THE GALLERY @ Locksbrook

The Red Dress, conceived by British artist Kirstie Macleod, provides an artistic platform for individuals (majority women) around the world, many of whom are vulnerable and live in poverty, to tell their story through embroidery.

From 2009 to 2023, pieces of the Red Dress travelled the globe being continuously embroidered onto. Constructed out of 87 pieces of burgundy silk dupion, the garment has been worked on by 367 women/girls, 11 men/boys and 2 non-binary artists from 51 countries.



Bath Spa University, in partnership with the Fashion Museum and Fashion Roundtable, is proud to launch the new National Centre for Fashion and Sustainability (NCFS) at its Locksbrook campus later this year. NCFS is a space where leading thinkers, learners, businesses and communities will connect and drive the fashion and textile industry toward new, regenerative practices that will be healthy for people and the planet.

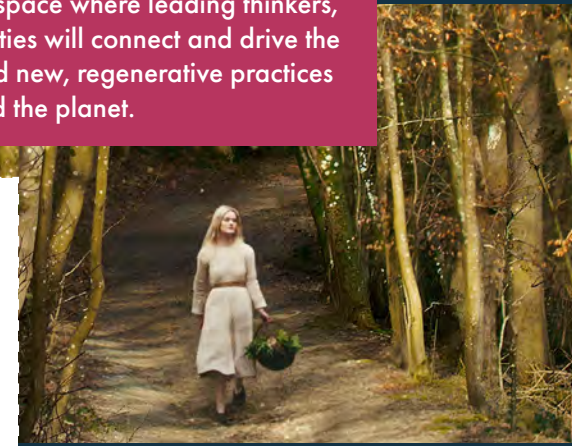

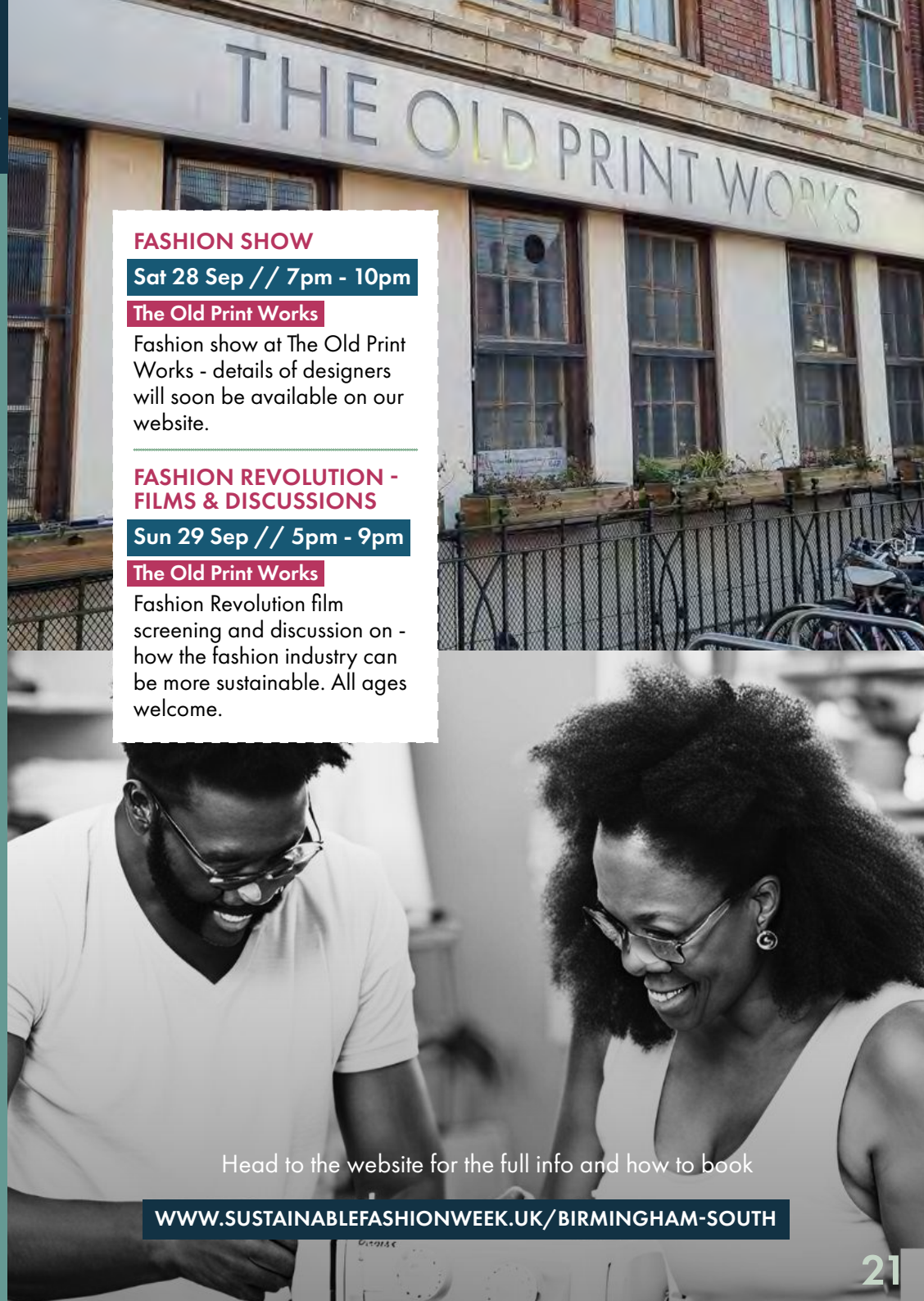

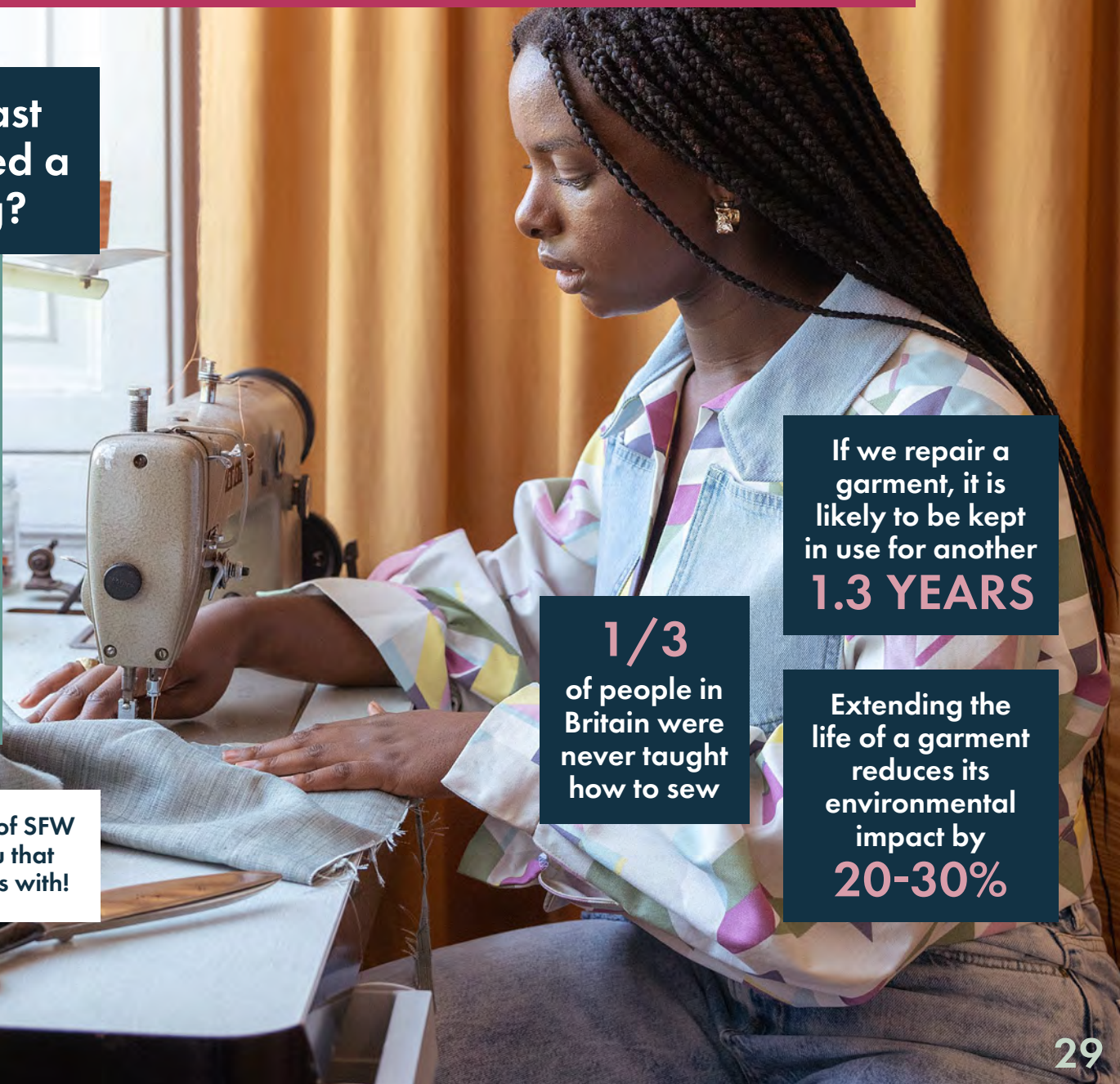
Fashion waste is littering our shared land, impacting the soil, air and water that we depend on.

We're so excited to be working with a fashion museum like no other. The team are busy creating a stunning new museum in the heart of the UNESCO World Heritage City of Bath dedicated to fashion heritage, with an anticipated reopening in 2030.

Located in the Grade II listed Old Post Office, the reimagined Museum will showcase more of the internationally renowned Fashion Museum Collection than ever before.

The designated Collection is one of the world's greatest museum collections of historical and contemporary adult and children's fashion containing 100,000 objects dating from the 1600s to the present day. It was gifted to the city by Doris Langley Moore in 1959 and has grown in scale and status ever since.

What would you like to do with the SFW Podcast, to have impact?

I am so keen to create a safe space for everyone no matter where they are on their sustainable fashion journey. Whether they are totally new to the subject or fully invested, I want it to be a place that is accessible, educational and fun. There are so many elements to 'sustainable' fashion, so to be able to break it down, explore different areas and to create a resource for anyone who wants to know more would be a dream. Essentially I would love for everyone who has an interest in sustainable fashion to feel welcome.
