 months with suspected autism spectrum disorder (ASD) or intellectual disabilities (ID), the division provides diagnostic evaluations and ongoing care through early adulthood.

For children 13+ with a confirmed diagnosis of ASD or ID, the division provides ongoing care, community-based referrals and limited diagnostic services. We also offer limited treatment for children in this age group who have more severe behavioral problems or may need augmentative communication evaluations. Psychology and speech-language evaluations are not available for children 13+ with suspected ASD or ID.

DIVISION OF CHILD PSYCHIATRY

Services include diagnostic evaluation, medication management, psychotherapy, and care management services. Providers include child and adolescent psychiatrists, psychiatric nurse practitioners, licensed independent social workers and counselors.
